Dear Mr. Jarvis,

In the absence of Mr. Fraser, we are writing to inform you that Mrs. Lichtmann and I have been called back to America and shall leave here probably the first of November. We will be in Calcutta probably on the second or third and would like to arrange there to have Powers of Attorney executed from us both as well as from our institutions to Professor Roerich to enable him to purchase land in our name in India as well as to execute any business for us here. We shall value knowing from you what we shall have to bring with us in order to do this and whether any special facts or material is needed. As we must probably leave Calcutta on the same evening, we should also like to know if these could be executed in one day.

We should also like to know what type of letter we must prepare in order that Professor Roerich and Mr. George Roerich may return on a visit to America at any time needed for our American institutions. I recall that such a visa was arranged for Professor Roerich by Mr. Jenkins and would appreciate your advice in this regard.

We are looking forward to see you again on our arrival in Calcutta.

Dear Mr. Frazer,
