My father, Professor Nicholas Roerich was born in 1874 in St. Pa-tersbourg and received his educa-tion in that city.

As a student he simultaneously attended the Academy of Art, the historical and philological courses of the University of St. Petersbourg, the Faculty of Law and the Institute of Archaeology. Later he went to study abroad. This training was the foundation which gave him a splendid breadth of vision and understanding to build his beautiful edifice of achievement.

He was an outstanding mural painter. Many of his paintings ad-orn the leading museums and pri-vate galleries of the world.

Popularly known as the "master of mountains", Roerich travelled in Russia and Europe, Central Asia, Mongolia, Tibet, China, Japan and India. He finally settled at Naggar, in the Kulu Valley, where he lived and worked until his death in 1947.

His heart and thoughts belonged to all humanity, to all peoples.

It will take some years to classify properly the enormous cultural treasures he left to posterity.

7,000 Paintings

He has to his credit over 7,000 paintings dealing with a wide range of subjects from historic compositions, painted in the academic and more realistic style influenced by the late 19th century, and including his later highly decorative and colourful canvases depicting Man's higher aspirations.


He took his themes from the Great Book of Life, the Quest of Man, philosophic doctrines and religions, and in the later years, along with his imaginative paintings, he also painted the sublime landscapes of the Himalayas which he loved so much and which made him known as "Master of the Mountains". His works are found in leading museums and galleries of the world; in India they formpart of many State collections and Travancore has a separate building dedicated to them, while separate halls have been set aside at Allahabad and Banares. He also designed many mosaics.

His belief that peace can come only through culture made him propose an international pact for the protection of cultural treasures, which became known as the "Roerich Pact and Banner of Peace". This pact was ratified by 21 countries and approved by 36 countries, including India.

He was honoured by many countries, their Governments, their learned bodies and organisations. He was Commander of the Russian Orders of St. Stanislaus, St. Anna and St. Vladimir. He was Commander I Cl. of the Yugoslavian Order of St. Savva and the Legion of Honour of France. He was Commander I Cl. of the Royal Swedish Order of the Polar Star. He was made a fellow and member of several Academies and many learned bodies throughout the world.

The Memorial Gallery at Naggar (Kulu) has been enriched by a number of new paintings of Prof. Reerich. The National Book Trust is planning to bring out a popular book on him with reproduction of his paintings.
