I learn with great pleasure, from Madame Devika Rani Roerich, that the Academy of Sciences of the USSR will celebrate the Sixtieth Birthday Anniversary of the late Dr. George Nicholas Roerich on the 15th October 1962. As an humble student of Central Asian History and Cultures I may be permitted to pay homage to the memory of this great man.

"George Nicholas Roerich as a scholar recalled the best encyclopaedists of the West and the East. Linguist, explorer, archaeologist, art-critic and historian of thought and culture he did not admit of frontiers in knowledge; frontiers between ancient and modern, frontiers between East and West or frontiers between different branches of learning did not exist for him. His subject of study was man. He was indeed a humanist.

"It was characteristic of George Nicholas Roerich's scholarship that no academic call on him was too small or too big. Thus while engaged in the execution of the translation projects (e.g. The Blue Annals or Biography of Chos-rje-dPal) he could not ignore the needs of language students and lent his collaboration to the preparation of Textbook of Colloquial Tibetan or could not cease from his selfappointed task of the monumental Tibetan dictionary which he completed single handed before his untimely death.

"These feats recalled his similar achievements nearly thirty years before. While engaged in geographical and archaeological explorations in the high-lands of Central Asia with his eminent father he had noted the need for a popular introduction into the subject. Trails to Inmost Asia was the result.

"The man George Nicholas Roerich was much greater than even the scholar George Nicholas Roerich. He formed the golden link not merely between India and Russia or between East and West but between all peoples in all climes and times.

"His death in May 1960 was a great blow to Russian and world scholarship. May we be inspired by his

I am grateful to the authorities of the Institute of Oriental Studies of the U.S.S.R. Academy of Sciences for the opportunity given to me of associating myself with the meeting held to honour the memory of my very dear friend and esteemed colleague the late Dr. Yuri Nikolai Roerich. I knew him personally only for a short period of about three years. But, during this time I never felt my day complete when I was in Moscow unless I had a chance of of exchanging at least a few words on the telephone, if I could not see him and talk with him face to face. So deep was my attachment to him and I am happy to say this great friendship was reciprocated by him and formed one of the most memorable experiences of my life.

I had, of course, known of him many years before through his published works. I met him briefly once in India and also had the great privilege of being introduced to his father when the latter visited my own country of Ceylon.

The family of Roerich's have been, for more than half a century, closely associated with the noble work of interpreting the culture of the East to the West and vice versa and thereby helping to foster a spirit of mutual understanding which more than any other way is the best means of creating a world of peace and harmony. This was done chiefly through the avenue of the Arts and, in particular, those of literature and painting.

Yuri Nikolai's labours in the field of Literature and Art are too well known for me to have to praise them. They are recognised as among the most authoritative publications in that field of study. He had a remarkable mind which enabled him not

only to master vast areas of knowledge but also to appraise them

critically and to interpret them with sympathy and understanding.

His human qualities were no less admirable than his qualities of scholarship. He was always humble and accessible to all who sought his advice and guidance. He radiated round him a glow of warm friendliness which is difficult to describe. I always felt a sense of peace when I was with him such as I have rarely felt with other people. When he agreed to collaborate with me in the publication of the Encyclopaedia of Buddhism of which I am the Editor-in-Chief, my joy was unbounded because I realised how valuable that co-operation would mean. But, alas, fate was against us and our plans could not be realised. However, the discussions I had with him regarding this work have been of the utmost use to me and I shall always be grateful to him for this.

I salute his memory. May his example be an inspiration for all of us.

I am aware that his brother Svetoslav has undertaken to continue the project which was originated by their father in establishing a centre of Eastern Studies in the foothills of the Himalayas. I would earnestly ask that all those in a position to do so should help in this venture in every possible way so that it may soon reach fruition because I feel that that would be the best way to perpetuate the memory of the man whom we are here gathered to honour.



With the death on 21st May, 1962 of Dr. George N. Roerich, M.A., Ph.D., of Moscow - a name to ammed conjure with - elosed the career of an acomplished scholar of exceptional distinction in the vast and varied fields of Scientific and Oriental learning. A worthy representation of a remarkable family of Rassian savants wwho enriched the fields of Science and culture, Dr. Roerich's own life was one of the intense scholarly activity in many domains of learing. A versatile scholar and a man of encyclopedic knowledge. Prof. Rosrich specialised studies ranged widely on the fields of Sanskrit literature, Philosophy, religion, History, Geography. Ethnography, Felk Art etc. He had deservly earned the reputation of being a great and practical linguist with perfect knowledge and conversed on many Western and Eastern languages. Beside the mix classical and modern European languagesthe is said to have been throughly conversent with Tibetah, Mangelian, Sanskrit, Pali and even Persian and Hindustant. He was a member of many learned Institutions both at home and abroad. He published many research works of abiding value and made many valuable contributions to standard Oriental Journals, the great Rassian savant and patrior had special attraction for, and spent a considerable part of gifted and dedicated life in our own Himalayan region and he did much to bring Russia and India closer to each other in intelectual sphere.

Fortunately for us the late lamented Dr. A. S. Altekar drew the attention of whe such an erudite scholar and Indologist to a unique manuscript of life story of CHAG-LO-TSA-BA-CHOS-RJEDPAL called also Dharmaswamin, Tibbtan Monk pilgrim art of the early 13th Century A.D. the photo negetives of which brought from Tibet arx by Rahula Sankrityana is still by preserved in the Bihar Research Society of Patna. He was kind to take up with his usual keen interest the task of making a careful and accurate translation of it in English. K. P. Jayaswal Research Institute of Patna has published the text of the Biography of Dharma Swamin so ably deciphered, edited and translated by Dr. G. N. Roerich with historical and critical Introduction by Dr. A. S. Altekar. Upasak Chosdar to whom Dharma-Swamin dictated the acount of his life and travel has given a very faithful and descriptive picture of the Political, Social, Religious

and cultural life of both North and South Bihar in the third decades of the 13th Century and there is much in it to supplement. The meagre and merely political mata narration found in Muslim Chronicles, Dr. G. N. Roerich has laid the Institute under deep debt of gratitude. May his soul rest in peace.
