PEN-FRIENDSHIP

The Pen-friend movement is an inspiring, interesting and instructive mission of intellectual, national and international Brotherhood. It is paramountly a unifying, knowledge-giving and nation-building movement. It is therefore becoming a most attractive hobby among students, women, men in business and profession and old men at their retirement. The one great good it obviously does is that it links us up in a common bond irrespective of caste, colour, sex, religion, or other political or national distinctions. It promotes hobbies, art and culture which are compliments to our work-a-day-worried life.

HISTORY

Shri R. Raman, now a member of Parliament is a pioneer in introducting the habit of Pen-friendship among young people of this country. He started young Folks' Brotherhood Organisation in the year 1926 and propagated it, through his popular Journal 'The Children's News'. This Organisation carried on its activities throughout the Country for nearly 10 years and had its branches in almost all big cities of India. It used to bring in close touch with one another thousands of young folks reading in schools through the common medium of correspondence. Very interesting and invigorating letters were received from boys and girls all over the world and they were passed on to willing correspondents in this country. Links of such correspondents were established not only in India but outside too in as many countries as possible. Columns of Children's News were opened for publication of such letters and for inserting names and addresses of young people who were desirous of establishing

such links and within hardly this period it was thought desirable that a senior section of this Organisation under the name of Nation's League of Pen-Friends should be established and in the year 1935 it actually took its birth. Since then this organisation had been carrying on its activities. During the world war II, however, its work was hampered and at one time it almost stopped. But after the war was over its activities were revived and it is now celebrating its Silver Jubilee. This organisation is admittedly the oldest of its kind in India and has remained true to its ideals all these years and has encouraged thousands of pen-friends, hobbyists and artists. It has cheered many homes and hearts and has supplied pen-friends for the mere asking. Again since the year 1936, the League had embarked upon a new programme of holding International Camps which offered a good meeting place and a common platform to hobbyists, artists and pen-friends of different parts of the World. In 1936 it organised its First Camp with late Hon Shri Divan Bhoisingh Pahalajani (the President of Bombay Legislative Council) as its president. The second camp was organised at Delhi in 1937 under the presidentship of Shri Asaf Ali, Ex-Governor of Assam. The third International camp was organised at Ahmedabad in 1938 of which Shri G. V. Mavalar kar (now speaker of the Indian Parliament, was the chairman of Reception Committee. Mr. H. V. Divetia, Retired Judge, Bombay High Court, was the president.

SCOPE & ACTIVITIES

The N.L.P. and Y.F.B. are a call to the spirit of brotherhood that is latent in every one. They seek to sow the seeds of fellowship in the minds of the people. They have

always advocated the necessity of the establishment of a Free World State based on the principles of Liberty, Equality and Justice. By a resolution passed by the International Head Quarters in Bombay in November 1942, the N.L.P. & Y.F.B once more affirmed their undying faith in the principle of equal justice believing that there could be no lasting worldpeace unless and until the canons that have always been at the root of all the tronbles the world has so far seen are destroyed root and branch and a "Free World State" is established on the broad principles of equality, fraternity and liberty. The N. L. P. and Y. F. B. believe that in such a world state, man should owe allegiance not only to a particular nation but to all Humanity, a duty not merely to a particular individual but to the whole of mankind, should salute not merely a national flag but a world flag and imbibe not only racial, provincial or national culture but the "New World Culture" which will be naturally evolved by the combination of the best and the most representative elements of such of the diffrent cultures as are already in existence and are beneficial to mankind and for that purpose the proposed world state should undertake and promote the cultivatin of a catholic and tolerant attitude towards the cultures of other nations and in order that this aim of higher world culture can be achieved each nation should put forth efforts at understanding and assimilating into its own culture the desirable features of the cultures of all other individual nations.

Activities of this League in addition to the spread of Pen-friendship and World Brotherhood include Arts and Hobbies Exhibitions, debates, lectures, excursions, musical evenings, concerts and other social, cultural and intellectual activities. The League has members in U.S. A., Canada England, Arabia, Australia, Belgium, Burma, Ceylon, Africa, West Indies, Fiji, Finland, Germany, Italy, Japan, Malaya, Newzealand, Poland, Russia, Spain, Sweden etc.

BINDING RULES

- 1. No member shall correspond unless he receives a certificate, or an identity card. On its receipt he shall quote his number in all correspondence.
- A member shall answer the letter received by him within 15 days of the receipt, if the pen-friend is in the same country or within three months if the pen-friend is in a foreign country.

- The first letter to an Indian Lady Member shall be forwarded through the League Office.
- 4. A complaint of non-reply shall be made to the general secretary. The complainer shall send necessary stamp for inquiry etc. with his letter of complaint.
- Any letter or inquiry addressed to the H. O. shall be accompanied by sufficient Postage Stamps.
- A member who commits any breach shall be asked to offer a satisfactory explanation failing which he must resign.
- A member is expected to do his utmost for the success of the organisation & its activities.
- The H. O. reserves the rights to remove from its list, any member who goes against the ideals or rules of the institution.

PRIVILEGES

- Each Member shall be provided with a list of members with their years of birth, hobbies and likings. The book shall also contain a list of code signs.
- Membership will entitle to a free supply of the Journal 'PENFRIEND' (when published) which will contain good articles, letters and news from branches.
- Ten members residing in the same City may organise a branch and apply to the H.O. for affiliation, instruc-

tion and help. They will be given a certain part of their membership charges for the working of the Branch. Branch activities include debates, lectures, excursions, musical evenings, entertainments, arts and hobbies exhibitions and other social, cultural and international activities.

WARNING

We have had several complaints and on investigation, we found that in most of the cases they were due to misunderstanding on the part of new members. It it made clear to every one that letters must be replied within a fortnight. If no exchange correspondence is desired, members should simply decline the offer by a letter. Remember to put the Correct N. L. P. number on every letter you write.

There is for misbehavior a "Black Sheep Register" in which Complaints of non-reply and misbehavious are entered. On receipt of complaint the matter is investigated and complaint is registered. One having 3 complaints to his or her credit, is liable to be dismissed from the club and informed of it to our Sister clubs.


SERVICE A HUMANITARIAN APPROACH

The Hospital, the dream of the service minded Rotarians of Bangalore North, started promisingly when the foundation stone was laid on 16-11-1975 by H. E. Shri Mohanlal Sukhadia, the then Governor of Karnataka. This beginning to transform a dream into reality was made possible by the contributions of the Rotarians, and by the K & L Chande Charity Trust. Thus the Hospital has been christened "The Rotary Club of Bangalore North and K & L Chande Charity Trust Hospital".


THE DREAM

The Project envisaged is a 100-bed Hospital with all modern medical facilities such as X-ray, Pathological, Dental, ENT, Operation Theatre, Sterilization Rooms etc. The total cost of the project is estimated at Rs. 2,500,000 and it will be completed in two phases



THE REALITY

Thanks to the munificence of some of the Rotarians, K & L Chande Charity Trust and by organising the Annual Ladies Nite progammes, the club could raise sufficient funds for completing the consruction of the first phase comprising the basement, ground floor and the first floor of the hospital building at a cost of Rs. 400,000. The club has been promised another Rs. 150,000 in cash and kind. But the completion of the first phase alone requires another Rs. 650,000/-
