#### The National Festival


October 6 to 15 was celebrated as what is regionally known as "Naada-habba," that is, festival of the Nation—nation in this instance meaning the Kannada-speaking land. Centuries ago, the Vijayanagar kings turned this traditional festival of 'das'aa-ha'

(ten days) or 'Vijayadashami'—10th day of victory (of Good over Evil) into a celebration where courts were held on all the ten days, pundits from all over India participating in discussions, artists exhibiting their

art etc., and finally the king honouring them in the traditional way. In a small way, the erstwhile Mysore Palace continued the tradition and people from all over India came to enjoy their visit to this land of lights and beauty-spots. Even outside the old princely Mysore State, the Kannada people celebrated Naadahabba with cultural programmes lasting three to ten days. There was a time when these ten days meant to many towns and big villages a veritable feast of scholarly talks and music and drama performances.

This year the State Government has taken over the arrangements. In addition to an All-India Exhibition of industrial and other progress through the five-year plans, there are music and dance and drama performances by younger artists. In the fields of acting, literature, music, dance and painting the State Government is honouring artists, actors and writers (one for each field). The recipients of this year's honours are: Pandharibai (Acting), D. R. Bendre (Literature), Suetoslav Roerich (Art),

B. Devendrappa (Music), S. Krishna Rao and his wife, Chandrabhaga Devi (both Dance) and N. S. Subbukrishna (Painting). Locally, the residents of Rajajinagar organised the celebration for ten days. It was inaugurated by the Governor, General Srinagesh, who emphasised the usefulness of such celebrations. The veteran writer Masti Venkatesh Iyengar, who gave his "blessing", told his audience that to love one's own language should never mean aversion to another language. As part of the celebrations, symposiums were arranged on the eradication of corruption, women's progress, students' problems and the genius and influence of Shakespeare.

How close do conferences and seminars bring us to understanding? How many achieve that delicate balance between giving and receiving, listening and speaking, learning and imparting, which is the foundation, surely, on which any meeting of minds must rest. Terminological inexactitude is a poor plea; words are often more sinned against than sinning. Language changes continually in the crucible of usage; and for our immediate purposes we may put our foot down, like Alice when she said: A word means only what I choose it to mean, neither more nor less. But this is half the story. The other half appears to be in the divinity that doth hedge a scholar; he is to be forgiven the sins which ordinary mortals hang for. What else can account for the series of monologues, one taking off from a point in the other and shaking free from it as it soars forth? Ivory towers possibly? Sooner or later they become claustrophobic and the occupants who escape briefly into conferences and seminars may be tempted to allow faculties which have pined in disuse to run away with them! The answer is probably seminars and more seminars until friends and countrymen fall into the habit of lending each other their ears.
