His mother was a singularly gifted lady. His brother is a distinguished Orientalist, and he is married to the Indian actress, Devika Rani.

Svetoslav Roerich is an artist to his fingertips. He has a patriarchal appearance—artistocratic features and a flowing beard. He is soft-spoken and gentle in his manner, but he has an inflexible will.

His paintings delight every-body. Indeed, their brilliance in execution and colour over-whelm the viewer. Their com-position is unique, the depth of imagination superb.

Having spent over a querter of a century in India, his canvases naturally depict many Indian scenes and figures.

#### TRENDS

His style does not belong to a particular school of art. Hav-ing travelled very extensively he has imbibed the latest trends in European and Asiatic art, and suffused it with his own talent.

He is well-versed in the religious scriptures from which he derives the inspiration for some of his magnificent canvases. He is also influenced by the spirit and workmanship of his father's paintings and sculpture. Even so, the original note is evident in all his work.

He is, in the words of G. Venkatachalam, a prominent Indian art-critic, "not a chip of the old bloc, but a substantial part of the bloc, itself."

It is fundamentally religi-ous and mystical. It ranges from devoted absorption and harmonious response to the good to a passionate outery against evil.

Materialism is not necessarily identified with naturalism in Svetoslav's art. It follows an individual bent.

Svetoslav Roerich's group of paintings in the 'Humanity Series' deserve a special ment'on. They convey a meaning which has implications beyond the scope of today.

#### **EXAMPLES**

Of all the many interpretations of these paintings, aptly called "Humanity Released," "Humanity Crucified" and "Whither Humanity?" that of Dr. Herman Goetz deserves special mention.

'The suffering Christ and the Mother of Sorrows occupy a central place in his art. But Christ is dying even today. Christ is born and sacrificed in every one of us in successive wars and strife.

Thus, "Mankind Crucified" is the central figure of Svetoslav Roerich's grand triptych.

"Whither Humanity?," is mankind helplessly amidst the threatening rocks and sultry clouds of inescapable disasters.

"Humanity Crucified' is man groaning under the flames of war and destruction poured by God's angels from the phials of wrath.

"Humanity Released," is the resurrection of man from the inferno of hatred by love or Christ.

A grand triptych, like the visions of William Blake, accepting tradition only in order to say what it must.

#### MEANING

The art of Svetoslav Roerich is vital art, rooted in the past, living in the present, believing in the future. It embraces all, as so many revelations of the One Eternal, a vehicle of mysticism freed from the trappings of tradition.

There is an exceedingly mystic quality in Roerich's brilliant paintings. They have a very deep spiritual significance and they thrill the spectator with their eye-filling colours and their transcendent quality.

They give us glimpses of the Real amidst the Unreal, the Light amidst the Darkness, the Truth amidst the Falsehood.

It is this which characterises Svetoslav Roerich's art.


