My brother, Mr.S.Roerich, is now in Bombay.

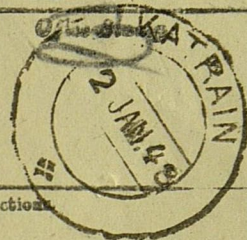

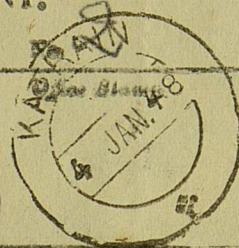

I am paying to Messrs Mandi Goods Motor Union the sum of Rs 161/14/- as per their Bills of the 6th inst. As regards the Mandi Transport Bill, I am not paying it at present, for the Mandi Transport Co have Rs 432/- deposited by my brother, Mr. S. N. Roerich.

We are planning to leave Naggar on the 17th inst. Please instruct the Mandi Co to supply us with one truck on the 16th at Katrain, and one lorry or bus to reach Katrain on the 16th inst in the evening, to come with us on the 17th. We shall require at the Mandi end of the breach on the 17th one motor car (sitting capacity four), one super-bus and one truck. Kindly also arrange for four bedrooms in the Guest House at Mandi, where we hope to spend two or three days arranging our transport to Delhi.

We would be grateful, if you would kindly provide
an escort on the 17th to meet the cars at the breach
on the Mandi-Kulu road.

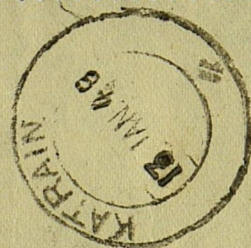

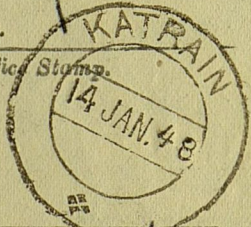

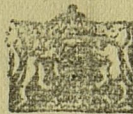
