Successive changes in the National Council of Fine Arts have interrupted the acknowledgment of the gracious offer of your important cultural and artistic Institute. The National Council has communicated to us that in accordance with numerous pedents and with the practice already established, this Museum will not be able to accept conditional gifts since this practice might prejudice the freedom of action of its authorities.

In view of this Resolution, it gives me great pleasure to transmit to you the suggestion that the donation of the seven works of the Artist - Nicholas Roerich, now desposited in this Museum could be effective and unconditional, thus augmenting nobly the already large artistic bounty that constitutes our collections.

As to the question of establishing a Branch of the Roerich Museum in Buenos Aires, we regret that in view of its primary aim - that of stimulating International peace through culture, this is not comprized within the functions of this Institute.

Anticipating your gracious reply, I beg you to salute in my name, Professor Roerich and his Colleagues in the Board of Directors and accept for yourself the expressions of my distinguished consideration.
