During Summer we have dust storms almost every day and inspite of all precautions a film of dust spreads over the show cases which have has to be wiped of every now and then. It will be difficult to do so in the case of these paintings. I don't know if the glass will take away some of the charm of the paintings, but I am afraid, under the conditions it may be necessary. But I shall act strictly according to your advice.

I have just now received your kind letter of August 21, and a packet containing Vol I, part 1 and Volume II of Urusvati Journal and a number of other most interesting pamphlets and thank you mast heartily for them. Is there any other part of Vol 1.?


My dear Dr. Roerich,
