Roerich Donates Painting

The Sri Chitralayam State Gallery of His Highness the Maharaja of Travancore has received a gift of one of Professor de Roerich's recent paintings, called 'Fiery Thoughts.'

The painting represents a Rishi on the heights of the Himalayas praying for the salvation of humanity in the face of the approaching clouds. The painting is imbued with magnificent purple and violet colours which are so characteristic of the great artist. Fiery thoughts fly off into space in form of gold-winged birds. The depths of the valleys are covered with heavy clouds but in the distance stand majestically the snow clad peaks of the Himalayas, which Roerich loves and admires so much.

The inexhaustible H i m a l a y a n aspects are depicted in many paintings of the Master. The press recently announced the tribute of the President of the Academia Sinica in Nanking to Professor de Roerich for his painting 'Himalayas,' which now adorns the walls of the Chinese Academy of Science. Indeed, the concept of the Himalayas is forever linked with the resplendent art of Roerich and Dr. James H. Cousins rightly acclaim Roerich as "Himalayan in Soul."
