Plain language is that which offers an intelligible sense in one or more of the languages authorised for International telegraphic correspondence, but the presence of commercial marks, code addresses, Exchange quotations, letters representing the signals of the International Code of Signals employed in maritime telegrams, of abbreviated expressions currently used in ordinary or Commercial correspondence, such as *rsvp*, *job*, *cf*, *cf*, *caf*, *svp*, *c/o*, *b/l*, or any other analogous expression, the meaning of which is understood in the country of origin, does not alter the character of a telegram in plain language. Combinations or alterations of words contrary to the usage of the language employed are not admitted. The following are the languages authorised for Foreign telegrams in plain language:—Annamite, Arabic, Armenian, Bohemian, Bulgarian, Croatian, Danish, Dutch, English, Finnish, Flemish, French, German, Greek, Hebrew, Hungarian, Illyrian, Italian, Japanese, Latin, Malay, Norwegian, Persian, Polish, Portuguese, Roumanian, Russian, Ruthenian, Servian, Siamese, Slavonic, Spanish, Swedish, and Turkish. Cipher language is that which is composed either of letters or Arabic figures having a secret meaning, but the employment in one group of figures and of letters having a secret meaning is not admitted. It is desirable to avoid the use of Letter cipher, as far as possible, as it is less easy to transmit than pronounceable groups of letters, and is, therefore, more liable to error. In cases where it is necessary to employ Letter cipher it should be arranged in groups of five letters in order to facilitate transmission.
