Last year, as Your Excellency might have heard, an exhibition of our paintings in aid of the Russian Red Cross had been planned at New Delhi, and Lady Linlithgow very kindly had given it her Patronage. Unfortunately no adequate accommodations could be secured at the time, and with regret we had to postpone this project. It was then felt that Bombay may be an easier place, and through the kind mediation of Lady Linlithgow, the Prince of Wales Museum at Bombay offered the necessary space. However as it was getting late in the season the exhibition could not be held at Bombay last year.

The plans for this exhibition having been only postponed it is our hope that Your Excellency will also be interested in this project.

My son Svetoslav, the Artist, is planning to visit Delhi, and could acquaint Your Excellency with these plans.

We always remember Lord Wavell's friendliness and connections with Russia since the War of 1914-18, and I avail myself of this occasion to express to Your Excellency and to His Excellency, my very cordial greetings,
