

TURNED DOWN REQUEST BY DALAI LAMA

The eldest brother of the Dalai Lama, Thubten Norbu, who arrived from Darjeeling on Thursday, will leave for the U.S.A. on Sept 24 to take up the appointment of professor in the Tibetan Language and Religion at Harvard University. Mr Norbu, who went to the U.S.A. in 1950 after leaving Tibet, returned to India recently to meet his second brother who lives in Darjeeling.

Mr Norbu, who is a priest and scholar in the Tibetan language, said that he had received requests through Chinese diplomatic channels in India to go back to Tibet. He refused as Tibet was completely under Communist rule. He also said that his brother, the Dalai Lama, had also made a similar request to him but he had had to reject it.
