"LAWRENCE OF ARABIA" GOES HOME.

CONFOUNDING MYSTERY MONGERS.

Strange Chapter in a Remarkable Career.

ORDERED WEST AT 48 HOURS' NOTICE.

A PERSECUTED "PIMPERNEL."

Legendary figure in the modern history of the Near and Middle East, author of the famous "Seven Pillars of Wisdom," Oxford archaeologist, soldier, diplomatist, scholar, and finally a clerk in the Royal Air Force in India, Aircraftsman Shaw, alias Colonel Lawrence, "Uncrowned King of Arabia," left Bombay on Saturday in a homeward-bound steamer for England on transfer to the Home establishment, not of his own free will but of diplomatic necessity.

A Man of Mystery.

In the ranks of the R.A.F. he sought peace and oblivion, but his reputation as a man of mystery brought him only further trouble. In Afghanistan there spread a general belief that he was not only connected with the unrest but was actually leading the Shinwaris, and on the outbreak of trouble, his supposed photographs were rushed from India to Kabul and thence to Jalalabad by air, in order to help officials to effect his capture.

"Secret Service Agent."

Rumours were also current in the Indian press and among the population that he had appeared at several places in Northern India in disguise, that he was a Government secret service agent and that he had a double who did his humble accounts while his whereabouts as India's "Scarlet Pimpernel" was known only to high officials.

Pir Karam Shah.

All this time a quiet self-effacing personality was performing an ordinary clerk's duties either in Karachi or Miran Shah. Yet despite his dramatic transfer to the Home establishment (announced exclusively in the *Civil and Military Gazette*) there have been further rumours among the Press and public,

again connecting him with Pir Karam Shah of Amritsar now, who was hounded roughly by the crowd during a recent demonstration in Lahore.

The fact that Shaw is about 12 inches shorter than the Pir, has not deterred the mystery mongers.

"Aircraftsman Shaw."

Other rumours suggest that it is his double who has been sent to England while Colonel Lawrence remains in India and the suggestion is made in one section of the press that he should not have been rushed out of the country but have been stationed for some days in some central place in order to satisfy press and public.

MANCHURIAN COUP D'ETAT.

Arsenal Seized and Plotters Shot.

MAH JONGG AS BAIT TO VICTIMS.

Shanghai, Jan. 11.

CHANG Sue-Hiang, the son of Chang Tso-Lin and head of the Manchurian leaders, who recently agreed to submit to the authority of the Nanking Government and to hoist the Nationalist flag, has brought off a coup d'etat.

He has seized Mukden arsenal, shot Yang Yu-Ting, an ex-Chief of Staff to Chang Tso-Lin and Chang Yin-Huai and taken others prisoner. The action is attributed to the hostility of the two dead Generals to the hoisting of the Nationalist flag. It occurred in dramatic circumstances.

RIDDED WITH BULLETS.

Chang Yin-Huai was conferring with Yang Yu-Ting at the former's headquarters, when Chang Sue-Hiang arrived outside and ordered soldiers to surround the room.

He then entered and, after pointing out their crimes to the two, ordered them to be shot.

A message from Mukden says that Yang Yu-Ting and Chang Yin-Huai had accepted an invitation by telephone from Chang Sue-Hiang to play Mah Jongg at his house.

On their arrival, Chang Sue-Hiang excused himself on the ground of having to receive medical treatment, and retired from the room. Thereupon soldiers entered the room and riddled the unfortunate men with bullets.

Many of Yang Yu-Ting's leading associates, learning of the coup, took refuge in the south Manchurian railway zone, which is Japanese, and afterwards entrained for Dairen.

GUILT ACKNOWLEDGED.

Chang Sue-Hiang has telegraphed to the Nationalist government declaring that Yang Yu-Ting and Chang Yin-Huai had carried on continuous intrigue and had attempted to impede peace and unity between north and south China. He has acknowledged the guilt of having executed them.—Reuter.

SIR BASIL BLACKETT:
A NEW POST.

To Serve on Reparations
Committee.

London, Jan. 13.

It is officially announced that Sir Charles Addis and Sir Basil Blackett have agreed to act as British Deputy Members of the Committee of Experts to frame proposals for the final settlement of the reparations question.

M.L.A. ON GRAVE CHARGES.

Abetment of Murder Alleged.

DEAD WIFE OF SIND ZAMINDAR.

Karachi, Jan. 11.

A sensation has been caused in Karachi and, in fact, throughout Sind, by the arrest of Wahid Bakhs Bhattu, a Member of the Legislative Assembly from Sind. He was apprehended at his bungalow at Larkana. Bhattu is accused of abetment in kidnapping, concealing and murdering Mussamat Khanzadi, the handsome wife of a petty zamindar named Chato Burir. He was challenged by the police before the City Magistrate of Larkana.

DETAILED INVESTIGATION.

The Assistant Superintendent of Police, in his deposition, said that the prosecution had secured oral and written evidence from Mr. Gorwala, I.C.S., Collector of Larkana, connecting the accused with the crime. Mr. Gorwala made a detailed investigation on receipt of a petition from Chato Burir regarding the alleged murder of his wife.

The court refused to release Bhattu on bail, but subsequently an application for bail was made to the Sessions Judge, who released Bhattu on bail till Saturday evening.

Eighteen persons have been challenged in the court of the Sub-Divisional Magistrate of Sehwan and committed to the Larkana Sessions in the same case. One is a servant of Wahid Bakhs Bhattu and another is his chauffeur.

£75,000 ORDER FOR
BRITISH PLANES.

100 "Moth" Machines For
Canada.

London, Jan. 12.

An order for 100 "moth" light aeroplanes and seaplanes, the largest individual order for British aircraft ever obtained from overseas, has been received by the De Havilland Aircraft Company from Canada in the face of severe competition from other countries.

The purchasers include the Ontario Provincial Government, the Canadian Royal Air Force, the Canadian Flying Clubs and private persons.

The value of the contract is estimated at about £75,000.—Reuter.

£6,800 FOR A HARDY
MANUSCRIPT.

"Crass Philistinism of England
and America."

New York, Jan. 11.

At a sale to-day at the Kern Library an incomplete manuscript of Thomas Hardy's "Fair Blue Eyes" fetched £6,800.

A copy of which bears a note from Hardy referring to the "crass Philistinism of England and America," fetched £820, compared with £9-10s. in 1914.—Reuter.

AFGHAN REFORMS CONCESSIONS.

Not Followed by
Peace.

THE KING'S FORCES
HARASSED.

RUSSIAN WOMEN
EVACUATED.

Peshawar, Jan. 12.

It appears that the followers of Bachai-Saqo, the famous Afghan raider, have again been engaged in skirmishes with King Amanullah's troops near Kabul and as far as can be ascertained are getting the best of the fight.

Some reports state that a number of the King's troops have deserted to the rebels but these lack confirmation as it is still difficult to differentiate between rumours and facts.

The situation is by no means clear in spite of the King's concessions regarding the reforms already instituted, and the statements that all is now quiet in Afghanistan are far from true.

SHINWARIS NOT DEFEATED.

It is also pointed out that the Shinwaris and Khugianis have by no means surrendered but have only come to a settlement with Ali Ahmed Khan, the King's representative at

Mir Zaman Khan, the chief of the Mohmands in the Kunar valley, who has supported the King in the negotiations at Jalalabad has been murdered. It appears that after returning to his home with a small number of his followers he was called to a *firgah* by the Sufis and was done to death in pursuit of an outstanding feud. His death at this moment is considered most unfortunate.

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TO-DAY'S NEWS.

Foreign.

The Afghan King's troops are stated to have been harassed by the rebels during further fighting.

Chang Sue-Hiang, the Manchurian leader, has seized an arsenal, and shot two of his enemies who were plotting to overthrow the recent agreement with the Nationalist Government.

General Booth's meeting with the deputation which informed him of the desire of the High Council of the Salvation Army that he should resign, is described in London telegrams.

Indian.

Boycott demonstrations in Calcutta on the arrival of the Simon Commission did not lead to disturbances.

Wahid Bakish Bhutto, a member of the Legislative Assembly, has been arrested on a charge of abetting the murder of a Sind zamindar's wife.

The ex-service jatha encamped in Lahore are still obstinate in their passive resistance to police orders, and have now been for five nights in the same position.

Colonel Lawrence, of Arabian fame, sailed from Bombay in a homeward-bound steamer on Saturday, following the rumours that have been circulated about his activities.

Sport.

An outsider from Ceylon won the Governor's Cup in Calcutta on Saturday. The books fared well in Bombay and in Rawalpindi.

Saturday's League football results are published.

There were several well-fought matches in the men's and mixed doubles in the Bengal Lawn Tennis Championships in Calcutta on Saturday.

Baria beat Kashmir "A" after a fast galloping game in the Radha Mohan Polo Tournament in Delhi on Saturday. Two games in this

Tournament were played in Meerut. Tasmania scored steadily in their match against the M.C.C. tourists at Launceston and at the close of play on the first day had scored 198 for five wickets.

A combined Calcutta Indian side beat His Excellency the Governor's XI by seven wickets.

A VICTORY FOR REACTIONARIES.

Lessons of Abolished Afghan Reforms.

The Aman-i-Afghan of Kabul may be regarded as the mouthpiece of the Afghan Government, and the publication of the proclamation by King Amanullah withdrawing practically the whole of his programme of reforms may safely be taken as formally and officially authorised, more particularly since our special correspondent understands that there was simultaneous publication in Kandahar, a province in which the King's influence is still regarded as being paramount.

The withdrawal is very sweeping for the Afghan girls sent abroad for education have been recalled, orders regarding adoption of European dress and abolition of purdah have been cancelled, girls' schools and women's associations closed down, identity certificates and conscription abolished and Friday restored as a weekly holiday. A Council of notables has been formed to amend the laws according to the Shariat and to review the decisions of the newly-constituted council of provincial representatives.

Altogether it can be seen that very little of King Amanullah's reform scheme is left and he is clearly shorn of a great deal of his personal power and influence not only by consenting to such sweeping retrograde steps and by the power vested in the new council of notables, but by the fact that the proclamation is signed by prominent religious leaders, who have been the main opponents of the reforms since their own powers and privileges were curtailed thereby.

Compared with the situation a fortnight and more ago, Afghanistan must be considered comparatively peaceful, but there has been a recrudescence of fighting in the vicinity of Kabul. It may or may not be of significance that the proclamation is issued after fighting re-commenced but it is true that there were suggestions last week that the King would consent to a considerable modification of his reforms.

And the modification goes to the extent of abolishing practically everything to which the mullahs and tribesmen took objection, which brought them into revolt and kept them in an obstinate restless mood until liberal largesse and severe wintry conditions brought temporary respite for the King and his supporters.

The new development is much to be deplored for we are afraid that it is a definite setback to the hope of a strong and independent Afghanistan. It bears out one of our earlier contentions that there was a distinct possibility that King Amanullah was making his changes too rapidly and that he would have been better advised to introduce them cautiously in the area around Kabul in which they have been accepted quietly hitherto, and then in ever increasing circles gradually extend them among the suspicious tribes who own only nominal allegiance to the King.

The most optimistic view that can possibly be taken is that the King's

policy is one of *reculer pour mieux sauter*, to give way temporarily to the opposition in order to strengthen himself for a fresh venture. But we fear that such is not the case. Money and weather gave him the respite and not force of arms or acceptance of his reforms. King Amanullah was in advance of his time, and so far from succeeding, he is now probably in a much weaker position than when he returned from his European tour.

There may be further developments of a more hopeful nature before the end of the severe winter, but they cannot be relied upon and if the Kandahar area, which appears not to know at the moment what to make of the violent reversal of policy decides upon hostility, there will be still another cause for internal trouble and further postponement of the hope of a strong and independent Afghanistan. In a short time the bearing of the new development upon the international situation, may be a little clearer, but it is easy to see that the curtailment of the King's power and influence may precipitate the strained and pregnant relations to which direct reference was made yesterday.

EX-SOLDIERS AND LAND GRANTS.

In one way or another, more than 250,000 acres of land have been made available in the Punjab for ex-soldiers and their dependents, and it has been calculated that to make grants of land to all Indian ex-soldiers who served in the Great War some 10 million acres would be necessary. In the first place, that is impossible and even if it were possible, it would not be within the constitutional power of His Excellency the Governor to make any grants after seeing the gathering of ex-soldiers in Lahore and sympathising with them. He is bound by rules and regulations, law and procedure, and the members of the *jatha* who have been gulled by specious promises into marching to Lahore, have gone the wrong way to redress any legitimate grievances they may have.

The situation was very clearly summarised in our correspondence columns yesterday in the letter signed "Indian," wherein the proper channel was explained. In addition the ex-soldiers have been told that if they will supply their names and grievances, their Deputy Commissioners will give immediate consideration to each case. As only about five per cent have genuine grievances little delay should be entailed, and as the *jatha* as a whole have also been asked to elect a deputation to meet His Excellency, they cannot complain of harsh reception or unsympathetic treatment, and they would be well advised to accept such offers and return to their homes.

The main difficulty with most of them appears to be that they are afraid to go to their homes. Let those who stay behind should reach some advantage and it is for such the same reason that they are afraid to elect a deputation to meet His Excellency the Governor for fear that their spokesmen should benefit more than themselves. These misguided men have certainly been misled by their so-called leaders and the outstanding difficulty now appears to be to make them understand that genuine grievances will have sympathetic and immediate consideration if they return to their homes.

THE TRUTH NOT IN THEM.

Provincial Governments have already realised by bitter experience and some day the Central Government will also realise, if they have not already done so and are afraid to take action for fear of facing a Nationalist tornado of abuse, that the repeal of very necessary clauses in the Press Act, has hampered their labours to a deplorable degree, made the preservation of law and order more difficult, inflamed and inflamed communalism and helped general unrest.

We are staunch upholders of the freedom of the press but Indian newspapers of the gutter press type, with unsubstantial editors and no finances, are not staffed by journalists and are unworthy of that freedom. The most outrageous statements are made with comparative impunity for Government's hands are almost tied in law, and even the various official information bureaux are used inefficiently. The truth is foreign to papers of such type and we have little doubt that many Provincial Governments would attempt to introduce safe guards if there was the slightest possibility of support from our temporising Central Government.

BY THE WAY.

His Majesty's Progress—The Supreme Effort—More Kindly Climates—British Cars Overseas—Mouse and His Dentist—General Knowledge—Only the Inventor.

IS the King almost out of danger? The latest news definitely indicates that Palace and the best medical opinion is that His Majesty is on the up-grade, and experts have allowed themselves to hope once more after being for many days completely devoid of the expectation that a recovery was possible.

As our London correspondent pointed out recently, the slow progress of His Majesty must be put down to the unkindness of the London climate, and the fogs which play such a detestable part in the progress of many an invalid.

A REMARKABLE CHANGE.

FOR several days, it must be admitted, there was small hope of recovery, and when the nation was preparing for the worst of news, there came this truly remarkable change for the better.

Even the doctors made no secret of their fears for the future. The crowds in daily and nightly attendance outside the Palace Gates could not but have been waiting for the posting of that notice which all feared.

Now, however, the most significant fact is that the issue of bulletins has been restricted, and there is a general feeling that His Majesty has made the supreme effort which will carry him through to a slow and tedious recovery.

ONE VISIT.

ONLY one other piece of news is necessary to complete the feeling of optimism. That is in regard to his sons, two of whom he has not seen since their arrival in England, and the other, the Prince of Wales, whom he has been allowed to see once.

It is stated to be doubtful whether the King will ever be allowed to raise up his full duties even after his recovery, and it is probable that in the future medical opinion will regulate his days and his programme.

It is admitted that His Majesty in the past has taken far too much out of himself by his strict attention to duty, and the possibility is mentioned, even, of his avoiding London Winters in the future as much as possible.

A SAD BLOW.

IT will be a sad blow to that best of all sportsmen if he is denied the pleasure of his annual visits to Scotland for the shooting, but it is probable that although he benefited considerably from these trips, they will be conducted with as little strain as possible on the patient's stamina.

The King of England, will not be regarded as an invalid King, but it is likely that his medical advisers will be brought into more close co-operation in deciding just what engagements the King will follow in the future.

THE EMPIRE MAIL.

AN excellent point is made in the latest number of the *Empire Mail*. The issue makes a point of the suitability of British cars for overseas work, and this corrects the false and insidious propaganda which is circulated, and unfortunately takes root in many places, to the effect that British-made cars are unsuitable for rough going.

We have often made the point in these columns that British manufacturers would gain a lot of useful experience if they would study more closely the needs of the overseas owner who does not always have the chance to use the fair metalled roads of his own country, and who also believes in getting the most, and often rather more than that, out of his car.

A BIG POINT.

SUCH small points as clearance may be insignificant at Home, where there is little danger of any obstruction high enough to touch the tray of a moving car, but we in India know how important this is when on *katcha* roads.

The *Empire Mail*, however, makes a strong plea for the British car, and proves through pictures and descriptions how many makes are eminently suitable for overseas work in the hardest going, and points out

SIMON COMMISSION IN CALCUTTA. Demonstrators' Futile Efforts.

ELABORATE POLICE PRECAUTIONS.

DISTRICT BOARDS' WELCOME.

Calcutta, Jan. 12.
The Simon Commission and the Central Committee arrived at Howrah early this morning. They were due to arrive before six o'clock and demonstrators were active as early as three o'clock.

The first special train conveying Sir Sankaran Nair and members of the Central Committee, arrived at No. 6 platform at 5-49 a.m., and Sir John and his colleagues arrived by special train at No. 7 platform at 6-9 a.m.
On their arrival, the members of the Commission were received by Mr. H. Graham, Private Secretary, and Captain Greenway, A.D.C. to His Excellency the Governor; Mr. H. S. E. Stevens, the District Magistrate of Howrah, and Mr. A. H. Ghuznavi, of the Provincial Committee.

900 POLICEMEN.

About 900 policemen were requisitioned for the occasion and the station precincts were cleared of all traffic. The cab road between platforms Nos. 6 and 7 was walled up on both sides with asbestos corrugated sheets, and all exits and entrances from and to the station hall were closed and guarded by police.
A portion of Grierson Road, opposite platform No. 6, was barricaded with barbed wire. The Howrah bridge, also, was cleared of all traffic and only pressmen and those who were present on the platform were allowed to pass over the bridge.

SHOUTS FROM BOYCOTTERS.

A number of boycotters took their stand at the entrance to Burrabazar Ghat, close to the foot of the Calcutta end of the bridge, with black flags bearing the inscription "Simon go back," and shouted as each car passed.

A number of people were kept back by the police at the crossing of Harrison Road, and Strand Road, and a portion of Harrison Road from the crossing was also barricaded with barbed wire.

Here the Congress leaders, Messrs. J. M. Sen Gupta and Subash Chandra Bose, were present. All important street crossings were guarded by police sergeants and constables, and armed police pickets were posted at regular intervals.

TRAFFIC HELD UP.

Traffic of all descriptions was held up for over an hour. Extra police precautions were taken and a large number of policemen were kept as a standby at the Lal Bazar headquarters, in case of an emergency, and several buses and lorries were chartered for the occasion.

The majority of the Congress volunteers and boycotters crowded the precincts of Sealdah station and a large crowd had assembled in the neighbourhood, but, at 7 o'clock, when they were told that the Commission had already arrived at Howrah station, they went back to the office of the B.P.C.C., under the instructions of Mr. J. M. Sen Gupta.

Fortunately, no untoward incident happened and everything was over by 8 a.m.

EVERY NATION'S RIGHT.

As the day advanced the boycotters became more active and formed themselves into batches. Five thousand, under the leadership of Mr. Subash Chandra Bose, marched through the principal streets with black flags, shouting: "Simon go back!"

The demonstrations included a display of inscriptions, such as: "Every nation has a right to revolt against tyranny and injustice."

There is a complete *hartal* in the Indian quarters, but in the European a few Indian business houses have been opened as usual. The tram service and vehicular traffic have not been suspended. Armed police are guarding all the important crossings and mounted police are patrolling the principal streets.

The atmosphere, as reported at 9 a.m., was very peaceful. A public meeting under the presidency of Mr. J. M. Sen Gupta, will be held at 4-30 this afternoon to protest against the Simon enquiry.

REUMOURS CONFOUNDED.

How baseless are the rumours may be judged from the following authentic details of his journey from Miranshah to the Homeward-bound steamer.

Shaw was warned that a transfer from India was imperative and that he must leave the country if possible within 48 hours. Given the choice of proceeding to Singapore or England, he chose the latter.

AT LAHORE.

A daybreak on Tuesday last, he took off from Miranshah in a D.H. 9A of No. 60 Squadron and landed at Lahore about noon. The rapidity of the decision is shown by the fact that the arrival of the plane was almost unknown until it was practically over Lahore, the usual practice being to give warning. Our exclusive photograph was secured as he stepped from the machine and took off his parachute.

"FED UP."

Slight in stature, though more robust than in his Arabian days, he was tired but jocular, asking his way to the Aircraft Park office to report. To questioners among the Park personnel, he was as reticent as his wont, but expressed himself thoroughly "fed up" with the manner in which his former name was being connected with the Afghan troubles which he had nothing to do with and had no wish to be connected with being quite happy as a squadron office clerk at Miranshah.

After an hour, the D.H. 9A with "Aircraftman Shaw" took off again from Lahore Aerodrome and with one more brief halt for sleep and refuelling, the persecuted Aircraftsman, who is suffering the penalty of his own former notoriety, was landed at Drigh Road aerodrome, Karachi, and a little later boarded his steamer leaving Bombay for England on Saturday afternoon. Such is the plain story of the departure from India of one of the most remarkable personalities in modern history—"Unknown King of Arabia" and R.A.F. clerk.

gal and about 150 of their friends assembled in the Old Council Chamber, Government House, at eleven o'clock this morning to present an address of welcome to Sir John Simon and members of the Statutory Commission. The members of the Central and Provincial Committees were also present. The Maharaja of Cochin Bazar read the address and later presented it in a casket to Sir John Simon.

The address welcomed Sir John Simon and his colleagues, both British and Indian, on their visit to this province in connection with the task of evolving a constitution suited to conditions in India.

AN IMPORTANT LINK.

It stated that District Boards formed an important link in the chain of self-governing institutions and as such on their growth and development depended largely the progressive realisation of responsible Government in India.

Since the inauguration of the reforms in 1919, and in fact even from before then, the control of District Boards in this province had been transferred to non-official chairmen and a review of their administration during this period would undoubtedly convince them that they had proved themselves equal to the task and the responsibilities reposed in them.

SUCCESSFUL ADMINISTRATION.

The successful administration of the Board had furnished ample proof of the fitness of Indians for higher and fuller administrative responsibilities and for the grant of provincial autonomy, in which self-governing bodies, particularly District Boards, would play a very important part.

THE MANMAD BOMB EXPLOSION.

Sequel in Nasik Court.

RAILWAY GUARD'S STORY OF DISASTER.

Nasik, Jan. 12.

There was a sequel in the court of the Special Magistrate, Mr. Kudav, here on Friday to the explosion which occurred on the Delhi-Alahabad Express while it was passing Manmad, a station on the Great Indian Peninsula Railway on October 7. Three passengers were killed and eight were injured. An official report, issued three weeks after the disaster, merely gave outlines of the accident and provided no clue to its cause.

The hearing of the case to-day was held in camera, and the report published below is that supplied by the Government Prosecutor, Rao Bahadur Pradhan, when the court arose for the day.

"TERRIFIC EXPLOSION."

The first witness was a guard in the employ of the G.I.P. Railway, named Benjamin Butler. He was on the train on the day of the explosion, and said that after passing Hiswad he heard a terrific explosion. Splinters of stone, glass and wood sprayed the brake-van and he saw a dense cloud of smoke issuing from a carriage. He immediately brought the train to a standstill. He found that three passengers had been thrown out of the train. In addition, two were lying dead and two others were bleeding profusely. Nine men and women in the compartment were suffering from injuries to their faces, and another man was found seriously injured.

Harendra Deo, an assistant in charge of the Manmad Railway Hospital, described the wounds of one of the injured men, Harendra. He

RS. 50,000 MISSING.

Treasury Officer Arrested.

Jhang, Jan. 12.

A sensation has been caused by the disappearance of Rs. 50,000 from the Government Treasury count. It is alleged that the Central Co-operative Bank presented a cheque for Rs. 50,000 on the Government Treasury. The Treasury Officer disbursed the money to the treasurer for payment as the cheque had been duly signed by the hon. secretary of the bank.

It is alleged that the officer of the bank did not receive the money while the treasurer alleges that the payment was made. The matter was reported to the District Magistrate by both the parties. One treasurer has been taken into police custody.

said that his right leg and thigh were pierced and the wounds were bleeding freely. There were many burns on the body, those near the waist being particularly severe.

M. Barretto, the gangman in charge of the damaged carriages, said that some time before the explosion he had examined the tickets of passengers in the compartment in question. He was shown the ticket of the first accused, and this bore his signature. He was unable to identify the accused.

Dr. Panch gave evidence concerning the post-mortem examination of a body which was subsequently identified as that of Markande Ye, who was alleged to be taking a quantity of dynamite and an *attaché* case containing explosives from Benares.

At the conclusion of the day's proceedings, the Magistrate, in consultation with the prosecution counsel, decided that the trial should be open to the public and to the press except when he considered it necessary, in the public interests, to exclude them.

PEACE EFFORT FROM RUSSIA.

Plan to Forestall Kellogg Pact.

London, Jan. 11.

Russia recently formally proposed to Poland and Lithuania that they should sign a protocol with Russia declaring the Kellogg Peace Pact as being already in force as between them without awaiting ratification of the pact by all the signatories.

Lithuania has agreed to the proposal and suggested to Latvia and Estonia that they should do likewise.

POLAND'S REPLY.

Poland's reply, anxiously awaited by her neighbours, was delivered at Moscow last evening.

According to a Warsaw message the reply says that Poland agrees to the plan in principle but suggests certain alterations in the manner of concluding the suggested protocol.

It expresses astonishment that Russia should have only addressed Poland and Lithuania on the subject and not her other neighbours.

The reply adds that Poland considers it her duty to consult Latvia, Estonia, Finland and Rumania before making any further move.—Reuter.

"EVANS OF THE BROKE."

To Command Australian Squadron.

London, Jan. 12.

Rear-Admiral Edward Evans, better known as "Evans of the Broke," has been appointed to be Rear-Admiral Commanding the Royal Australian Squadron, in succession to Rear-Admiral Hyde, of the Royal Australian Navy. The appointment is dated March 18.

DEOGARH CASE.

"Existence of Plot Proved."

JUDGE AND SECRET CODE.

Patna, Jan. 11.

AFTER the arguments on behalf of the accused appellants in the Deogarh Conspiracy case had concluded the Chief Justice, calling upon Mr. P. C. Manuk to argue on behalf of the Crown, remarked that he was satisfied that a conspiracy existed and that the cipher code could be taken as proof of its existence.

Mr. Manuk complimented the Criminal Investigation Department of Bihar and Bengal for adducing such a vast volume of evidence, the genuineness of which had not been challenged. He stated that the whole case depended on the cipher code.

Criticising the judgment of the trial Judge, counsel contended that the purpose for which the literature was used proved that it was part of a system of revolutionary propaganda.

COMMON INTENTION.

The law in India only required the prosecution to show that any acts of conspiracy were performed with a common intention. The conspirators in this case, he said, had evolved a system of working in order to obtain greater secrecy and only the leading men in the conspiracy had a knowledge of its entire working. The reasonable inference to be drawn from the secret code was that every person mentioned in it was an active participant in the conspiracy. The code itself established an act of conspiracy.

The agreement between the parties was, he continued, to be inferred from certain acts of the conspiracy.

"CHAIN OF CIRCUMSTANCES."

Here the Chief Justice remarked that from the existence of the code, which was a secret method of communication, they might assume that the accused persons had a common intention. Counsel argued that the similarity of method pointed to a common goal.

Dealing with individual cases, counsel referred to the find at Deogarh and contended that they all revealed a chain of circumstances which linked the accused with the conspiracy.

The hearing was adjourned.

Mr. H. I. Searle, I.C.S., Deputy Commissioner, received charge of Mandalay district on January 3.

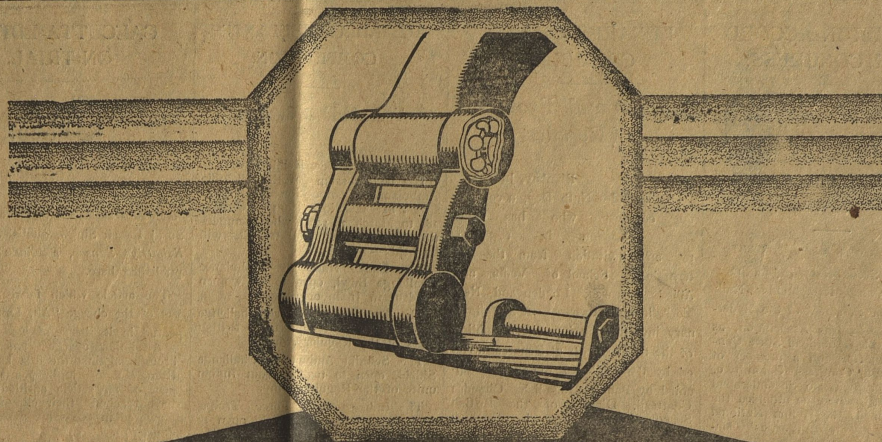
The Gazette published two resolutions containing orders regarding the constitution and function of the Government Communications Board and Government Buildings Committee in supersession to previous orders.

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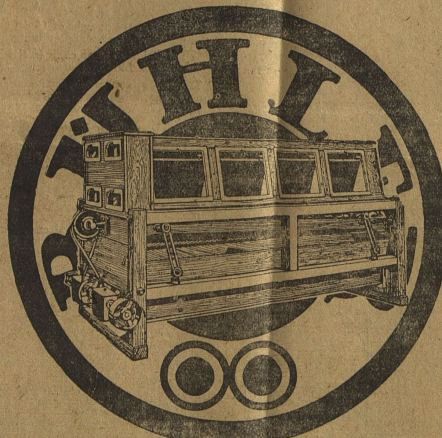

LABOUR IN ACCORD WITH CONGRESS.

Communal Situation "Hopeful."

CONGRESS DELEGATE'S VIEWS.

(FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT).

Secunderabad, Jan. 12. Mr. Vaman Ramchundar Naik Jagirdar, the President of the Hyderabad State Reforms Association, as well as of the Hyderabad State Congress Committee and a member of the All-India Congress Committee, has just returned to Secunderabad from Calcutta where he attended the last session of the Indian National Congress and the All-Parties Conference. When interviewed, he said that the recent session was unique in the annals of the Congress, inasmuch as Labour had identified itself with Congress activities and ideals in a very striking manner.

In his opinion this was concrete proof of the awakening of the masses to national needs. He was convinced from the general trend of the proceedings of the All-Parties Convention that there was a hopeful indication of improvement in the near future in the relations which existed between the Hindus and Mahomedans.

CHANGED ATTITUDE.

He said that it was exceedingly gratifying to note that the Congress had changed its attitude towards the relations which existed between the ruling princes and their subjects as was apparent from a resolution which had been passed demanding responsible government and the immediate announcement of the grant of primary rights, such as the freedom of speech and the freedom of the press.

When questioned as to his views on dominion status, as against complete independence, Mr. Naik said that he was all in favour of dominion status, as in his opinion both phrases meant one and the same thing and only differed in their wording. He believed that dominion status implied internal independence.

AN UNWISE STEP.

Moreover, he was of the belief that it was neither wise nor probable for India to sever her connection with the British Crown, which was her best security for the enjoyment of peaceful independence.

Mr. Naik has been invited to attend the South Indian States Subjects Conference, which is to be held at Trivandrum under the presidency of Sir M. Viveswaraya.

DEFAMATION CASE COMPOUNDED.

Defendants Apologise.

Rangoon, Jan. 11.

The defamation case which was filed by Mr. Kyau-Zin an advocate, against Dr. Thein Maung, M.L.C., the editor, and U. Zin Than, the printer and publisher of *New Burma*, an English tri-weekly paper, has been compounded, the accused tendering an apology. Shortly before the Legislative Assembly bye-election, which Mr. J. K. Munishi, Mr. J. R. Vakharia, and the complainant were contesting, an article appeared in the paper in question stating that none of the candidates could claim to be Burmese. To this the complainant took objection and complained. The Magistrate acquitted both the accused.

HELP FOR THE BLIND IN MADRAS.

Madras, Jan. 10.

The Board of Governors of the Institution for the Blind, which was formed some time ago at Madras met at Government House. The Governor of Madras presided. It is understood that the meeting discussed the rules and articles of association and the appointment of a secretary.

It was decided to approach the Government for a grant in aid of the institution and to apply to the Military authorities to place the barracks in Poonamallee at its disposal.

The Railway Board have sanctioned the construction of the Decaricha Railway by the Eastern Bengal Railway administration.

The King has approved of the appointment of Col. D. A. D. McLean as Colonel of the 3rd Batta, 11th Sikh Regt., (Rattray's Sikh).

BENARES GHATS CRUMBLING.

Experts and Problems of Repairs.

Bombay, Jan. 11.

Dr. Birendra Nath Dey, a consulting engineer who has come from London in response to an invitation from the International School of Vedic and Allied Research, London and New York, in order to carry out a preliminary investigation into the crumbling of the temple ghats at Benares, arrived by the mail-boat to-day, accompanied by Pandit Jagadish Chandra Chatterji, Director of the British School of Vedic Research, of which Earl Ronaldshay is President.

Mr. Chatterji and Dr. Dey propose to take up immediately the inquiry into the repairs necessary to the ghats and the probable cost. The headquarters of the Vedic Research School will eventually be situated at Radha Vilas, Benares. Offers of support have been received from India, Great Britain and the United States, especially from the last-named country and Sir Edwin Lutens who also arrived to-day, is taking an active interest in the scheme.

THE ENGLISH PLAYERS.

Temperature Above Normal Along Frontier

Poona, Jan. 12.

NEW METHOD CURES FACIAL PARALYSIS

Dr. Rue Reports Success of Nerve Grafts—Emotional Expression Restored.

LONG MEDICAL PROBLEM

Technique Developed by New York and London Surgeons Applied to 17 Persons.

BASED ON ANIMAL TESTS

Research Work Has Taken Two or Three Generations Without Them, Physician Declares.

A new method of curing facial paralysis by surgery, which has been used successfully to restore emotional expression to the face—a problem that has long challenged the most expert of the medical profession—was announced yesterday in the quarterly bulletin of the Atlantic Memorial Hospital.

The report on the successful application of the new discovery is written by Dr. Arthur H. Duell, who is developing the method of restoring impaired muscular control in collaboration with Dr. Duell, senior surgeon-in-chief at St. Thomas Hospital, London. Dr. Duell is senior editor of the bulletin, a vice president and chairman of the board of surgical directors of the Manhattan Eye, Ear and Throat Hospital, and is associated with a number of other hospitals and scientific institutions.

As explained by Dr. Duell, the new method of treating facial paralysis is based on the discovery of the fact that the nerve fibers of the injured nerve can be grafted onto the nerve fibers of a normal nerve. This method, which has been used successfully in animals, has been applied to the treatment of human beings.

Dr. Duell reports that the method has been used successfully in 17 persons, with the most successful results in the case of a woman who had been paralyzed for three years. The method has been used in the treatment of facial paralysis, and in the treatment of other conditions.

В список таких лиц входят бывший канцлер Филипп Шейдеман, Леон Фейхтвангер, Генрих Манн, депутат рейхстага Брайтвайд, издатель газет — Бернгард Керр, Штадлер и фон Герлах и бывшие главы полиции Грехенский и Бейсе.

Министерство внутренних дел объявило, что собственность этих лиц конфискована.

РИМ, 25 августа (АП). В дипломатических кругах предполагают, что свидание Муссолини с австрийским канцлером Дольфусом поведет к созданию свободных зон в Триесте для Австрии и Венгрии.

Такие зоны понизили бы накладные расходы на импорт и экспорт этих наций.

Триест был свободной зоной для Чехословакии по окончании европейской войны, но она не пользовалась этим итальянским портом.

Сообщается, что премьер Муссолини согласился на оказание предельной помощи ввозимым в Италию австрийским товарам и на увеличение покупок этих товаров.

Умер во время сна.

ЛОС-АНЖЕЛЕС, 25 августа (ИНС). Эдвин Р. Коаллин, главный редактор «Лос-Анджелес Ивинг Герольд энд Экспресс» и многолетний директор херстовских вечерних газет на тихоокеанском побережье, умер сегодня внезапно, в возрасте 75 лет, в своем доме от разрыва сердца, в происшедшего во время сна.

Он был постигнут ударом 6 июня и семья его считала, что Коаллин находится на пути к выздоровлению.

Лидер националистов объявил, что правительство и публика должны считаться с фактом, что, если он снова будет посажен в тюрьму, то ему должна быть предоставлена полная возможность вести кампанию в пользу пария, или, в противном случае, он снова начнет голодовку до смерти.

ВАШИНГТОН, 25 августа (АП). Национальный совет из 76 сообщает сегодня, что преступность стоит Соединенным Штатам по 13,000,000,000 долл. ежегодно.

Каждый год, в среднем, убиваются в США 12,000 человек, 3,000 похищаются, производятся нападения на 100,000 человек и 50,000 обворовываются.

Ежегодное число убийств увеличилось с 1890 года на 350%.

Каждый год обворовываются 40,000 домов и теряется больше 100,000,000 долл. от подлогов.

Эти цифры собраны указанным национальным советом, образованным 4 июля из группы частных граждан, стремящихся привлечь общественное внимание на угрозу организованной преступности.

Во главе этой группы стоит полковник Джамс А. Мосс, известный военный автор. Совет этот имеет отделения в каждом штате и в каждом конгрессовом районе.

Мосс заявляет: «Обыкновенно просто не знают действительное положение вещей и национальный совет сообщит им факты».

Ограбление банка в штате Юта.

СОЛТ-ЛЕЙК-СИТИ, 25 августа (АП). При заминировании банда вошла в ограбление в Сограуэз Банк в предместьях Солт-Лейк-Сити, заперли трех служащих в вольеры (подвалы) и скрылись с 6,290 долл.

ВЕНА, 25 августа (ЧДН). Корреспондент «Чикаго Дейли Ньюс», Джон Гунтер, сообщает, что в Праге официально не объявлено о намерении Эдуарда Бенеса, министра иностранных дел, посетить Рим, чтобы совещаться с фашистскими лидерами относительно австро-германского кризиса.

Почему СССР стремится избежать войны с Японией.

«ОТКРОВЕНИЯ» СОВЕТСКОГО ПОСЛА В КИТАЕ БОГОМОЛОВА.

ПЕКИН, 25 августа (ИНС). Возвратившийся на днях из Москвы советский посол в Китае Б. Богомолов заявил в неофициальном разговоре, что СССР не рассматривает вступление в вооруженный конфликт с Японией, до тех пор, пока США не возобновят его дипломатических сношений с СССР.

Москва терпит «постоянные» японские провокации в Маньчжурii не потому, что она не подготовлена к войне, а вследствие искреннего желания сохранения мира.

Если бы существовали дипломатические сношения между США и СССР, то японские действия на материке Азии за последние два года отличались бы весьма существенно от настоящих ее действий. Богомолов сказал, что та-

ковы воззрения советских официальных кругов в Москве.

Это — первое признание со стороны крупного советского представителя, что русские находятся на Далеком Востоке в неблагоприятном положении, происходящем оттого, что Япония состоит в дипломатических сношениях с США в то время, как СССР не состоит.

Указывается, что в случае русско-японской войны Япония, имбующая дипломатические представители в США, может легко возстановить общественное мнение в Америке против СССР.

Если суждено было вооруженному конфликту между Японией и СССР, то Москва прежде всего желает быть уверенной в одинаковых с

Японией шансах, что касается США.

Ничто другое не может уверить СССР в этом, кроме признания его Америкой.

Многие наблюдатели, в особенности китайские, следя за постоянным отказом СССР от его привилегий по мбв японского вооруженного продвижения, думали, что СССР отступал вследствие боязни борьбы или неготовности к ней. Богомолов утверждает, что это далеко от истины.

Он допускает, что война с Японией в настоящее время является на выполнение второй цели, то есть красная армия в состоянии вести ее со всей мощностью.

Однако, закончил он, СССР желает мира и в интересах его шел неоднократно на уступки японцам в Китае.

Уже тогда признавался, что индустриализация сов. союза без помощи извне невозможна. А так как помощи можно было ожидать только от захватывающей от переизбытка товаров Америки, то со временем и начали зондировать почву в этом направлении. Но все планы, выдвигавшиеся Москвой, отвергались Америкой и только к началу этого года, в настроении за океанской республики наступил перелом.

Лишь приход к власти президента Рузвельта создал реальную почву для переговоров большевиков с Америкой.

Круги информированные о структуре переговоров передают, что вступив в переговоры в жизнь этих планов, Сибирь и советский Дальний Восток будут представлять собой что-

то вроде колонии Св. Америки. Прежде всего условия признания, выдвинутые Америкой, предусматривают долгосрочную аренду больших земельных пространств по сибирской магистрали, для устройства на них хозяйственных заводов.

Эти заводы будут представлять собой сельско-хозяйственные и промышленные города. Американские подданные в пределах факторий должны пользоваться всеми правами американских граждан, то-есть, неприкосновенностью личности, имущества и другими гражданскими свободами.

Американцы со своей стороны обещают продолжить старую связь между Германией и Россией. Но Вильгельм II не понимал, до какой степени царь зависел от других, и как его мало уважали даже в его собственной семье. 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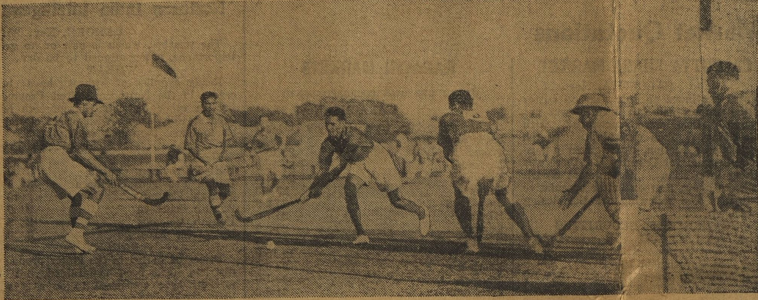

CHAMPION JIMMY WILDE

Refused Boxing Referee's Licence

Jimmy Wilde, ex-fly-weight champion of the world, has had his application for a referee's licence refused by the British Boxing Board of Control.

This decision was reached at a meeting of the Board held in strict privacy recently.

No reason was given. Wilde's name was merely included with three other refusals in a circular issued privately to members of the Board.

When the Board's decision was disclosed to other boxers and men famous in the fighting world, the news was greeted with amazement and by a storm of protest.

Managers, boxers, promoters, and referees alike were astounded.

"It is beyond my understanding why a boxer, of Jimmy Wilde's proved experience and reputation should be refused permission to referee," Don McCorkindale stated, "to my mind he is the ideal man for the job."

Other boxers have pointed out that not only had Wilde fought continuously over a period of 15 years, and held the world title, but he had always championed the cause of the unknown boxer.

Jimmy Wilde, when spoken to, said that he could not make any statement about the decision.

Wilde has been described as the greatest boxer of all time at his weight. Even in the final defeat which lost him the world championship to Pancho Villa he fought on for seven punishing rounds, his unquenchable spirit keeping him on his feet.

When his seconds implored him to throw in the towel, his answer was: "No, I won't quit. I want to go down like a champion."

TENNIS PLAYER'S SACRIFICE

Trip to S. Africa Refused

Miss Kay Stammers, joint "Number One" in the new British lawn tennis ranking, has made a big sacrifice in the interests of her game. She has declined an invitation to winter in South Africa as a member of the Lawn Tennis Association team in order to devote herself to serious practice in the early spring.

The South African tour is the one most coveted among lawn tennis players. Socially, as well as in a tennis sense, it is a splendid experience, and, of course, all expenses of this "winter in sunshine" are officially paid. Yet Miss Stammers has let the opportunity pass because she has decided to accept advice that practice rather than competitive play is what her game now requires.

Despite her brilliance of last season—when she beat Mrs. Helen Wills-Moody, Miss Helen Jacobs, and Miss Dorothy Round—her game has a way of falling to pieces against inferior opponents. Her best feats have been followed by bad reactions. It is the hope of gaining solidity and balance for her strokes that she has decided to stay at home.

NEW FOREST GOLF CLUB

Annual Meeting in Dehra Dun

The annual meeting of the New Forest Golf Club, at which Mr. C. G. Trevel, C.I.E., Inspector-General of Forests, presided, was held in Dehra Dun on Tuesday last. The Honorary Secretary's report showed that good progress had been made and that the membership was increasing. The Honorary Treasurer was able to report a satisfactory balance on the year's working.

Mr. J. C. G. Scott, C.I.E., having resigned, Major V. E. H. Talbot was elected vice-president. The other officers of the club were asked to continue in office for another year.

FOOTBALL REFEREES

Improved Fees Suggested

Mr. E. Gregson, chairman of Leicester City, leaders of the Second Division of the Football League, is convinced that first-class referees ought to be paid far better fees. At present the fees are three guineas for matches in the First and Second Division and two guineas in the Third Division. Mr. Gregson would be prepared to pay £10 per match in first-class games, which may be set down as those in the First and Second Divisions.

Mr. Gregson waves aside the old objections to higher fees by stating that such a fee as he suggests would attract to the game men who hitherto have never thought of becoming referees; in other words, that the game calls for different handling, and that specialisation is not only necessary, but would be warranted if the reward were made attractive.

This suggestion will certainly be opposed hotly, but it should be welcomed if for no other reason than that it will make the League clubs bend their minds again to the subject of the selection of referees. They already have power to recommend ambitious referees for promotion to the League's list, and their weekly reports on the control of their matches are the chief guide to the Management Committee's selections and revisions.

A PIONEER EFFORT

Mr. Gregson, who had some strong remarks to make concerning the standard of refereeing in the London Combination, is certain that if the fee is made worthy of the occasion the right men will be forthcoming in a manner never previously contemplated.

It may be recalled that some years ago one referee, Mr. Percy Sant, of Barnsley, gave up his employment in order to become a whole-time referee, but this idea did not find favour, and Mr. Sant eventually went into football management—at Barnsley—for a time. Then, of course, there was no such financial inducement to make refereeing a profession and the new put forward, but it may yet be that Mr. Sant's example will prove to be the forerunner of a move to provide the most efficient match-control the game has ever seen.

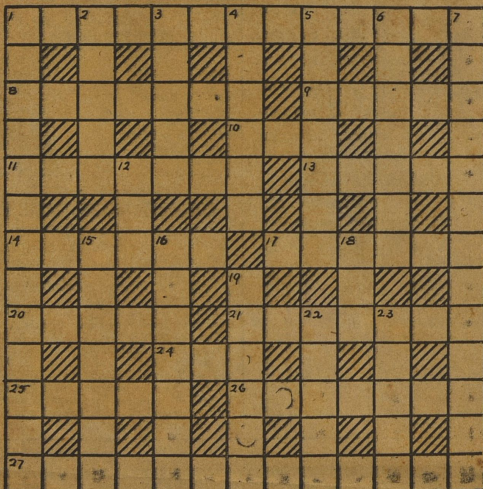

Воздушная атака Берлина

Нападающая эскадрилья застала германскую столицу погруженной въ абсолютную тишину, такъ какъ объ ея приближеніи Берлинъ былъ вовремя предупрежденъ. Задачей ма не нравя было выяснитъ, смогутъ ли вражескіе летчики ориентироваться надъ Берлиномъ въ этихъ условіяхъ и установить мѣстополюженіе наиболее известныхъ зданій. Городъ Берлинъ, представляющій собою сравнительно легкую добычу для ориентации въ воздухѣ, долженъ былъ, главнымъ образомъ, скрытъ отъ вражескихъ летчиковъ своей правительственной квартирой и въ частности Вильгельмштрассе.

Самъ Герингъ лично въ воздухѣ поднялся въ воздухѣ и вмѣстѣ съ нѣсколькими другими летчиками участвовалъ въ маневрахъ, выясняя мѣстополюженіе важнейшихъ зданій.

Ровно въ 10 час. вечера въ Берлинѣ были погашены всѣ огни на улицахъ, какъ въ окнахъ домовъ, такъ и рекламные вывески и улицы

ноое освѣщеніе. Населеніе Берлина проявило полную дисциплину. Хотя на улицы высыпали тысячи людей, но порядокъ соблюденъ ничѣмъ нарушенъ не былъ.

Надъ Берлиномъ стояла свѣтлая лунная ночь и это облегчало работу наблюдателей. Кафе и рестораны, внутреннія помѣщенія которыхъ были освѣщены, а окна затенены, торговали особенно оживленно въ нѣкоторыхъ районахъ Берлина, особенно на Курфюрстендаммъ получалось впечатлѣніе, что совершается какое-то увеселительное торжество, и только шумъ пропеллеровъ напоминалъ о серьезности происходившаго.

Въ одномъ районѣ Берлина маневры были проведены, наоборотъ, съ необычайной строгостью. Тамъ населенію было запрещено выходить на улицы въ теченіи нѣсколькихъ часовъ.

Объ общемъ руководители маневровъ были удовлетворены этими результатами.

Александръ III и Вильгельмъ II въ Нарвѣ

(Историческая памятка)

Бывшій долготѣлій начальникъ жел. дор. станцій Нарва, Г. И. Алликъ, года два тому назадъ въшедшій на пенсію, на страницахъ эстонскихъ газетъ дѣлаетъ своими воспоминаніями о встрѣчѣ въ Нарвѣ двухъ императоровъ 45 лѣтъ тому назадъ.

— Въ августѣ 1890 года — разсказываетъ Г. И. Алликъ — намъ сообщили, что въ Нарву прибываетъ царь Александръ III и германскій императоръ Вильгельмъ II. Станцію быстро привели въ должный порядокъ. Въ районѣ нынѣшняго эстонскаго жел. дор. переезда была выстроена специальная платформа для приема русскаго императора и такая же платформа

для приема Вильгельма II — въ районѣ Крегсгольмской Воскресенской церкви.

По прихоту царскаго поѣзда, Александръ III и наследникъ Николай справлялись на лошадахъ въ сопровожденіи свиты на дачу Полюшова, что въ паркѣ Нарвской Лѣндропольной м. ры. Отъ платформы и до самой дачи стояли шпалеры солдатъ.

Нѣсколько часовъ спустя къ другой платформѣ подошелъ поѣздъ Вильгельма II. Встрѣчалъ его самъ Александръ III. По выходѣ Вильгельма изъ вагона Александръ сразу же пошелъ къ нему. Монархи сердечно пожали другъ другу руки и облобызались.

20-моторный аэропланъ

Министерство авіаціи Соед. Штатовъ опубликовало условия конкурса на постройки самого большого самолета въ мірѣ. Новый воздушный гигантъ можетъ быть по выбору его строителя гидропланомъ или аэропланомъ, либо соединять въ себѣ эти оба качества, но долженъ быть снабженъ 20 моторами и поднимать не менѣе 120 человекъ, считая экипажъ и пассажировъ. Въ настоящее время самымъ большимъ самолетомъ въ мірѣ являются германскій гидропланъ „До-Х“, (поднимающій 100 человекъ), французскій „Летеванъ де вассо Пари“ (87 чел.) и совѣтскій 12 моторный аэропланъ „Максимъ Горькій“ (поднимающій 105 чел.).

Институтъ Масарика

Бюджетная коммисія чешскаго сената обсуждала законопроектъ объ освобожденіи отъ налоговъ всѣхъ суммъ, пожертвованныхъ по случаю 55-лѣтія президента Масарика въ фондъ Института его имени. Институтъ Масарика включаетъ въ себя бібліотеку президента, состоящую изъ 120 тыс. томовъ, а также его архивъ и музей.

„Держите вора“

Въ Англіи извѣтъ, скорѣе анекдотическій, впрочемъ, успѣхъ, приспосабливъ, при помощи котораго доска съ номеромъ, имѣющимся на задкѣ каждаго автомобиля, автоматически перевертывается, когда за руль садится постороннее лицо, и являетъ крупную надпись синими буквами по блѣдному фону: „Держите вора“!

Приспособленіе это не плохое, но только для хозяевъ автомобилей, которые не подвержены разбѣганости. На нѣмъ, помпезнѣе на Флитъ стрітъ устроили грандиозную погоню за автомобилемъ, сзади котораго красовалась эта тревожная надпись, а когда автомобилиста удалось, наконецъ, задержать, онъ оказался чѣстнѣйшимъ человекомъ, свѣсивъ въ автомобиль своего друга по его же порученію и по его дѣлу.

Реставрація Инженернаго замка

Сейчасъ въ Петроградѣ ведутся работы по реставраціи Инженернаго замка. Возстановлены уже платформы и лампы внутри зданія, покрыты мраморной плитой, проложены на гранитныхъ лѣстницахъ, поставлены мраморныя статуи въ нишахъ, позолочены шпиль. Продолжается возстановленіе скульптурныхъ украшеній.

Далѣе оба императора присутствовали на бѣлихъ маневрахъ русскій войска, происходившихъ близъ Нарвы. Въ городѣ монархи поставили зданіе театру, гдѣ знакомились съ архивомъ. Послѣдня далавъ тогдашній помощникъ гор. головы Штайнбергъ.

Черезъ нѣсколько дней по отъѣздѣ высочайшихъ особъ, на нѣмъ станціи Нарва были вручены подорожьи отъ Александра III — золоты часы и отъ Вильгельма II — золотой крестъ. На Пушту 10 лѣтъ на производившіеся по Нарвѣ маневры привѣтъ уже Николай II.

Танецъ „корробоори“

Убийство тутемца по... заблужденію

Изъ Мельбурна сообщаютъ; „Летающій судья“ Уэльсъ (котораго называютъ такъ потому, что онъ облетаетъ подолговременнѣе ему районы на аэропланѣ) разбѣлалъ на дняхъ въ окрестностяхъ Алисъ Спрингсъ любовниковъ дѣло объ убійствѣ тутемца.

Оба обвиняемыхъ, тутемцы того же племени, не только не скрывали факта убійства, но ставили его себѣ въ заслугу. Они объяснили, что убитый совершилъ профанацию: онъ исполнилъ, въ присутствіи женщины, священнаго танца „корробоори“, который можно танцевать только ночью, при свѣтѣ луны или костра; но одна женщина не должна видѣть, какъ танцуютъ „корробоори“, иначе гнѣвъ боговъ обрушится на все племя.

Убитый нарушилъ это запрещеніе, и обвиняемые принесли его въ жертву богамъ, чтобы умиротворить ихъ и отградить бѣдствія, угрожающія племени.

Судья Уэльсъ оправдалъ обоихъ, указавъ, въ мотивированномъ приговорѣ, что они дѣйствовали изъ высшихъ побужденій, хотя и заблужденныхъ. Формально Уэльсъ основывался на недавнемъ законѣ, принятомъ австраліишскимъ парламентомъ, разрешившимъ судьямъ принимать во вниманіе въ извѣстныхъ случаяхъ, мѣстные обычаи и законы.

Вокругъ свѣта

— Въ Петроградѣ только за пол года пострадало отъ кражъ, воровъ и отъ автомобилей 603 ребенка. Такое количество жертвъ объясняется неудержимой „тагой“ дѣтей къ катанью на буферахъ.

— Въ отвѣтъ на объявленіе всеобщей забастовки въ Гаваннѣ, кубинское правительство отдало распоряженіе о конфискаціи капиталовъ и всего имущества рабочихъ синдикатовъ.

— Португальскій верховный судъ утвердилъ президентскіе выборы. Ген. Кармона официально провозглашенъ президентомъ.

— Въ Берлинѣ скончался проф. Максъ Людвигъ, изобрѣтатель инкулятора. Швейцарскій аэропланъ совершилъ полетъ изъ Швейцаріи въ Англію (800 км.) въ 2 часа 29 мин., достигнувъ скорости 315 км. въ часъ.

— На лѣсозаготовительныхъ работахъ въ Трансильваніи произо

шло побоище между группой цыганъ и мѣстными крестьянами. 4 человека убито и 40 ранено.

— Въ теченіи 1934 года въ Соед. Штатахъ насчитано было 15 случаевъ личнаго негровъ, противъ 28 ми въ 1933 году.

— Въ анкарское національное собраніе внесено законопроектъ объ объявленіи воскресенья дѣтско пятницы, днемъ отдыха въ Турціи.

— Въ бесѣдѣ съ журналистами, Беннеллоу выразилъ убѣжденіе, что не позже, чѣмъ черезъ три мѣсяца, въ Греціи будетъ восстановленъ монархическій режимъ.

— Согласно даннымъ, опубликованнымъ отдѣленіемъ московскаго народнаго банка, за первые два мѣсяца сего года совѣтское правительство размыслило въ Англіи, за казновъ на 1.827.690 ф. ст. — на 38,6 проц. больше, чѣмъ за январь и февраль 1934 г.

Англійскій король будетъ опекуномъ „канадской пятнери“

Извѣстная опекунъ, которая ставила названіе привилегированную опеку надъ такъ называемой „канадской пятнери“, пятно дочерью канадскаго фермера Дюнне, чтобы ловкіе антрепренеры и владельцы цирковъ не соблазнили чету Дюнне воспользоваться своими дѣтскими въ качествѣ средства для заработка, разбѣлывъ выставку ихъ въ качествѣ „аттракціона“ и чуда природы. Извѣстно также, что родители „пятнери“ сочили эту опеку насильемъ надъ собою и нарушеніемъ своихъ родительскихъ правъ и даже возбуждали судебный процессъ, предпринимая оспариваніе и разбѣлывъ распоряжаться какъ судьбой дѣтей, такъ и крупнымъ денежнымъ фондомъ, образовавшимся изъ присланныхъ младамъ пожертвованій.

Чету Дюнне вслѣдствіи поддержали много католиковъ, утверждая, что протестантскія власти стремятся лишить родительскіе права католическую чету.

Теперь, для того, чтобы положить конецъ всѣмъ этимъ слухамъ, власти штата Онтарио, въ которомъ родились дѣти, предложили назна

няли участіе 35 государствъ, и рѣшено было всѣми мѣрами способствовать осуществленію Пакта. Вскорѣ послѣ этого Пактъ былъ единогласно принятъ и Папъ-Американскій Уніей, которая обратилась съ воззваніемъ къ своимъ странамъ примкнуть къ Пакту. А вскорѣ уже цѣлый рядъ государствъ рѣшилъ подписать Пактъ. Активное участіе въ осуществленіи Пакта, какъ мы видѣли, принялъ и президентъ Рузвельтъ, увидѣвши въ своей ратификаціи Пакта всѣ страны, такъ что къ 14-ому апрѣлю с. г., когда по плану Пакта состоится торжественное празднество въ Вашингтонѣ, Пактъ уже будетъ подписанъ большинствомъ державъ Свѣта. Нужно замѣтить, что за принатіе Пакта положительно высказались и Прибалтійскія государства.

Понимая, если надѣлѣ всѣми культурными сокровищами всего міра будетъ развѣшаться Знамя Мира и Культуры, какъ символъ сокровенности творческихъ достижений человѣческаго гения, то это будетъ ознаменовано новой эрой въ международныхъ сношеніяхъ.

Мѣстные

жители Б. Лузвербергъ и А. Пуустъ оказались ранеными, а Лииса-д-ро Лебелеву кордникъ рукояткой револьвера повредилъ ухо. Съ большіи трудомъ кордника удалось успокоить и увести.

На днѣхъ 10-го Э. Анилене разбиралось въ Ракверескѣ окружной судъ. Судъ приговорилъ его къ 3-мъ годамъ тюремнаго заключенія.

Дѣло о шпіонажѣ въ Причудѣ

Въ военно-окружномъ судѣ въ Тарту слушалось дѣло жителей д. девази Нинна (Причудѣ) Федора и Алексѣя Батуриныхъ, Николая Кукина и Степана Козлова. Всѣмъ четверымъ было предьявлено обвиненіе въ шпионажѣ въ пользу СССР. Причудскій житель М. Плѣшковъ, арестованный при разоблаченіи въ 1932 году тайной коммунистической организаціи, показавъ на допросѣ, что бр. Батурины и ихъ родственники Н. Кукинъ и С. Козловъ имѣли сношенія съ совѣтскими аген-

тами и нѣсколько разъ нелегально ходили въ Сов. Россію.

Посудимцы, однако, категорически отрицали свою виновность. Благодаря цѣлому ряду благоприятныхъ для подсудимыхъ показаній свидѣтелей, они признаны виновными не въ шпионажѣ, а лишь въ сношеніяхъ съ ППУ. Судъ приговорилъ Федора и Алексѣя Батуриныхъ на каждыя къ 1 году тюрьмы, а Н. Кукина и С. Козлова — къ 9 мѣсяцамъ тюрьмы.

Умеръ 100-лѣтній прихожанинъ Кресто-Ольгинской церкви

На днѣхъ въ Кунингакюла, Ваксинарской волости, скончался старшій прихожанинъ Кресто-Ольгинской церкви Степанъ Орбыхъ, въ возрастѣ 100 лѣтъ.

Дѣлъ Степанъ былъ однимъ изъ первыхъ строителей нынешняго храма въ Ольгинскомъ Крестѣ. Обладая до послѣднихъ дней своей жизни отличной памятью, онъ хорошо разсказывалъ о своей жизни въ прошломъ. Какъ жилось въ дѣлѣхъ отъ насъ времена, какъ при-

ходилось работать. Онъ очень хорошо помнилъ исторію постройки храма и связанныя съ нимъ старыя преданія. Къ сожалѣнію, никто не потрудился записать ихъ и они умерли въ сѣ мѣхъ.

Въ столь преклонномъ возрастѣ Степану Орбыху пришлось испытать тяжелую долю жизни. Сынъ его лишился домагого крова и онъ жилъ у правнучки. До послѣднихъ дней онъ посылалъ церковь.

Убастующихъ сапожниковъ

Забастовка нарвскихъ сапожниковъ, начавшаяся еще 15 мая, продолжается съ нѣкоторыми для нихъ успѣхомъ. 7 нарвскихъ армярочныхъ торговцевъ обуювъ заключили съ ними коллективный договоръ. Сапожники сдѣлали уступку этимъ торговцамъ въ цѣнѣ, т. к. армярочный товаръ продается дешевле чѣмъ въ магазинахъ и раз-

фѣды по армярочамъ требуютъ расходовъ.

Вообще же до сихъ поръ сапожники мастерамъ удалось заключить коллективные договоры со сѣдующими предпріятіями: два договора съ торговцами I разряда, одинъ — II разряда и II договоръ съ мастерами. Въ числѣ подписавшихъ и армярочныхъ торговцевъ. Сапожники

въ сов. Россіи недавно вышла, изданная „Академіей“, книга Н. Н. Соболева „Русская народная рѣзба по дереву“.

Эта книга принадлежитъ извѣстному въ Россіи знатоку народного искусства. Въ ней болѣе 300 рисунковъ (есть и въ краскахъ) превосходно расположенныхъ и и прекрасно иллюстрирующихся текстомъ. Самый текстъ написанъ съ такимъ знаніемъ дѣла и такъ насыщенъ матеріаломъ, даже архивнымъ — Оружейной палаты, — что отъ книги нельзя оторваться.

Рѣзба по дереву — искусство народное, по преимуществу крестьянское. Оно отражаетъ не только хозяйственный укладъ русской жизни, но и духовныя стороны русской природы. Въ рѣзбѣ по дереву, по-крайней мѣрѣ, вся русская исторія со всѣмъ развитіемъ ея хозяйственныхъ формъ, бытовыхъ укладовъ, промышленнаго развитія, иностранныхъ заимствованій, наконецъ, проявления ея религиозныхъ формъ.

В. О. Ключевскій въ своемъ „Курсѣ“ въ главѣ о географическихъ факторахъ, о лѣсахъ описываетъ нѣсколько мрачно и неудачливо. Древне-русскій человѣкъ болѣе любилъ рѣку. Послѣ книги Соболева хочется заступиться за лѣсъ. Видѣть подлинная Русь — сторона лѣсная. „Возлѣ лѣса жить — голода не видѣть“, — лѣсная сторона не чуждая лѣсу, а лѣсу досѣла „накорить“, — говорятъ старинныя русскія пословицы, и въ русскомъ фольклорѣ не только къ рѣкѣ, но и къ лѣсу можно встрѣтить теплыя обращенія: „Ужъ ты ель моя елушка, зеленая сосенушка“ и проч.

Въ книгѣ Соболева изложена исторія России на фонѣ деревяннаго искусства. Крестьянское, городское, церковное представлено наглядно и детально.

Изумительныя образцы иконостава, съ поразительной рѣзбой, не знающей, кажется, никакихъ предѣловъ въ искусствѣ изображенія — отъ древнихъ простыхъ подлѣсокъ до сложныхъ иконостава античнаго орнамента и фигурныхъ украшеній барокко. Соболевъ, кажется, не оставилъ въ тѣни ни одной стороны деревяннаго искусства. Имъ разобраны и деревянные престолы, почти исчезнувшіе теперь въ церквахъ, и подсвѣчники и аналои (особенно одѣжъ великолѣпнѣ — елиза-

ветинской эпохи, въ Теропѣ, Псковской губ., — городъ, сохранившій много деревянной рѣзбы), и крѣны, и иконы и проч.

Говоря о обстоятельствахъ домова, о всевозможныхъ столбахъ, поставахъ, голубицкахъ, рѣзной посудѣ — солонкахъ, ложкахъ, рукомошникахъ или о прѣлкахъ, швейкахъ, валькахъ, рубелкахъ, игрушкахъ, екипажахъ, баржахъ и пр., авторъ даетъ при этомъ такія подробности ихъ происхожденія и выработки, что передъ нами встаетъ въ какой то особѣ интимной близости нашъ русскій бытъ, всѣмъ намъ хорошо знакомый, но какъ-то въ свое время незамѣчаемый...

Русскіе мастера мастера не только по привычкѣ воспроизводили старинныя русскіе образцы, но прекрасно контролировали записи, особенно въ XVIII вѣкѣ, часто приспособляя къ своему быту нѣкоторые мотивы рѣзбы. Конечно, на кустарное искусство въ разной степени влияло направленіе и идеологія эпохи. Въ эпоху Петра вмѣшивались церкви, запрещая фигурную рѣзбу. При Николаѣ I лѣсе угатывалась попытка ввести „онообразіе въ украшеніе православныхъ церквей“. Въ результатѣ страдаетъ стиль и появляется сплошная эклектизмъ. Въ XIX вѣкѣ кустарное искусство сдѣлалось предметомъ особаго вниманія какъ со стороны власти, такъ и со стороны представителей искусства вообще. Получилось насажденіе древнерусскихъ формъ нѣсколько искусственнымъ способомъ. Разсмотрѣны попытки художественныхъ мастеровъ: Абрамцева, Талашкина и др., давшія много очень талантливыхъ вещей, но часто страдальныхъ извращеній, фальшивыхъ и ненужныхъ украшеній, тогда какъ въ подлинныхъ народныхъ произведеніяхъ ничего не было „красоты ради“, все было въ мѣру и всѣ рѣзные украшенія только подчеркивали общую структуру вещи или цѣлаго сооруженія.

Въ заключеніе изъ изложенія автора видно, что, несмотря на всѣ трудности, такой эпохы, русское искусство по дереву еще не умерло въ Россіи, и есть надежда, что и новое „пролетарское“ творчество не будетъ враждебно своимъ народнымъ истокамъ. „П. Носъ“.

„День Русской Культуры“ въ Кунинганюль

Закрѣпленіе народного дома въ Скарятинѣ заставило устроителемъ „Дня Русской Культуры“ перенести вѣчернее празднество въ Кунинганюль. Справленіе небольшое по мѣстности этого дома едва могло вмѣстить всѣхъ участниковъ, собравшихся съ окрестныхъ деревень.

Актъ концерта открылся словомъ председателя комитета Н. Елифавы, предложившаго послать Главу государства К. Я. Пяту привѣтствію телеграмму. Хоръ подъ упр. В. В. Горскаго исполнитъ государственный гимнъ. Краткое привѣтствіе отъ Принравскаго Бюро Союза просв. об-вѣ сказалъ С. Кленскій. Съ обстоятельнымъ докладомъ о значеніи „Дня“ выступилъ лекторъ Нарвскаго русскаго народнаго ун-та И. П. Корсовскій.

На этихъ дѣняхъ между сапожниками была проведена анкета, при чемъ выяснилось, что изъ 68 мастеровъ только четверо не сочувствуютъ забастовкѣ.

Анна Стень собирается вернуться въ Россію

Русская фильмовая звѣзда Анна Стень расторгла контрактъ съ Сэмомъ Гольдониномъ, возглавляющимъ американск. фильмовое о-во „Юнайтедъ Артистсъ“. Контрактъ, заключенный на 15 мѣсяцевъ, долженъ былъ принести ей 52.000 ф. ст., такъ какъ гонораръ Анны Стень былъ опредѣленъ въ 800 ф. ст. въ недѣлю.

Анна Стень отказалась отъ работы съ Гольдониномъ, находя, что онъ поручаетъ ей слишкомъ низкія и простыя роли, недостойныя ея дарованія. Она хотѣла бы играть болѣе интересныя роли. Такъ, ее прельщаетъ, напр., роль героини въ „Питмилтонъ“ Шоу. Роли простодушныхъ дѣвушекъ, навязываемыя ей Гольдониномъ, Анна Стень считаетъ нежизненными. Анна Стень теперь собирается вернуться въ Россію и начать свою карьеру сначала.

Въ Америкѣ Анну Стень буквально „сдѣлалъ“ Гольдвинъ. Увидѣвъ ее въ германской постановкѣ „Братъевъ Карамозовыхъ“, онъ ангажировалъ ее и затѣялъ колоссальныя суммы для того, чтобы подготовить къ выступленію на американскомъ экранѣ. 6000 ф. ст. было затрачено на гардеробъ Анны Стень. 5000 ф. ст. ушло на эксперименты, каскадерск. и прически, грима, стиля ее костюмовъ, освѣщенія и т. д. Первая фильма съ Анной Стень „Нана“ обошлась Гольдвину въ 300.000 ф. ст. Было уже истрачено 50.000 ф. ст. и събыто для режиссера, какъ Гольдвинъ рѣшилъ выкинуть все съдѣланное уже снимки и начать съмыслу сначала. Въ первую же недѣлю „Нана“ въ одномъ Нью-Йоркѣ собрала 20.000 ф. ст. Второй фильмой Анна Стень было „Воскресенье“ по роману Толстого, третью, только что законченную, — „Свадебная ночь“. Въ ней ея партнеромъ является Гарри Куперъ, ирландскій циничный писатель, обрабатывающій душевный покой, пость встрѣчи съ наивною и простой дѣвушкой — Анной Стень. Эта роль явилась для нея кавалеріей, переполнившей чашу, и заставила ее по-равнать съ Америкой.

Советская фильма „Чапаевъ“

„Чапаевъ“ развѣрзается передъ зрителемъ картины борьбы красныхъ съ бѣлыми на колоческомъ фронтѣ. Легко представить себе, какинъ дукомъ приближнута советская фильма подобнаго содержания, къ тому же удостоившая высшей награды на кинематографическомъ конкурсѣ въ Москвѣ. Можно было разноразно мнѣнія относительно желательности демонстраціи этого дѣла для советскихъ гражданъ, но авторамъ и постановщикамъ фильму слѣдуетъ отдать справедливость—сдѣлана она ярко, броско и бли. съостаточностью, въ ней много интереснаго, удивительнаго. При постановкѣ, повидимому, считались и съ „экспортными“ требованіями. По крайней мѣрѣ въ томъ, что мы видимъ на экранѣ „Степана“, доблестнаго краснаго командира, полнокровнаго и парализованно воспроизводитъ, правдиво, а не авторитетно. Но фильму не выставлены въ кинематографическомъ видѣ, фильму обобщены безъ пресловутой „благодарности“ зрителю. Напротивъ, прекрасно показана атака офицерскаго полка. Разныя извѣстія

Лондонъ. Изъ Коломбо сообщаютъ, что въ теченіе одного дня на Цейлонѣ отъ малярии умерло 15.933 человѣкъ. Съ ноября по. го. да 1 мая эпидемія вызвала уже 82.637 смертныхъ случаевъ.

Варшава. Въ лодзинскомъ городскомъ совѣтѣ, въ которомъ все время происходятъ столкновенья между націоналистическимъ большинствомъ и оппозиціей, произошла драка, при которой 7 гражданъ было ранено, изъ нихъ 5 довольно тяжело.

Вашингтонъ. По официальнымъ даннымъ, въ Соед. Штатахъ въ настоящее время итѣтся 1200 военныхъ и гражданскихъ аэроплановъ и 18.000 летчиковъ.

Москва. ЦИКъ компартіи постановилъ распустить „Общество старыхъ большевиковъ“. Въ него входили: Сталинъ, Литвиновъ и многіе члены политбюро.

Бѣлградъ. Югославская полиція раскрыла въ Лобанскѣ тайную нац.-соц. организацию, обязавшую переходъ на югославскую территорию австрійскихъ наци и переправлявшую ихъ черезъ Сумахъ въ Германію. Полиція произвела рядъ арестовъ.

Берлинъ. Конференція о морскихъ вооруженіяхъ между Германіей и Англіей начнется 4 іюня въ Лондонѣ. Германскому делегату будетъ возглавлять фойа Риббентропъ.

Бѣлградъ. Останки 387 русскихъ солдатъ, погибшихъ въ Мировую войну на сербскомъ фронтѣ, перевезены въ Бѣлградъ и въ торжественной обстановкѣ, въ присутствіи военныхъ и гражданскихъ властей, преданы землѣ на русскомъ кладбищѣ.

На случай войны?

Въ голландскихъ финансовыхъ и биржевыхъ кружкахъ стало извѣстно, что въ теченіе послѣднихъ шести недѣль типографія рейхсбанка непрерывно печатаетъ кредитныя билеты, достоинствомъ въ 1, 5 и 10 марокъ.

Въ настоящее время въ Германіи итѣются обращенія лишь монеты этого достоинства изъ серебра и никеля. Печатаемые банкноты заготовляются въ предѣлахъ войны, когда металлическія монеты будутъ немедленно изъяты изъ обращенія для военныхъ надобностей.

Московскія высылки въ Сибирь

Германское осведомительное бюро сообщаетъ: „Швейцарская газета „Газетте дѣ лозинъ“ изъ хорошо осведомленныхъ источниковъ приводитъ сообщеніе, что совѣтскія учрежденія уже въ теченіе продолжительнаго времени въ принудительномъ порядкѣ переводятъ сотни тысячъ гражданъ нѣмецкой и польской національности изъ Ленинградской и Олесской областей въ Сибирь Совѣтскаго Союза и въ Сибирь. Изъ Ленинграда за промежутокъ времени въ два мѣсяца было выслано 20.000 человѣкъ.“

Калымъ

По словамъ св. газеты „Комс. Правда“. Въ Казанствѣ до сихъ поръ еще сохраняются обычаи уплаты за невесту выкупа, — калымъ. Недавно, рабочій възвращенскаго совхоза, Бажмагембековъ, продалъ свою дочь Батану за 300 рублей „трактористу“. Другой рабочій продѣлалъ собою свою 13-лѣтнюю дочь Фахму. Въ селѣ Успенно Юрьевскаго района продана за 300 рублей 13-лѣтнюю ученицу Раю Манатову. Такие же факты обнаружены и въ Башкиріи.

При этомъ въ уплатѣ калыма виновны мѣстные комсомольцы; такъ, комсомолецъ Галинджановъ, Мининскій района, рѣшивъ жениться, посылалъ дѣвушку изъ соседняго села, уплативъ за эту соотвѣствующій выкупъ. Комсомольскій организаторъ колхоза „Большевикъ“ Громовъ былъ менѣе болѣе 20 разъ и мѣнялъ жену чуть ли не кажнѣе дѣтъ недѣли. Во всѣхъ этихъ случаяхъ многоженцы, похитители дѣвушекъ и продавцы ихъ оставались безнаказанными.

Радио-аппаратъ „читающій человѣческія мысли“

теперь при большинствѣ операций и ампутаціи и даетъ прекрасные результаты. Врачи пытаются примѣнить ее теперь въ наиболѣе сложномъ и тонкомъ операцияхъ въ области мозга и глазныхъ ушекъ.

Неоднократно говорилось уже также о примѣненіи ультра короткихъ волнъ въ медицинѣ. Ученые работаютъ надъ тѣмъ, чтобы добиться примѣненія еще болѣе короткихъ волнъ, при помощи которыхъ нѣ удалось стерилизовать молоко и уничтожить паразитовъ въ хлѣбныхъ зернахъ.

Молочныя бары имѣютъ въ Австраліи огромный успѣхъ

Два года тому назадъ въ Сидней былъ открытъ баръ, въ которомъ вмѣстѣ алкогольныхъ напитковъ продавалось молоко. Этотъ молочный баръ уже въ самомъ непродолжительномъ времени завоевалъ среди населенія необычайную популярность.

Австраліискія газеты сообщаютъ, что по образцу этого перваго молочнаго бара теперь уже работа ютъ 30 другихъ. Молочныя бары стикуютъ изъяснѣе обстановкой и уютомъ. Въ нихъ продается мо-

локо во всевозможныхъ видахъ, то мѣло чистъ и сливочное мороженое. Продаются также всевозможныя молочныя продукты. За недѣлю въ такомъ молочномъ барѣ продается 4500 литровъ молока.

Эти бары, въ поразженіе своимъ алкогольнымъ собратѣмъ, открыты не только днемъ, но и ночью. Ярво освѣщенныя окна по ночамъ привлекаютъ посѣтителей, предположительно считаясь самымъ холоднымъ молокомъ, вмѣстѣ накого мѣлодъ алкогольнаго напитка.

Гигантская кошка — убійца агягятъ и барановъ

Фермеры, жители Вестморленда, гористой мѣстности въ Англіи, занимающаея главнымъ образомъ разведеніемъ овецъ, въ послѣднее время были обезпокоены таинственной гибелью своего скота. Не только агягты, но даже и взрослые овцы агягты, то дѣло становились жертвой какого-то неизвѣстнаго звѣря, наждавшего на нихъ по ночамъ.

Сперва предполагали, что убійцей овецъ является лиса, но убійца овецъ, когда звѣря удалось сыгнать и убить, выяснилось, что это была... гигантская кошка. Оне

видно, оставшись безъ козвѣвъ, она окончательно оцѣлила и стала проглатывать всѣхъ животныхъ, своимъ дикимъ предкомъ. Исключительно являются ея разбѣры — убитое животное достигаетъ длины 3 футовъ. Варшавскій корресп. „Дейли Экспрессъ“ сообщаетъ слѣдующую забавную исторію. Это было 25 лѣтъ назадъ. 19-лѣтній варшавскій еврей Оксенбергъ женился. Слуста нѣсколько мѣсяцевъ онъ былъ арестованъ и посаженъ въ тюрьму за кражу.

Во время революціи Оксенбергъ бѣжалъ изъ тюрьмы и скрылся. Жена погорѣвала, но затѣмъ примирилась съ положеніемъ, посвятивъ въ свои силы воспитанію сына, который былъ рожденъ въ тюрьмѣ и нѣтъ мужъ находился еще въ тюрьмѣ.

Дней десять назадъ эта женщина прочла въ польскихъ газетахъ сообщеніе о томъ, что мужъ ея — въ совѣтской Россіи и занимаетъ высшій постъ въ черноморскомъ

флотѣ. Изъ справкоу выяснилось, что Оксенбергъ въ измѣнѣ женился второй разъ и имѣетъ двухъ дѣтей. Жена немедленно написала своему бывшему мужу, чтобы тотъ далъ разводъ по закону. Но Оксенбергъ, въ качествѣ большевика и атѣста, отказался. Тогда ему было отправлено письмо варшавскаго раввина, въ которомъ было сказано, что если Оксенбергъ не дастъ мѣсяца развода по всѣмъ правиламъ Моисея закона, ни одинъ раввинъ не станетъ читать молитву на могилѣ его отца, когда тотъ умретъ.

На дняхъ отъ Оксенберга былъ полученъ отвѣтъ, что онъ ѣдетъ въ Москву для подачи московскому раввину прошенія о разводѣ.
