Sri Aurobindo Pathamandir is an institution at Calcutta - with the express object of 'making known to the public the ideal of future realisation as Sri Aurobindo foresees it' in a lucid and easy way. We have a comprehensive library containing all His writings and literature, and contribution on them by many that have studied His writings on varied - subjects of His philosophy, yoga, art, literature, poetry, sociology etc., and also some of the ancient scriptures of the Hindus and books of reference in Sanskrit, Bengali, English and other provicial languages in India.
