
MESSAGE ON THE OCCASION

ANNUAL REPORT

YEAR I—4—62 to 31—3—63

The Committee of Management presents with much pleasure the annual report of The Abalashrama for the period from 1-4-62 to 31-3-63. This Ashrama was founded in 1911 by the late Smt. and Sri. Venkatavarada Iyengar as a 'Home' for a few destitute women and children who were sheltered, fed and taught some needle work and some handicrafts as a means of occupation and livelihood for the future. Since a committee of management took over the affairs of the Institution in 1944, the strength and the activities have enlarged considerably.

OUR AIMS

1. To work for the amelioration of the educational, economic and social condition of women irrespective of caste or creed.
2. To give shelter and support to destitute women, girls and children.
3. To arrange for the training of women for suitable occupations and help them to earn an honest and honourable living, and
4. To promote all causes connected with the improvement of the lot of women and calculated to make them worthy members of Indian womanhood.

OUR ACTIVITIES

During the year under report the average monthly strength of the Ashrama was 33. We have helpless widows, destitute women, deserted wives and orphan girls. There are a couple of physically handicapped women who have been given shelter in order to help them. All the girls of school going age and some adults are sent to school for study. Fees of students who attend private schools are borne by the Institution while those going to Government schools study free of charge.

Tailoring, Embroidery and Knitting are taught to the inmates by a qualified teacher. These classes are popular and besides the inmates, outsiders are allowed to undergo training. There are 9 sewing machines.

Besides the above crafts, training in home-industries for cloth weaving and mat-making is given to the inmates. Bed-sheets, towels, bags and mats are produced. The training is given by the Departmental Instructors of the Office of the Director of Industries and Commerce. Apart from the above mentioned crafts, the inmates are trained in home-management, as they are allotted duties in cooking and other house-hold duties supervised by a resident warden. Articles of worship like "Hubathi", "Gajavasthra", sugar blocks for Sankaranthi, paper flowers, saffron powder packets etc. are prepared against orders and sold for a nominal profit.

Daily bhajans are conducted in the Ashrama in the mornings and evenings. Opportunities are provi-

ded to the inmates to take part in the programmes of the A. I. R. Now and then Bhagavadgeetha classes are conducted. The above are some of the steps taken to instil into them the spiritual and moral values in life.

A Committee is in charge of the Reading Room and Library which is being conducted in the premises for the benefit of the inmates and the women in the neighbourhood for which the Corporation is giving us a grant of Rs. 20/- per mensem. The following publications are being subscribed for :

Recreation for the boarders is provided by gardening and also games like chess, ring tennis etc.

During the year under report 30 persons were admitted and 17 persons left the Ashrama. Of these who left one got an employment in the Telephone Department, one married, another was employed as a primary school teacher and three persons joined the S. S. L. C. Condensed Course.

BUILDING CONSTRUCTION

An additional room adjacent to the bakery has been constructed for rental purposes.

MEETINGS

Eight meetings of the Central Committee and five of the Ladies' Committee were held during the year. The last General Body meeting was held on 30-5-62, when the new office bearers and members of the Central and Ladies' Working Committee were elected. The report and audited statements of accounts for the years 1960-61 and 61-62 were accepted and adopted unanimously.

The annual Deepavali celebration came off on 17-11-62 under the chairmanship of Sri V. S. Krishna Iyer, Mayor, Bangalore Corporation. Hon. Smt. Yasodamma Dasappa, Minister for Social Welfare, inaugurated the festivities by distributing sarees to the inmates. Both of them stressed the importance and essential need of social service especially among helpless and poor women. The variety entertainment by the inmates was successful and the celebration was rounded off by their humble contribution to the National Defence Fund of Rs. 50/-

The committee has much pleasure in placing on record their pleasure at the elevation of our Vice-President Smt. P. R. Jayalakshamma to the Deputy Mayorial Office of the Bangalore City Corporation. The Ashrama is indebted to her for the various services rendered by her.

The institution has secured the co-operation and help of many organisations, individuals in and around Bangalore, to whom our thanks are due. Our thanks for regular grants are due to

We are thankful to her also. We would be failing in our duty if we omit to mention the invaluable service rendered to the institution by Smt. Sundaramma by supervising the day to day working of the Institution and bestowing on it a parental affection. It is no exaggeration to say that Smts. P. R. Jayalakshamma and Sundaramma are the two pillars supporting the edifice of Abalashrama.

We would like to make an appeal for funds from the generous public and particularly the ladies of Basavanagudi and adjoining extensions in the shape of subscriptions, donations, endowments etc. as our income is hardly sufficient to meet our mounting expenditure in these hard times. Any help and suggestions to carry on this noble and charitable service to poor and unfortunate women will be greatly appreciated. It may not be out of place to mention here that ladies, must take prominent part in running

such institution for the uplift of helpless women and children

On behalf of this Institution we once again thank you all ladies and gentlemen for having graced the occasion with your encouraging presence to help us in the task of carrying on with our work in this field of social service.
