

Dear Professor Roerich:

We are sending herewith the manuscript for "Abode of Light", together with three Spanish translations for possible inclusion.

From the manuscript are still missing Numbers: 18 and 19, which must be copied, and will be sent to you on the next boat. Numbers 21, 22, and 25, have not been located by the Society. In regard to No. 25, Mr. Grebenstchikoff has not replied to numerous letters and telegrams requesting this article. The only other missing manuscript is No. 46, which was received with one page missing.

In regard to the last article--"Queen of Heaven"--we presume that the number is a typographical error and should be No. 54.

Except in cases of actual typographical mistakes, when there were differences between the original Russian and English sent to us, we referred to the English version.

The Society does not have other translations than these included, in any language, but should you desire, we could include in the "Abode of Light" your article from page 64 of the French Messenger, as translated by Mme. de Vaux-Phalipau.

We are also enclosing "Novgorod", in case you should wish to include it in the manuscript.


We have a complete duplicate set of this manuscript so that if it were found satisfactory, you could cable us to go ahead with printing.
