Art Association Will Hear Sina Lichtman

For the December meeting of the Plainfield Art Association to be held Tuesday evening, Dec. 14 at 8 p. m., in the Civic Center Room of the Plainfield Public Library, Miss Florence A. Stevens, chairman of the program committee, announces a talk by Sina Lichtman, vicepresident of Roerich Museum and Director and Trustee of the Master Institute of United Arts.

Mrs. Lichtman has been associated with Prof. Nicholas Roerich since the founding of the School of the Roerich Museum, 300 Riverside Drive, New York, and its affiliated institutions. She participated with him in the Central Asiatic Expedition for the five years from 1923 to 1928, traveling continuously through Mongolia, Tibet, across the Altai Mountains, and in India. She has lectured extensively for a number of years on various art topics, and her services are constantly in demand to address women's clubs and other

bodies.

The subject of her talk here is "Roerich and the Peace Banner."
