

Designed by Professor Nicholas Roerich for the Roerich Pact, to protect the treasures of art and science, and already endorsed by the International Museums' Office of the League of Nations.

This Banner is to be raised over all Cathedrals, Universities, Libraries, and Museums and other institutions of culture as a mark of their inviolability during war or peace. Its purpose is to spread the recognition of the great cultural treasures of earth as belonging not to one nation but to all humanity as a universal heritage.
