

UNDER MEMORANDUM OF ASSOCIATION.

- 1) The document is to be styled as "Memorandum of Association";
- 2) Name of the Society is to be mentioned;
- 3) Main objects of the society are to be in conformity with section 3 of the Mysore-Societies Registration Act, 1960;
- 4) The name, age, address and occupation of the Managing Committee members have to be furnished;
- 5) Place of the Society with full address is to be mentioned;
- 6) The Memorandum is to be signed by seven or more persons who are above the age of eighteen years as required under section 5of the said Act;
- 7) The Memorandum and Copy of Rules are to be dated;
- 8) The Memorandum shall be printed or typewritten and be divided into paragraphs numbered consecutively and be signed by each subscriber with full address, description, age and occupation etc.;
- 9) The name and address of one of the subscribers to the Memorandum authorised by the Society to whom any communication my may be sent by the Registrar;
- 10) Signature of a witness who is not a Managing Committee member with his full address, age and occupation is to be obtained to the Memorandum of Association;

UNDER RULES.

THE MYSORE SOCIETIES REGISTRATION ACT 17 OF 1960.

- Section 9: Alteration of memorandum of Association: (1) Whenever it shall appear to the governing body of any society registered under this Act which has been established for any particular purpose or purposes that it is advisable to alter, extend or abridge such purpose or for other purposes specified in section 3, the governing body may submit the proposition to the members of the society in a written or printed report, and may convene a sepcial general meeting for the consideration thereof according to the rules and regulations of the society. But no such proposition shall be deemed to have been approved unless suchreport has been delivered or sent by post to every member of the society twenty one days previous to the date of the special general meeting convened by the governing body for the consideration thereof, and unless such proposition shall have been agreed to by the votes cast in favour of the proposition by members who being entitled so to do, vote in person, or where proxies are allowed, by proxy, and such votes are not less than three times the number of the votes, if any, cast agaist the resolution by members so entitled and voting and confirmed by a similar majority of votes at a second special general meeting convened by the governing body after an interval of thirty days after the former meeting.
 - (2) Every c hange in the memorandum of association approved under sub-section (1) shall be filed with the Registrar within thirty days from the date of making thereof along with a fee of ten rupees and the Registrar may if he is satisfied and the change is in accordance with the provisions of this Act and the rules made thereunder register such change. Such change shall not have effect until it has been so registered.
 - (3) If the Registerar refuses to register a change in the Memorandum of association under sub-section (2) in appeal shall lie to the Mysore Revenue Appellate Tribunal within sixty days from the date of communication of his refusal to register the change. Every such appeal shall be accompanied by a fee of two rupees.

On or before the fourteenth day succeeding the day on which the annual general meeting of society is held, there shall obe filed with the Registrar a list of the names, addresses and occupations of the members of the governing body then entrusted with the management of the affairs of the society and a copy of the Balance Sheet and Income and Expenditure Account audited by a person who under Section 226 of the Companies Act, 1956 (Central Act 1 of 1956), can act as an auditor of companies registered in the State of the Mysore. A filing fee of one rupee shall be paid to the Registrar for the filing of the list and the balance sheet and Income and Expenditure Account.
