Lesson 1 Sarakha and His Blessed Arrow

(Method: Patanjali Sutra 17) (Used in each lesson)

- (1) Observation: Children make a list of what they see in the painting; 9 trees, mountains, valleys, snow, clouds, grass, branches, dead trees, man, Lama, red cap, arrow- etc.
- (2) Quality

 Relation of Sarakha and his arrow to me, the child.

 Story of his compassion and the fashioning of his thoughts into the swift arrow. Have I ever sent arrows, blessed or poison?
- (3) Meaning for me; the child:

 I grow still and look within, and see Sarakha
 fashioning his arrow for me because he loves me. Now
 he is sending it to me. This makes me happy.
- (4) Identification to the child:

 I am Sarakha. I fashion an arrow of my thoughts. I send the arrow. I see it as a ray of light. I send it to my Mother- to India- to a children's hospital-to Professor Roerich, to Madame Roerich.
- (All the children in unison, standing and with motions:

I send a blessed arrow to the East,
" " " North,
" " South,
" " West.

Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me.

(Pasting, cutting, drawing, writing in note books, following trip to the Museum.

Lesson 2-

Buddha the Conqueror

(4-fold method of Patanjali 17)

Story of Lord Buddha.

Trip to the Museum to study the Painting.

(4) Identification: I am Lord Buddha sending the light of happiness to the world. I meditate and grow very still.

Let the words of my mouth, and the meditations of my heart, be acceptable in THy sight, O Lord, my strength and my redeemer.

(Pasting, cutting, drawing, writing in note books.)

Lesson 3 Buddha the Testor

Story of his preaching to the fish, and turning all who heard Him gladly into gold-fish- the sorrowful Sword and Devil fish and the Snapping turtles who turn away and so miss the shining glory.

- (3) Meaning for me: I will be one of the gold fish and hurry toward Him to hear the teaching. He will turn me to shining gold. He is turning me now.
- (4) Identification: I am Lord Buddha, preaching to the fish. I carry the light in my heart and I turn them to gold.

(All the children in unison send the light about the world in the name of Lord Buddha.)

Lesson 4 Milarepa

Story of the Saint.

(4) Identification: I am Milarepa listening to the angels and singing a hymn of joy.

Hymn of David from the Psalms: Bless the Lord, O my soul; and all that is within me, bless His holy name.

Each child wrote a hymn:

Jean: Praise the Lord, all ye people, for the love and sunshine He has shown toward us.

I love the Lord for all the gifts and joys he has given to me.

David: A Thankful Heart
I am thankful for what God has given me.
God has given me two eyes to see beautiful things,
two ears to hear beautiful things;
two feet to walk to beautiful places to see beautiful things,
Master Institute of Roerich Museum.

Teddy: God is in everything. I praise God for all the things he did for me; food, shelter, two eyes, two ears, two feet, father, Mother.

Lesson 5 Jeanne d'Arc

(Lesson of obedience to the Heavenly Voices and of Courage)
Story of Jeanne d'Arc. Acting out of the story scene by scene.

(4) Identification: I am Jeanne d'Arc leading an army for Peace.

We gather all the children of the earth into a
great, triumphant army marching for peace. Jeanne d'Arc is
leading us on her great charger, with the banner about her.

Lesson 6

Moses

(1) Observation of painting.

Story of Moses

- (3) Meaning for me: I will be still and see him on Mount Sinai, receiving the Commandments of the Lord, with the curtain of glory about his head.
- (4) Identification: I am Moses, bringing the good law to the children of Israel- obedient to God, and expecting obedience from my children.

The ten commandments- How we obey them.
(Pasting, cutting, writing in note books.)

Lesson 7

Thoughts

Lesson on blackboard with colored chalks- auras, thought-forms-meaning of colors.

(Children write in note-books and illustrate with colored crayons-)
Blue- prayer and love sent to God - clouds and a lotus blossom
Red- anger- darting like lightening or explosive
Yellow- clear thinking- knowledge
Orange- ambition- (may be selfish or unselfish) hooked figure turning
Rose- love for Mother or friend
Green- may be sympathy or jealousyLavendar- self-sacrifice

(With spontaneous action, Jean wrote in her book:)

Jean is going to send lovely thoughts of love dressed in colors: blue, lovely green (not selfish green) of sympathy, gold, rose, lavendar.

Teddy wrote: Teddy is going to send these colors all over the world-blue, yellow, green and rose.

(Children make up stories illustrating various emotions and color them in note books.)

Lesson 8

Symbols for Numbers+1-10

Meaning of circle, dot, line, triangle, square, five pointed star, six pointed star, and combinations. A child's universe.

Lesson 9

Earth, Air, Water, Fire

.The elementals of each kingdom without and within a child-their effect on the Self- (A lesson given me directly by H.P.B.)

(Note: More than one class session is usually spent on each lesson)
