The Executive of the International Museums' Office held its second meeting on May 29, in Paris and on May 30, in Mons ( Belgium) M. Jules Destrée acted as Chairman of the meeting at which the following were present : Sir Cecil Harcourt Smith, inspector of H/M/ the King of England's Works of Art; MM. Dupierreux, Professor at the Higher Institute of the Fine Arts, Antwerp; R. Foundoukidis, Secretary of the International Museums Offic: M. von Schmieden represented the Secretariat of the League of Nations.
