For your information I enclose herewith a copy of the "Conclusions" voted by the Conference of Experts, convened at Rome by the League of Nations in October, 1930 (Annex III). You will notice that these conclusions support the opinion expounded in Professor Roerich's communication addressed to the Conference, and in which the Master pointed out the dangers inherent to the transportation of works of art. The text of the "Conclusions" has been forwarded to me by the International Institute of Intellectual Cooperation, but the official documents have not yet been published. They will probably be issued next month.
