Dear Friend:-

In continuation of its efforts for the world-wide adoption of the "Roerich Peace Pact" and "Banner of Peace", the Union Internationale pour le Pacte Roerich which held its first international conference at Bruges last September, is planning to assemble a most significant exhibition in Bruges, Belgium, from July to September next.

The Exhibition will comprise a comprehensive collection of the cultural achievements through the ages, through photographs and reproductions, of monuments, museums, libraries, cathedrals, churches, sculptures, paintings, schools of every country, with the purpose of demonstrating the great need for their protection against possible vandalism in times of war or peace.

By means of this visual display, it is hoped to bring about a greater comprehension of the vast loss that the possible destruction of these irreplaceable creations of the human spirit would mean to the world.

Our Belgian friends ask for our support in this undertaking and since we feel that this exhibition will contribute greatly to the understanding of the purposes of the Roerich Peace Pact and Banner of Peace, this Committee has undertaken to raise \$5000. towards the realization of the project.

We therefore ask your gracious and early cooperation in making contributions toward this Exhibition, in order to keep alive and growing this vital project of Professor Nicholas Roerich - the promotion of Culture as a means to "World Peace".

Any assistance, however small, will be gratefully received.
