Not only does your work aim toward the protection of art treasures, but it is accomplishing much toward ultimate world peace. I feel that every person with strong nationalistic tendencies should be forced to spend a period of time in another country. It would make little difference what country it might be, just so they were closely associated in their work with another nationality. That has been my experience and it has given me an international viewpoint that probably could never be developed in any other way. After one has made close friendships with people of another country he realizes the futility of the narrow nationalism that makes the work you are doing so great a necessity. While Peace Societies and Disarmament Conferences will probably help to spread the doctrine of Peace, your plan is the only practical one I have seen which aims toward the preservation of civilization even during a great conflict.
