

Publication of the Proceedings

The Chairman is gratified to report the publication of the Proceedings of the Third International Convention for the Roerich Pact and Banner of Peace, which he has made it his personal duty to compile.

Previous to the publication of the book, all possible preparations were made in advance for their distribution, and a typist engaged to assist in writing the letters of transmittal, and addressing of labels.

Two copies each of the Proceedings are being forwarded to the embassies of governments which participated in the Convention, with the request that one copy be forwarded to the respective governments. These letters were addressed personally to the actual Delegates or Observers present. In three instances where the Delegates are no longer in this country, an additional copy has been sent to them personally. For the mailing of these books special cartons were ordered, to contain two books each. Special reference was made in each letter to the page where name or address of Delegate would be found. Additional copies are being sent also to the other embassies, together with letter of transmittal. These embassies also received two copies each.

Copies of the book are also being sent to the Speakers at the Convention, Honorary Members, Contributors, Special Delegates, and those who sent endorsements or resolutions, as follows:

All letters contained special references to pages where either the name or the address of the person concerned, appears.
