Mr. Ballard Williams has requested us to send you some information regarding the Roerich Banner of Peace.

It has been our great privilege to cooperate in many ways with the Women's organizations of America. Only the other evening at our Seventh Anniversary celebration, Mrs. Spurburg, President of the New York State Federation of Women's Clubs, addressed our audience, and stated that her entire organization of four hundred thousand women are in full sympathy with the ideals of culture and education for which the Roerich Museum stands, and would support in every way the Roerich Banner of Peace, the project designed to protect treasures of art and science, and cultural Institutions in times of war or internal strife.
