Dear Dr. Hu:

In continuation of our conversation of the 4th inst. I write to express to you our sincere appreciation of your valuable assistance in our scientific work. We are glad to hear that Dr. Y/L. Keng of the Academia Sinica in Nanking has consented to accompany our Expedition to the Gobi. Needless to say that the cooperation of such a scholar as Dr. Keng will be of the greatest assistance. It is understood that his living and travelling expenses while in the field will be paid by the Expedition, and that in addition he is to keep a duplicate set of the botanical collection. It is our hope that Dr. Keng will be able to join the Expedition early in May.

I avail myself of your kind offer to assist in securing botanical equipment. Here is a list of items which will be necessary:-

Three portfolios with two sheets of millboard connected by tape to accommodate about 30 or 40 sheets of paper, kept in place by a strap/

about 80 klg. of drying paper.

six sheets of Chinese yellow waterproof cloth.

fifty canvas bags for specimens of soil and rocks.

300 strong paper envelopes for seeds.

One geological hammer.

Dear Dr. Hu,

From a recent Peiping paper I see that you have delayed your proposed trip to Europe and are still in Peiping. I therefore hasten to inquire about Dr. Keng and Mr. Li who were supposed to join our Expedition beginning July. Up to now we had no news from them, but are awaiting their arrival. Mr. Li's month's salary was to begin July 1st, 1935, as agreed, but so far we had no intimation from him as to his immediate intentions. Please inquire and let us know as soon as possible. In case Dr. Keng or Mr. Li will be unable to join the Expedition, we hope they will be able to find a substitute with good qualifications, able to join the Expedition at once. It is for them to reach the Expedition: they should travel by rail to Kuei-hua in Sui-yuan, and from there by bus to Pai-ling miao, where Rev. Gunzell, of the American Scandinavian Mission will receive them, and direct them to our present camp. It is understood that the student-collector whether Mr. Li or some one else, is to receive M\$ 80/- per month, board while in the field with the Expedition, and travelling expenses.
