Dear Dr. Roerich:-

I had better drop you a line or two and enclose the two telegrams which came for you. I have wired them on to you already so that you should have them when you arrive at Peiping.

The matter about the sheep I am not just so sure what to do about them. I have a few sheep and they will be plenty for my needs. However if I attempted to sell them I am sure that if I got \$5 a piece for them I would be doing well. In buying those sheep for myself I would have to take the money out of my pocket and I do not feel that I can quite afford to do that in the light of the fact that I am doing some of this fixing up and moving around here. I sort of have to watch my money a bit. However the two telegrams have come to a little over \$15 so that if another comes I will have paid out what the sheep are worth. However I will wait a short while and see just how things turn out and then if there is money over for you I will send it on. I promise to take care of the matter and let you know.

I may be going over with Maxer in the morning. He wants me very much to come to his wedding and I would like to go for more reasons than one. Still right now I am very much tied down with work as well as pressed for time.
