AMERICAN MUNITIONS CONTROL BOARD WILL MEET NEXT TUESDAY

Washington, Sept. 19.—Secretary of State Cordell S. Hull today called the National Munitions Control Board to a meeting set for next Tuesday.

The board comprises besides Secretary of State Cordell Hull, Secretary of War, George H. Dern; Secretary of the Navy, Claude A. Swanson; Secretary of Commerce, Daniel C. Roper, and Secretary of the Treasury, Henry Morgenthau, Jr. The meeting is apparently being called to formulate procedure in accordance with the neutrality law requiring the registration of all munitions manufacturers. Under the new law, manufacturers and exporters are further required to obtain the Control Board's authorization before exporting any war material.
