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Badmaev, Piotr Alexandrovich (1856-1919), a Buriyat by origin studied and practised Tibetan medicine; took an interest in politics. Graduated from the University of St. Petersburg, faculty of Oriental Languages. On completion of his studies at the University, entered the Asiatic Department of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs. Badmaev's activity in 1888-1894 was connected with Russian policy in the Far East. In the nineties of the last century he edited in Chita a newspaper entitled "Life of the Eastern frontier region" in Russian and Buriyat languages. The paper published numerous articles on the economy and culture of the peoples of the Far East (China, Mongolia, Tibet).

P.A. Badmaev studied Tibetan medicine under his brother A.A. Badmaev and Buriyat medical lamas and became well known as a practitioner. During his student days at the University, P.A. Badmaev attended lectures at the Medical Academy at St. Petersburg. A knowledge of Mongol and Tibetan languages enabled Badmaev to translate into Russian the main text-book on Tibetan medicine *ᠷ Gyud-bzhi* in which he tried to compare Tibetan medical science with western medicine.

Badmaev was known as a practitioner at St. Petersburg. In 1875 his dispensary in St. Petersburg was visited by 163 patients, in 1897 was visited by 10,844 patients.
