Aug 8

Received copy of letter of Foreign Office definitely denying Times' statement that Communist Party decided the India office from granting visas to Prof R. Wall speak to Coulter about it. Newspapers are ~~not~~ totally unreliable.

The unhappiness of others is the joy of an Newspaper Editor. Spoke to Mr. Buckell and the James of Times they assured me they would not mix us up anymore with politics. Could see, that this entire Times statement was fixed up by them. Although they were warned of the responsibility and consequences of issuing this statement just the same they don't care. A good article appeared in the Times about Polish Pact. Very dignified. Too bad that Associated Press interview with Father did not come out so good. We wanted to counteract the Soviet article. Instead appeared again a news item that on account of Soviet demands visa was refused. Best plan at times 'Mrs. Carry' Next here continues. The Metropolitan cabled to the Archbishop of Canterbury. Summer season at Moriah closes this season. There were only 9 students. Tremendously worried about Mad. Polrichy.

Aug 9 and 10 Moriah

Mariah a dear! Speaks more. Is extremely sensitive. Received cable from Naggar for State Dept speaking of Mother's critical condition. We try to help.

Aug 11 1930

In route in train to Washington to see Mr. Castle of State Department. Planning out what and how to present my appeal. He wishes to choose the best. So many roads, so many detours. Only one's inner voice can help and constantly appealing to the Lords for proper guidance. The time is serious. Nice cable Victor Olaya of Colombia thanking for my good wishes for his inauguration. Mr. Pellin Consul General of Chile cabling his Foreign Minister in Santiago to assist with visas. Morris went to Metropolitan to help ~~to~~ asking him to personally appeal to Pres. Hoover. What a disgrace in an enlightened era - the Spanish inquisition was child play. Mr. Castle mentioned he heard Mad. G. was well bringing him Ganga's and Torrona's letters. My Times had a fine editorial about Banner of Peace strange newspaper!

Aug 12 Washington

Saw Mr. Cook early in the morning who advised me that letter of Prof. R. for the President was delivered to his Secretary Mr. Newton with the assurance he would personally deliver it to the President. Saw Mr. Castle after planning carefully what to say to him. Showed him Ganga Torrona's letters. Not necessary for me to read these letters as I fully believe Mad. Perich is ill. He said he got to

the British Ambassador Washington and told
 him of Mr. Pouch's illness. I appealed to
 him to cable again to London. He replied
 "yesterday he cabled London after receiving
 Lyons's and Praon's cable. We have
 done everything possible. ^(We did not ask for visas) We have demanded
 passports for Levin's. Only other
 thing we can do is to declare war!"
 He hinted not touch the President
 regarding his letter stating Bi-hated
 American culture influence. He replied
 "They are permitting Barker Kallch to
 work."

Mr Cook advised me, that it an
 unprecedented case for America
 that in 10 years never did America
 intervene for a man who ^{was} not
 a citizen. Cook also cabled to Trager
 and Atherton -

Mr. Cook in giving the letter to
 Mr. Newton gave additional data which
 was wholly unnecessary saying that
 State Dept had only taken a passive
 interest in this case. This is not true
 Mr. Castle has been active. Had Mr
 Cook correct this with Mr. Newton
 deeply grieved at our Mother's condition
 and we know how Father grieves
 at this unwarranted delay, enclosing
 copy of a letter from Moravian University!

August 16

Read in Agni Yoga "When the step is firm the counter forces are beneficial". Someone depressed by circumstances, be assured that he walked unflinching and at an encounter his consciousness became obscured. - This is so true. Whenever I performed an action with some hesitation or doubt of its success, the counter action was also somewhat veiled and hazy and often not successful. When I walked in full confidence of an action the results were strong. Best lesson learned!

Visited "The Elcott" really they have a fine Manager and in Restaurant one feels real cooperation. Lunched Sydney and myself. Lilled the ^{Mr. Harry Korber} Manager, Congressman Bloom's family came - their rooms were not ready although 60 days ago arranged for. Had to quickly place ^{own} Bed covers etc into their Rooms. - About 8 Rooms rented last few days. -

August 17 and 18

It is plainly seen that the greatest economy has to be practiced in our institution on account of the poor Renting Season. We are far behind in our income in the Hotel. We can do without some Secretaries. Really I know so many places where money can be saved. We will turn this difficulty into a great final success. A new membership will come to our Circle. We will now fight to receive subscriptions instead of helpfully asking for them.

Aug 18

Wish our dear Mother would express her feelings what she expects to happen next year in America. Already we notice difficult times what will occur in regard to our Income in the coming year? We know the great economy which we will have to practice. How to attract new capital? How to reach the out of town possibilities? Any thought by our Mother would be so useful for us.

Aug 19

At our Trustees meeting announced the need of immediate economy. Mrs. Schapiro responded splendidly. She always fight against any new definite move. It takes time to sink in.

Aug 20

Again rented 6 Rooms and at good prices. Today question arose about Junior Art Center and the ^{new} teacher. I remarked, well Mrs. R. gave all the indications about the new way it shall be conducted. Rodna said she wrote Father about it. I remarked to ~~her~~ her indications from Mother or Father are both of equal importance. Why if Mother advised what should be done that sufficient, no need always writing to Father. ^{to verify} This upset Rodna. ^{greatly} she stated ^{Also no doubt} ^{nettle} ^{presented} ^{it not cruelly} ^{news from} ^{Naggar are doubtful to her} I was said that Manager of Ocell was satisfactory and to discharge Mr. Fall Oct 1st. This help is as usual so kindly. The service has become worse and worse. Thinking how to economize. Also how to reach Mr. Newton to beg for his help.

Aug 22

Rejoiced at Porome's letter - she writes so beautiful and earnestly. The details of the trip and living conditions at Lahoul excellently described by Agnes. Wonderful privilege

given by the Lord to Gjens and Poooms to be able to speak. We receive so much! Thinking how to help with visas. Much in the papers about Bolchen pilot of the Byrd North Pole expedition - similar case to Swetic's case. ~~Also~~ Tried 5 times to get Mr Newlon the President Secretary but did not reach him.

Aug 22
Spoke to Mr. Cook and he will again appeal to Mr Newlon in behalf of M. J. R. Saw Mr Korber manager of the Cleo. A nice man has also nice wife. He is considering the offer. Offered him \$2000. - 2 year contract. He asked for \$10000. - Well we will know in a few days. -

Aug 23 Morich
What a joy to see our Thomas - looks wonderful. Now says "Wait a minute" "Let the rain" has a sense of humor - One year and half old and seems to understand everything. Now weighs $27\frac{3}{4}$.

Always it seems, that when ready to perform a certain important action and it comes to the execution 2 final ways present themselves. Which one to take? Now I strain every effort to find the correct way and ask the Lord to help -

Decided not to let my Mother as well as Sister live at our Hotel - they would be too gossipy and cause difficulties.

Aug 24

Rodna now trying to change Junior Art Center
 Rodna gets terribly excited at times if one
 does not agree with her, but if one holds
 one's ground slowly 2 days later she changes.
 Her technique is so interesting for instance
 if you tell her this is a false person,
 eventually she will find some way or
 excuse for calling that person up and
 meeting that person. If someone here has
 a class in Agni Yoga at once she begins
 one too. Tremendous energy. -

Aug 25

Busy preparing Contract with new manager
 Really a fine man and has a rather
 spiritual wife. The present Hotel is one
 of the finest and he is there for almost
 16 years. Thinking always of Our Beloved
 Mother! How you are suffering! Oh how I
 wish we could do more for you
 Lucking continues his attention to Miss Tambore

Aug 26

Renting slow last 2 days. Tonight after
 a worrysome time Mr. Kaeper signed
 his 3 year Contract. How we need a
 real Manager! He is a 'cusitive man
 Before signing Contract he spoke to his
 Employer who threatened him and offered
 him twice the salary, which we offer
 His attorney advised him to go with us
 just the same. Again The Lord helped!

Aug 27

Today Lina realized that my talk about Economy was not so silly. Students also talk that they wish lower tuition fees. Also ^{see} now guests proudly about the new and broader Junior Art Center - One tiny word from my Beloved Mother is the greatest joy and happiness to me - others stupidly doubt -

Took the train for Washington to present the Mutilated card to Mr Castle, and to appeal again to him. Nettie's letter just received will be most useful. It pointed out so well America's possibilities! Which I shall mention in a powerful way. On the whole trip thought out how to present everything. With all my spirit realize the importance of the present time. Arrived evening at Washington ~~at 8~~ and met Mr Bloom and the American Minister to Siam.

Aug 28

Mr. Castle was away so will remain until tomorrow morning. Had lunch with Mr. Bloom and Mr. Kaufman - spoke of many points of Diplomatic Life.

Aug 29 Mr. Castle neither Mr. Biggs could see me so returned home, leaving a letter there. Evening Flavin returned looking the picture of health. He greatly enjoyed being new again.

Aug 30

Doctor Kugelmass found Flavius greatly improved. Thought he was fine - his bones stronger complexion, eyes, etc. - insists that he cannot be taken out - only on the Balconies. His body to be massaged dailey. My mother came and he said to her "We must continue isolation because he is so different from other children. He is ^{so} sensitive to everything. No kissing, ^{also} hands to be washed before seeing him and no one can go into his Sleeping Room. As you know we bring something besides our personality we bring germs etc etc. - In my hospital, we keep Chicken Hearts alive for months by creating the proper Surroundings, so if this possible with Chicken Hearts, you can imagine what can be done with Children. You can glimpse at him now and then" - Also suggested to Marie to teach him more words and how to play by himself. -

Complaints continue to pour in about Hell - soon he will be no more -

Aug 31st Today had a talk with Mrs. Schapran about her case in the Museum and through it we began to speak about Unity and Harmony. She said she strongly feels the need of it how badly she feels that Mod R. was not pleased with her regarding her trouble with the woman in the Museum. She said that while Father was here there was no Unity Sina and

Frances were fighting with each other
 all the time. They could not get along!
 Now with Father away what will it be!
 You Logan have been chosen as the
 Hand of Tuzuma I look to you to
 help ~~me~~ to bring Harmony. Prof. R.
 always acted like a Father to us all,
 please act the same to us." -

Her confession about her own Daughter
 was surprising. Mrs. S. also felt that
 Sina had a wrong attitude towards Our
 Mother Personally did not speak at all
 not a word about Sina, only listened
 to her and assured her to our only too
 anxious to help everyone in every possible
 way etc. Mrs. S. can't - let us judge by results!

Mrs. Schapan has never forgotten, that
 when the trouble occurred to her in the
 Museum, Sina Morris, Sweetig spoke very
 sincerely to her and I did not I helped
 her I cheered her up and was her friend.
 Since that occasion she cannot do enough
 for me.

Sweetig's picture of Rambuova is a Marvel.
 He is constantly in her Company. Renting
 is better. Happy to hear South American Countries
 are also intervening. -

Sept 2

Took Mr Bloom's family to theatre and supper - a useful man apparently well liked in Washington concerned about new Manager because laws are strange. The contract is his protection, but not ours.

Sept 3

Will soon Porcousa will be here again! Miss Clark came - very spiritual person! I wonder if "Agri Yaga" can be sold, because different Book concerns are inquiring. Flavinus getting 8 teeth at once really she is a dear Frances doing good work in South America. At present she is at Bogota Colombia Mrs Ketterer came - she placed a fine article in a Finnish Paper - she is also organizing Finnish Society of the Museum. Mr Schraak came saying "As long as the new message will be given under the Banner of Beauty, we Artists have a great Mission to perform why should there not be also a Society of Artists among the Societies of the Finnish Museum? Will have him meet on Sunday Mr Habo. Evening at Sidney's home met our new Manager ^{and wife} and wife really he seems to be the ideal man for our place. The present employers are trying everything to hold him offering him double the salary that we are offering, but he states his sword in his hand. His name is Henry Koerber.

Sept 4 Supper with Mammie Strauss. Wants to send petitions throughout America & Europe — stressing M.P.'s health and the many nations that have intervened — He has splendid connections in Washington. Regrets his original thought was not adapted by us, namely "Peace through Art" — to have committees in various cities. Ghana's just letter came about attitude of America towards it — non payment on time of the Hooper's salary. Redna at once wanted to write Father about it. She was upset again "The King can do no wrong". — Advised her, instead of looking for constant excuses to write Our Mother "we have been wrong, but from now on everything will be done as Our Mother wishes things done". —

Sept 5

Today Sina said "George is the Director of Muswadi and not I, I am only like a supervisor" — (like a Chameleon each day ^{shows} another color) Since the mistake occurred Muswadi does not apparently look so appealing ^{to Sina} Mrs. Koepfer wife of the ^{new} Manager was here — she loved the Museum —

Sept 6

Today was twice irritated — irritation not easy to conquer — Sina kept folders of British French Columbian etc in the school files. I asked her please to turn them over to the

Society of Friends where they really belong. It was some job to get them and then she wants them back again - because "I and Miss Such organized the British Association" - Everything with her is "I" did this, etc. ^{or quoting Prof. R.} ~~there~~

Daughter of Captain Sapicovoli is here. Unfortunately she arrived ill. Doctor told her she had Gall Stones. She looks so pale. Has one desire in life and that is to see her Mother -

Renting has much improved due to ^{some} lowering of Rents and advertising.

At present \$40,000 behind last year but it seems this will be made up.

It will be a great shock to Mr. Hall! Modra cabled President Olaya Colombia just intervened! The English people are treated with such courtesy here, all doors are open to them, that their lack of even common humanitarian understanding is unbelievable -

We are sending you again weekly reports of all Institutions.

Received cable from Nettie. I doubt if we can find words to thank our Mother for the love and care that she has shown to Parsons during her stay at Naggar and Lahoul! We hope our lives to show our appreciation. Forever her kindness will remain in my heart.

Sept 7.8

Working on the Petitions for Father notified that Australian Art Exhibition for January 1931, has been accepted. This will be under Government patronage and will be the first representative Australian Exhibition in the U.S.A. This exhibition will after its official opening in New York in January 1931 will be shown in other leading cities of the U.S.A. A special list of patrons and patronesses will be chosen from leading Australians, Englishmen and Americans. It is expected that besides Henry Gook, Commissioner General of Australia who has already accepted, that Sir Ronald Lindsay, British Ambassador will also be one of the patrons. Why we who are striving to bring England and U.S.A. closer together culturally why Prof. R. who is the founder of our institution and who personally is making this cooperation possible, should not receive a visa is beyond human comprehension -

at the feet of the Director of the Museum
at New York City. ^{He shifted on other matters}

Sept 9

met new Manager and discussed future plans.
Today we are \$34,000 short of former income,
but still 20 good Renting days before us. -

Today we let Miss Adams in charge of the
Theatre go. - Saw Suetig's new portrait
which he is painting really it is so
beautiful it is simply wonderful.
Never ~~can~~ I forget his sensitive
cooperation. He has helped me so much.
It is the greatest privilege and constant
joy to be with him. Always when I
look at him I behold Our Great
Father ^{enjoying studying} ^{Teaching of the Temple}

Received cable today from Porooma
"Arrived fine Bombay Roads repaired
last moment love to bell Kissing Baby"
It gave us great joy! Her trip was a
great gift of Our Lord. -

Ms. Chester Hale mentioned that she received
such a splendid letter from Porooma. Ms. Hale
has been a real friend - protected Father in high
Society and Art Circles and helped in other ways.
We are sending you again weekly reports of all
Institutions. For a time we felt best not to send you
these reports, but it was always distinctly understood that
regular business letters should be sent. Forgetting sending of

Sept 12

Early this morning met Mr. Cook
- a useful man. Then saw Mr. Castle
showed him Yenta's cable and
the Wedgewood Benn's letter saying
"Mad P. ^(is) not so seriously ill" and she
has recently started on a tour in the
Himalayas" - this letter Mr. Mundy
gave us. Mr. Castle said he would
at once cable to the Foreign office
London to again ^(to) intervene in the
name of humanity. -

Sua told me today that I act differently

Trustees should have handled these young men
- both sailed same day for London -

Took auto with Sina & Mrs. Schi to Trenchen's

Sept 15

Eg. xp. 40, A. 22

Saw Mr Cheney of the "Church and Drama League" by Tuesday we know if they will rent the Theatre - Mr. Toll advised me that he will leave January 1st, the date when his Contract is up. He stated Mrs. Schapran yelled at him in such a way that he could not remain longer. Mrs. Schapran told the Assistant of the Secretary in Coon a Mundi that he gets 10% Commission. Nothing she had no right to do - but it was easily fixed up.

Really there is so much important work to be done to talk about these matters. Sina is upset, because Sweetie wishes to live his own life. Sweetie wishes his own friends and really he is making plenty of new friends for us. If Sina is not invited Sina is angry. Exactly the same with me. On the other hand we never interfere in the school nor with any of her friends - really we are happy she has her own friends. - Again an Editor's Letter in "The Times" - Mr Mundy answered it interesting to see if they publish it. Mr Castle complained of American newspapers - they are so unscrupulous. There is great activity in all departments of the Institution. What a pity all this time lost waiting for the visit. We all are worrying greatly about Mother.

Sept 16

Entertained Mr Bloom wife and daughter for
supper offered 57 remaining "Sunday" for
\$10. each which will buy Renting has been
excellent despite difficult times. — ~~————~~
Giving concessions helped greatly. —

Sept 17

Saw Congressman Bloom and went over the
Petitions with him. — saw Mr. Keeyer he
will join the Hotel on October 1st —
we all feel happy about it —

Flavins looking at the sky said (there
were some lovely clouds in the sky) &
"Bow Bow" — meaning he saw a dog and
the other day he saw a Rooster Two
days ago. He pointed with his finger
and said "Mama" —

Am very fond of the book from
Helenon Teaching of the Temple —
To study the Teaching of Our Lord daily is
the greatest joy!

Sept 18

Renting income not above last year
The ¹²remarkable considering the bad times.

Sept 19

Flavins has a cold - nose running and
coughing. Well let us hope it will not be
as bad as usual. Stocks went lower on
reports of a revolution in Germany.
Today Mr. Trabold came to the Museum with
a friend - sometimes it is good to leave
people alone when we used to visit them, ^{they would} not come

Sept 20

Flavins cold continues fever lower, but apparently cold went to his chest Met new Manager who believes best to discharge Hall on the 25th. - Evening meeting of Young Idealist Club - very fine group of young people

Sept 21

This morning an Asthmatic attack began. Gave him 4 injections of Adrenalin. He improved, but the whole night was real sick. At midnight he was put into a tent of Dr. H. H. Doctor was 4 times at our house. During the night staying from 10 to 23. Was greatly concerned about the boy.

Sept 22

This morning like during the night Flavins cried all the time. The Asthma attack continued without signs of diminishing so called in Doctor Bartlett. He came and felt this attack not as severe as the last one and also it would not be Pneumonia. Towards afternoon Flavins began to breathe easier and fever went lower. Will never forget Marie being up 4 nights without any sleep - she understands true devotion. The Lord helps - His hand is always stretched out.

Sept 23

Doctor Found Flavin greatly improved
 Temperature 99.6, and the Asthma had
 disappeared being Bronchitis. -
 Letter from McCook with copy of letter
 which Secretary of Labor Harris had sent
 to the Secretary for India Wedgewood
 Benn -

On the evening Doctor came advised him
 that Marie had told me the Baby
 did not receive Mustard Plaster
 as often as the Doctor wanted it
 given, that the Nurse had forgotten
 it. Doctor Kugelmann gave it to the
 Nurse good and hard. Cannot find
 enough good words for this fine
 soul. -

Sept 24

Cable from Father, that he changed
 ticket of Nettie from Manhattan to
 Majestic to gain 2 days. Baby was
 fair today. Fever about 100.5, but
 still full of Flavin. A pity to see this
 little boy sick. - The doctor went
 with me to the 18th floor to look
 at our large Balcony. He saw that
 it is too windy there and advised
 having it enclosed with glass.

Sept 25th Baby this morning about the same
 during the night was delirious, so Miss Rennie
 called up Doctor and all Medicines were

stopped. Then he began to improve. Seems that some of the drugs used on him were not pure - there's a Lojacono and Marie had some indications about it. Doctor felt still some them in the Bronchial tubes. Towards afternoon the Fever went to 98° and we were so relieved. Had a good night.

During the morning discharged Mr. Joll. Just he resented our discharging him on such quick notice. Advised him he himself resigned previously as of Jan'y 1st 80. It is only matter of 3 months earlier. Happy he is gone, here a new Era will enter our Building. Hoche Kettner returned from Europe - met Father's said he looked fine. New Branches of the Society of Friends will soon be opened in Switzerland, Vienna etc.

Rejoice at Mr. Romanova's idea of "Union of Woman" with branches all over the World! Wonderful thing. These petitions for help for Mr. Roerich will be a great thing. Happy M. R. will be Honorary President - Felt our Mother very near Flavia during his present illness - Miss Lojacono felt it also.

Sept 26

Flavius temperature remained around 98 1/2. Was very lively. In fact the Ephredine kept him from going to sleep until 11 o'clock. Mrs. Renee does not like Ephredine. Mr. Bolger came at 10³⁰ in the Morning and stated that he resigns. I took everything in my power to hold him until ~~somehow~~ - a fine personality(?) -

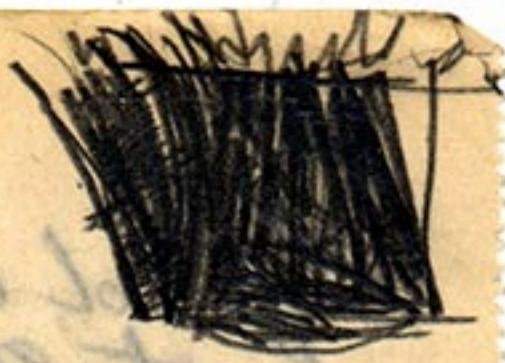

Lecture said Prof R by his deep insight in the Past has eliminated Time and now he has eliminated Space. Also feels interplanetary power of Father. Most people have compartments in their brain with Prof R it's a constant stream of Creation. He related when Prof R only 9 years old was called "Maverick Professor" - when arriving at New York Barton always said "Thank you ad Gorge asked" do people always say thank you in advance in America? Prof R said "No, this is only Optimism" - Now Prof R felt the spirit of America spoke of the uniqueness of the French Museum nothing like it any the World. Related how beautifully Prof R acted about the

loss of the 125 Paintings at the St Louis
 fair and how badly Repin acted
 How Prof R. refused being made Court
 Chamberlain at the Court of the Exar
 by saying "Imagine a Court Chamberlain
 with an exhibition of Paintings?"
 How with Prof R. the word Negation
 does not exist. Agnes stated how
 Reich Museum cannot be compared
 and its gestures and future
 Contributions -

Poor Flavius Cried through the whole
 night - again Asthma. Nettie saw

Oct 26

Flavius's Asthma much milder than on
 previous attacks. Nettie after much persuasion
 convinced Doctor Hamburger that he
 could not be the Doctor for Flavius
 but what we wanted was, that

 doctor. He believes in the help from
 Nature and only the use of drugs
 when absolutely needed. - Nettie told
 Bartlett to guide the health of Flavius,

Oct 27.

Beautiful letter from Sister Ojana, what a pure soul she is! The Roy of Our Lord helped ~~the~~ Flavius so much. The Asthma was so much milder. Nettie gave the boy very little medicine in comparison to Kugelmann who poured Medicine down his throat. Keskar holds special Meditation daily at 12 o'clock with a group of his pupils of which 2 Minutes devoted to Med. Polish and 2 Minutes to Flavius.

Oct 28

Ojana's letter we sent to Castle.

Oct 29

My Cook sent a letter to the Secretary of Lloyd George. Many people asking for Reductions in Rents. Flavius letter. What a blessing not to have Mrs. Schifano at meetings. She told some tenants, that she is ^{always} the head of the Institution. Sina is still quite cocky and one does not feel humility or any modesty. At least Modia is so much more intelligent. ~~See~~ The first meeting of the Society of Friends took place and for the first time Rambova Mundy Stokes attended the meeting. Fleischer was also present. Nettie won the respect and Admiration of all by her splendid Chairmanship. All complimented her. Mundy asked many questions and he wished to know in rather

inquisitive way the purpose of the Organization
 Nettie answered beautifully and he
 was completely won over. Nettie asked
 everyone personally for suggestions and
 encouraged all. Thersifer also asked
 also quite a number of questions and
 he was pleased. Many good resolutions
 were passed. A creative joyous meeting
 and I feel our Mother would have
 been highly pleased seeing how
 fine her daughter girded in her
 part as the New President of the
 Society. -

Mr Earl J Schraak wishes to form

I made the welcoming speech and ^{they} seemed well pleased. It was the first time, that I did not let someone write the speech for me, but really spoke my own words. Told her lack of tolerance of one Trustee reflects on all Trustees. ~~Oh~~ First Sina was excited, but then she accepted it nicely but told me it was simply impossible for her to tell this to Mrs. Schapen but begged me to tell her personally. Sina stated she has so many fights with her Mother. I told her I did not know this.

Nov 4

Kestars lectures continue to be most successful. Will also speak for the Mocha Bhodi Society. Mrs. Helen will be secretary of that Society. Bloom is reelected. - The country went strongly democratic showing a strong rebuke to the present administration.

Nov 5

Linn with Suetro - he offered to give \$100. - towards publishing first Book of "Banner of Peace". - Mrs. Helen Taylor now Secretary in the Society. - A leak in the Auditorium ceiling - much trouble. Many people begging for jobs - conditions getting worse. So anxious to join Suetro's Masonic Society despite Suetro's warnings against it, that she went behind his back and made application to join though someone she Suetro found out and she discovered that she would be blackballed if she tried to join. Suetro finally talked her out of it. Suetro coming closer to Nettie and myself - he is getting tired of his present friends. He is a Worling Boy.

Nov 6 Saw Hughes asking him to tell Doctor Berlett to take care of Florius. It was not easy, but he promised to do it. - Mrs. Ensor of "New Era" Magazine comes will publish Article of Prof Roerich in 17 languages.

No 7

Spoke to Kestav did he have any other approach to the Prince of Wales? He said no, but he sends him spirited thoughts. Kestav is a fine teacher, but his statements must be taken with great caution - they are not based on actual facts.

Yesterday was at Annie's Dinner. Castle spoke beautifully about Younger generation and the only way of overcoming the present day ills is hard work.

No 10

Spoke to Mr. Castle he promised to cable London requesting you being present at Consultation of H. Octob. - What an upliftment to read the "New Era"!
 Early in the morning I read a few pages and pondered over ~~it~~ each line. The Teachings are ^{the} wine of Life. (12.11.14)
 Today received An Mothers great letter. An Inforgettable Day! Yes, I feel this great responsibility placed on me by The Teachers! Also how My Mother is trying to help and strengthen me for this great work! How I need Her Help every moment of the day

Received cable that Rozina was refused admission to India. This doctor carries instruction from Howard Lepeyre Paris for Mad. Roerich's heart to test Mad. Roerich's heart. Hoyley the Standard of the British Government falls on a lower step. We are calling on all Cultural and Scientific Institutions of America to unite and to demand Justice.

Kellogg gave the money today for publishing Agni Yogan. Mundy will advise me tomorrow regarding his going to Europe. This will be most successful - we need a man there to present our case.

Nov 15

Saw Mrs. Kahn (Walt) to ask her assistance for securing visa and she replied she knew all about it. Was very friendly and promised to advise me if she would help us. Mr. Brock, Commissioner General of Australia was shocked to hear about British ~~and~~ attitude he promised to speak to British Ambassador. Everyone is incensed at the stupid attitude of England.

Mr. Mundy agreed to sail Friday Mayestic to London for us. Really it was very good of him to do it, because he is really busy. His visit will be most valuable for us. Mundy is a real hero and a bold man. I wish 5000 women could be added to Wedgewood Bennie.

Preparing for Mundy's trip, Spencer Lewis wants pictures loaned for Rosecrans Center in California. The Rosecrans had the first Museum in 1694 in America.

Nettie told Sina about speaking to her Mother not to be so apparent during lectures and recitals. Mrs. S. wished to be as usual the whole show - her loud voice and accent does great harm to any refined person visiting the Museum.

Sina replied "No she can't speak to her Mother as her Mother resents her so much and would like Nettie to speak to her." Still the same Sina shifting at all occasions - just like O'Connell used to have to hold Mrs. Schafan's head and hand - Sina would not do it - Sina and Mrs. Schafan are so shocked when pointed out, that they make a mistake. Women Clubs with Memberships of 500.00. are very indignant at the treatment received by the British Government and are ready to help by coming in touch with the various officials in England. Sina bitterly objected telling her Mother that people are objecting the way she handles guards in the Museum also the uncultured manner in which she addresses people - Sina said if I tell my mother it will kill her. Nettie replied "you want me to tell her and to kill her"? Later in the evening Sina said she has reconsidered and she will speak to her Mother telling her she needs rest to develop herself spiritually. That her stopping these old duties, it really means an advancement for her.

Nov 25

Saw Mr Priest Metropolitan Museum — ^{he} was most sympathetic — mentioned he also had trouble with ~~the~~ securing visas from Great Britain and only finally received them reluctantly, but felt his conservative Museum would sympathize with us. ^{the museum} ~~he~~ ^{he said} never acts for anything or anybody. — Nettie met Mr. W. H. Kahn at the Heretics, she mentioned she spoke to Mr. Kahn about it. Mr. Kahn said they heard something about Communism (British work). Nettie powerfully spoke to her — we all also writing a letter

Nov 26

Stokes came proposed Malcolm Schloss to take care of our Library, which he felt could be a great Center for making new friends. It is true, that at present our Library is not properly taken care of; Schloss who has a world of experience having had his own Book Store would build it up without any Salary. Now help comes from new sides. - Now Mamie Strauss he still feels a great Campaign "Peace through the Arts" is its slogan to raise a Million Dollars should be begun. He is willing to work for nothing. He feels the whole sympathy of the world is with us at this moment, on account of the non granting of visas and full advantage should be taken of the situation. He feels ⁱⁿ out of town cities women do not know enough to talk intelligent about Russia, but "Peace through the Arts" they can all talk about that. He further added, when America was prosperous the Americans felt they were Gods themselves, but now Americans are gasping for some new God to pray to and now is the time for your institutions to take full advantage of this remarkable opportunity - The French Association since was glorified

Personally liked Strauss's ideas.

Many Consul Generals were present. Monsieur Mogendie French Consul General spoke beautifully about Roerich especially Roerich's visit to President Bloumerglie. Consul Generals of Egypt, Panama, Jugo Slavia, Brazil and others were present. Roerich's cable from Pondichery aroused great enthusiasm.

Thinking, thinking how to raise funds. Today new white nurse came for Slavins. Seems to be friendly girl. Marie is very tired and her back hurts her and she wants to take a short rest. Strauss also mentioned the English attitude in Palestine has at last smiled all the Jews.

Nov 29

Today Yenta's letter to Castle came - it is one of the finest letters ever written. I copied certain parts of this great document to use in letters. If Castle only will read it I am certain he will rejoice. Here everyone is surprised that so much has been done by Washington. Mundy's cable was very optimistic saying that his first overtures with Foreign office were well received. On the boat he also met an important man. The spirit shown by Mundy was fine - he had obligations here, yet he jumped on the first boat to England.

Mundy feels disgusted with the British attitude, so does everyone here whom we speak to - The letter sent by the Lady to the Vice Roy is remarkable!!!

Marie went away for a few weeks vacation - she deserved it. Such devotion must be appreciated - truly she was sent by the Lord.

Discovered we have a Racketeer (Gangster) living in the Building - our lawyer indignantly wrote him a letter to vacate.

Modra after being "humble" became cynical and began "feeling hurt"

again. She invited Mr. Hel Campo and other gentlemen for luncheon. Mr. Hel Campo is a Museum Director from Argentina. Some men sat down

others stood up so finally told her quietly (being this was her party) please get some chairs for the other invited

friends. A few days later she told me, that I did not show proper

respect by asking her to get chairs. Does the President of Metropolitan Museum go out and get chairs? I can see many

financial possibilities were overlooked by her in South America. She refused to take works of art to South America for

selling purposes, what will now happen

Someone else will send an exhibition down there and sell many things.

Mr. Parks from Peru was here I told Mr. Parks to secure funds to use 2 Rooms in our Building exclusively for Peruvian Art - France would not sell it to her To pay for Secretaries funds we also needed, how Modia and Sina are spoiled Yes, in our most difficult financial times Sina draws besides her earnings as Teacher of the School also \$2000. for Administration, she could not wait until the earnings of our Institution were sufficient.

I must speak to Koyep to reduce salaries of Employees, as his payroll is higher than Mr. Halls. -

Leon Habo maybe asked to go as Lecturer to South America, he is one of boldest Speakers in America and really he could be truly useful for us down there in a practical way. Modia is anxious to go to South America again as soon as possible I see very little of Sina she keeps herself very busy - good.

My darling Brother Suetig spent a hour with me today - he is ^{so} darling. - He looks fine, is anxious to earn more money. Doctor Kestkar spoke again today

on Buddhism - simply divine. Really what fine spiritual knowledge is being given to the world in our Building. Nettie beautifully introduced him to the audience.

The Law Suit of Mrs. Schafraun was settled for \$350. - and after Nettie gesturing boldly pointed out her responsibility in this matter. That we cannot shove our faults upon the Museum -

Mrs. Schafraun after "Conference" with Sina decided to personally pay the \$350. - When you take money from people in America it will never be forgotten their pocket book is their highest possession - their God -

Nov 30

Flavins has been vomiting again and has a sore throat. We hope he will escape serious illness. - The Finnish Association had its first event. Consul was ~~present~~ present (first he did not want to come) also a Finnish gentleman from the Times as well as about 75 guests. A nice event. My speech of greetings was well received. Many complimented me. Leon Hapo had lunch with us, we asked him to help us as he speaks at many out of town cities. Ellen Kettunen saw before going to sleep

that there was an announcement in the Times "That the Foreign Office announced, that the Pacific Case has been cleared up (our Kiva Room has been rented by Club for one year for \$3400. (we pay for electricity) Really this is fine and it helps.

Dec 1st

Flavius continues to have Temperature of 102 1/2 and a sore throat Exhibition of Miss Hammond opened with many interesting people present. A reception was held in her honor Mrs. Clabugh also heard about slander of Conner we told her what to answer. Again encouraging news from Mundy. Cannot get over Ojane's beautiful letter to Castle - a masterpiece! -

Dec 2nd

Mundy's cable stated, that London at present is not ready to give visas - his cable very optimistic, despite this message. Upon Nettie's suggestion we cabled him to insist of Prof R's presence at medical Conference. Flavius was better. Greatly concerned about financial condition, thinking how to find means to cover our needs. Bistran and Giles are starting a Guild class. Prescos will be painted for the School Rooms.

Regarding ^{personally} believe there is little improvement. Five times asked her to write a speech about our Institutions which Congressman Bloom will read in Congress. Finally written in the usual negligent way and I told her so. In future will have my Secretary write it as soon as I take someone for Tea she immediately calls them up and makes dates with them this does not disturb me, but ^{it} is a waste of time.
