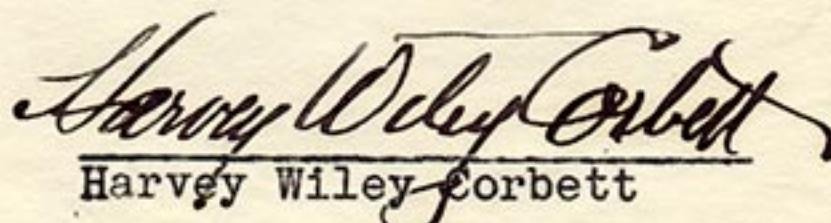
Dear Mr. Horch:

Roerich Museum Incorporated has been dissolved and we are now incorporated under the Education Law, Board of Regents Albany. The name Incorporated has been eliminated. There now exist 7 Trustees instead of 7 Directors.

All properties 310 Riverside 311, 312, 312½ and 323 West 103rd have all been conveyed to the Roerich Museum. It is our attorney's belief, that there exist a good chance to be relieved of all Taxes. The attorney wishes to prove to the Tax Commission that the apartment is not used for the personal profit of Directors, but is used for the upkeep of our educational institutions.

The Bank credits us with 2 Months interest amounting to \$20.750.- which we will apply towards deferring the beginning of interest & payment.



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Contract with American Bond & Mortgage Co Inc

Contract with American Bond & Mortgage Co Inc was made originally for \$2,000,000. This contract was signed on May 31st 1928.

Principally on account of lack of light, which seriously endangered the renting of about 50 Rooms + the restaurant being in the basement, the bank agreed to loan an additional \$75,000. for the purchase of 3½ ^{feet} Riverside Drive (21x100 feet). This purchase eliminated the necessity of having a subbasement. The excavation of the subbasement would have cost between \$40,000 to \$50,000. It also enlarged the building from the 4th to 14th floor giving us larger rooms. —

Conditions of Loan:

The loan runs for twelve years beginning



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II

June 15th 1928 and terminates June 15th 1940.
The Bank divided this first Mortgage into
two series of Bonds : Series A \$1,925,000.
and Series B \$150,000. - both bearing interest
at 6%. We must amortize at the rate of
slightly more than 2%. - On June 15th 1940
the debt of \$2,075,000 will have been
reduced to \$1,590,000. - The interest payments
do not begin before February 15th 1930 and
amortization does not begin before June 15
1931. Both these conditions being very beneficial
for us. We have the right upon 30 days notice
to call all bonds for redemption by paying
10% Premium. This a favorable clause because
in most cases as high as 5% is demanded.
It is the custom here to refinance such loans
after 3 years. When an undertaking proves a
success it is easy to refinance ^{says} with a new
bond issue bearing a lower interest rate.

It was found necessary for Aviach and myself to guarantee the interest on the Bonds. The three institutions guarantee \$65000.^{per year} rental for the space, which they occupy in the building - this is more or less a bookkeeping transaction. It is the custom here, even if a bank erects a large building, the bank must obligate themselves for a certain rental. As soon as they erect a building it becomes a real estate transaction. Speaking of our case, bankers here do not understand artistic possibilities. Our building is considered a specialty building and very few banks finance specialty buildings, believing that if a building is not a business building or a typical old fashioned apartment house there it would be too risky. ^{renting guarantees given} Our attorney will take steps to protect us. Notably paintings of the Museum were not mentioned.

MEMORANDUM TO Mr. Horch:

Re: ROERICH MUSEUM
Proposed recasting of leases

Pursuant to our recent conversation on the above subject, I have had a discussion with Mr. Weiss, in which we reviewed carefully the different aspects of the suggestion contained in Professor Roerich's recent communication, to the effect that the exclusively cultural objects and activities of the Museum be reflected in leases of tenants of the building, so that such leases should take the form of a pledge of contribution to the Museum's activities, by a member of the Society of Friends, rather than their present ordinary and standard form, typical of dozens of apartment hotels run solely for commercial profit. We understand, of course, that the terms and conditions of the lease as now drawn, would be embodied in the proposed new form, the Professor's idea being merely to accentuate the pledge feature for a cultural cause, and to reflect the fact that all tenants are members of the Society of Friends.

Without burdening you with a technical discussion of the matter, I may say that the one great objection, legally, to adopting the Professor's suggestion is a real possibility that by changing the lease in that way, the Museum might sacrifice its summary remedies in the event of non-payment of rent, or other breach of the lease, by any tenant. The highly effective remedy of dispossess, whereby a landlord may swiftly gain possession of his premises, is strictly a statutory remedy founded upon the conventional relationship of landlord and tenant. The theory of your proposed relationship is opposed to this, at least it may be so considered by a court, and you cannot afford the risk of a ruling that will mean a denial of the above summary remedy. An adverse decision will mean delay and expensive litigation, and a possibility that the Museum will be compelled to resort to an ejectment action to gain possession of an apartment. Such an action is both cumbersome and dilatory.

After all, as you and Prof. Roerich fully realize, we must be practical, and you cannot jeopardize the main source of your income by a doubtful plan. The Museum, so far as its apartments are concerned, is running a business in competition with like ventures in which the general public, as bond holders, have invested their money. We cannot escape the practical exigencies of the proper and business-like administration of a commercial proposition.

On the aspect of possibly greater tax exemption, it is certain that nothing is to be gained by the proposed recasting of the leases. The Tax Law only exempts that portion of real property owned by an educational or charitable institution that is used exclusively for carrying out its chartered purposes.

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The arrangement suggested does not transform the use from a commercial one to an educational one. The tax authorities, as well as any court which might later review the situation, would pass over completely the aspect of contribution to the Museum, and would see solely a contract wherein a profit is derived from the use of an apartment. In fact, the courts of this state have already indicated in connection with Syracuse University that where it appears that a profit is derived by an educational institution from moneys paid by students for residence purposes, the property so used will not be tax exempt. You can secure exemption only if bona-fide students are permitted to occupy the apartment at a price that will yield no net income.

With respect to the space now used by the Master Institute and formerly by Corona Mundi, Mr. Weiss believes that he may be able to work out some practical solution of the difficulty along the lines I suggested to you. I understand that Mr. Weiss has an appointment with Mr. Horch to go over this situation and obtain whatever detailed information may be needed.

Dear Mr. Horch,

Enclosed I am returning the Minutes of the 100th and 111th Meetings, inclusive of the Trustees of Roerich Museum, which were sent to me for inspection and comment.

I regret that I am unable to offer very much in the way of constructive comment due to the fact that the greater part of the Minutes makes reference to letters, documents and matters which I have not had the opportunity to see or hear discussed, due to my inability, much to my regret to attend meetings. As I have informed you, the demands made upon me by the business of my firm have made it impossible for me to be present.

I feel it is hardly necessary to assure you and our dear colleagues that, in spite of my enforced absence, and interests of the Institutions are ever in my heart and mind. Upon reading the Minutes I must say I am astounded at the remarkable effort and accomplishments which they disclose; it is truly inspiring.

With respect to the Apartments I should like to submit for the information of the Trustees a few facts which have come to my attention recently:-

On the six room (three baths) apartment which we now occupy a reduction of \$200. per year is offered, when we took the apartment in October 1929 we secured it at a reduction of \$300. per annum from the previous rental. On a bid we are confident we can obtain further concession. The building has just been thoroughly renovated and put in first class condition; it has been steam blasted, and the hallways have been refurnished and redecorated, as have the elevators, etc.

At 24 West 79th Street., 3 years old, a six room apartment for which the present rental is \$3,100 (leased three years ago) is now actually rented at \$2500.

In #16 East 96th Street, a high class apartment, six rooms are now offered at \$2600., compared with former rental of \$3100.

Five rooms, two baths, are offered at 41 West 96th St., a two or three year old building, at \$2000, formerly \$2600, and a bid is requested. This is a high class privately owned and managed apartment.

Since June, I understand that Paterno's buildings have reduced their asking prices all along the line from \$100 to \$400 per annum.

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Since there are many families known to plan moving October 1st the owners are trying to hold up their rent schedules in the belief that people will be forced to sign leases rather than be without quarters when their present leases expire. However, it appears that anyone who is in a position to hold out until after the heavy rental season, will secure apartments at great concessions.

Six rooms and two baths are obtainable in an older building at 505 West End Avenue, (84th Street) at \$1800 per year. This figures \$300 per room per year which is extremely moderate for this section; such rentals prevailed until last year on the Concourse which has always been considerably lower than this section.

Apartment hotel rentals I understand have so far been held up to comparatively high levels in most cases, but with the slow inquiry and undoubted lack of prosperity there seems to be every prospect of early reductions. \$800 per room is the price I have heard for high class quarters, and less for more moderate types.

Price is the main consideration and prospective tenants care little for anything else but PRICE.

It appears extremely doubtful that any improvement which might take place in the near future will be sufficient to enable the average family to pay anything but most moderate rentals. I need hardly call your attention to the vast unemployment, salary reductions and generally stagnant business conditions now prevailing. I believe if tenants with satisfactory financial responsibility can be secured at reasonable rentals it would be a mistake to turn them down. \$100 more per year from a poor financial risk is not as good as less money from substantial tenants.

REPORT ON INTERVIEW WITH MISS KETTUNEN

In a interview which the Director of Master Institute had with Miss Kettunen regarding the offer made to her to be appointed as the person to give information to the public about Roerich Museum, the following details were discussed:-

Miss Kettunen said that it would be exceedingly hard for her to part from Miss Livingston, with whom she has lived for several years, and therefore she asked whether it would be possible to have a two room apartment with Miss Livingston, in which case they would pay for the second room since one room was offered to her free. A salary of \$60.00 a month was accepted by her. Miss Kettunen offered to give four evenings a week leaving out Tuesday, Thursday and Saturday, and every day, hours from one to five, with the exception of Saturday, on which day she cannot be on duty at all.

The main difficulty seemed to be about her lease, which she felt it would be very difficult for her to break, since she signed it for the whole season.

This arrangement is at present left to the consideration of the trustees.

MEMORANDUM

In our statement of "Assets and Liabilities" of 6/30/31 submitted to you, we noted an error that has been made in the last sentence of the last paragraph. It reads: "We have less Income from Roerich Museum Apartments!" - It should read that "we have transferred the debt due to the Lowenstein estate to our "Current Liabilities". I want to add that formerly \$19,000. due to Lowenstein Estate, was carried under "Second Mortgage Bonds" and the balance represents accrued interest.

All outside holdings of Second Mtge Bonds falling due on July 1, 1931 have been retired by making part payments. The single exception being \$5,000. held by Lowenstein Estate, which settlement had not passed through our books on June 30, 1931. As the Lowenstein Estate made us an allowance of \$1,000. we owe them only \$4,000. We will pay \$2,000. in July 1931 and the balance of \$2,000. due them during the months of Oct. Nov. and Dec.

The statement rendered to you as of 6/20/31 did not include the Lowenstein Estate Debt. The present statement as of 6/30/31 is an improvement over our former statement.

The International Art Center will make some sales in the coming year; the Roerich Museum Press will take in more than \$5,000.00; The Roerich Society will also take in more than \$5,000.00; Urusvati will receive substantial subscriptions.
- It seemed advisable, because of the prevailing serious financial conditions in the United States, to be exceedingly cautious and to present this type of Budget, which will protect us so that our educational work may proceed unhampered. The present "circumstances" had also to be considered.
- (2) Under "Administration" ROERICH MUSEUM, you will note an item of \$1200.00. This represents the salary paid to Baron de Taube.
- (3) Under "Administration" MASTER INSTITUTE, you will note that the figure is \$4320.00. This figure includes the salary of Miss E. J. Lichtmann.
- (4) Under "Administration" ROERICH SOCIETY appears the item \$2400.00. This represents Dr. George Chklaver's salary.
- (5) Under "Printing & Stationery" URUSVATI is the figure \$1,000.00. This represents \$700.00 for the cost of the "Urusvati Journal," and \$300.00 for stationery and printing.
- (6) Under "Publications & Reproductions" ROERICH MUSEUM, and also ROERICH SOCIETY, there appear the figures \$800.00 and \$1100.00 respectively. These represent expenses of various publications which will, of course, be handled by the Roerich Museum Press.
- (7) Under "European Center" ROERICH MUSEUM is the item \$840.00. This represents the rental for the Paris headquarters and the \$20.00 extra paid each month to Mme. de Vaux Phalipau.

We wish to acknowledge receipt of your favor of February 25th calling our attention to what seems an unnecessary delay in the receipt of monies cabled to India for your account from time to time. The procedure in handling these cables is as follows.

On receipt of instructions from you we write to the Chartered Bank of India, Australia & China in this city enclosing our check for the amount to be cabled. The Chartered Bank at once cables to Amritsar, India, which cable they advise is received the following day, Amritsar being the nearest city to Naggar Kulu that they can cable to. It is our understanding that Naggar Kulu is a small town and consequently has no banking agencies, therefore the money is sent by mail from Amritsar. We could not learn how often these mails were sent but in all probability they might be some time apart. All things taken into consideration, the Chartered Bank advised that two weeks is not an unreasonable length of time to take to have the funds reach their final destination.
