

Strange Phenomena in Hiroshima. Atom City Gives up Shadows of Past. People in Dread of New Apparitions.

London, Feb. 25.- "News of the World" Tokio correspondent Saturday night reported that scenes in Hiroshima at the time of the atom bomb explosion were reappearing in the city now as "silhouettes on barren ground."

The correspondent Mr. A. Noyes Thomas, who said he had seen the phenomenon, attributed to it some unexplained delayed action of the atom rays. "There is shadow on the pavement of a little Japanese school girl holding under her arm what may have been a bundle of school books," he wrote, adding that he also saw the silhouette of a vanished bridge.

Only a few silhouette have appeared, Thomas said "but survivors from the bomb burst, toothless now, with downy hair just beginning to grow on their heads, live in constant dread of the appearance of the new ones."

The correspondent said he had first heard of the phenomena from officers aboard the H.M.S. "Glenairn" in Tokio harbour and "only after investigating the story on the spot, - and myself shuddering with horror, - was I convinced of the truth of it. A.P.
