Birthday of Prof. Roerich has been observed very well here in India, all over India, and my husband's broadcast is still being heard all over India on all the various Radio Stations and has been very much appreciated indeed. Still all the Newspapers are writing on Prof. Roerich, and when we get all of them we shall send you the copies. I sent Medame Zelinsky a copy of the Press notice, as they are able to read English, it was about the USSR naming two Glaciers in the Khirgiz Alatau in the Basin of the Alamedin River in honour of both Prof. Nicholas Rosrich, and Svetoslav Rosrich. Please ask Andrei to get this Monograph Volume 95. 1964, from Lemingrad and send it to us. We have been sent a part of it, exactly the data, but we would like to have all and so please have the Monograph sent to us. Mr. Belicov also knows about it, but Moscow being near Leningrad, Mme. Zelinsky can get it from Leningrad for us, and send it to us please. My husband has been awarded 2. high AWARDS BY THE MYSORE GOVERNMENT ON THE 16th. of October, at Dussers time in Mysore. One AWARD IS CALLED "THE SPECIAL SERVICE AWARD" WHICH HAS BEEN GIVEN TO HIM AS A SPECIAL HONOUR FOR SERVICE IN THE FIELDS OF ART & CULTURE, AND THE OTHER IS AS "AN ARTIST OF WORLD REPUTE". Everyone in India and also abroad are very happy with all this news, and everyone has sent us such wonderful wires and letters. Thank you for your letter which we just received upon our return from Delhi, we were in Delhi for some meetings, and stayed there for quite sometime. I am not able to write much now, but this is just to let you know that we all are quite well, but very very busy, as now after having returned after such a long time, there is so much work at home, also my husband has to finish many of his paintings, before we again go to Kulu. It is important we stay in Kulu longer this time, as there is much work for the Roerich Memorial Museum there. The place now has been cleared, and we must get the plans done well, it will be really a big work to get things all the way to Naggar.

Here, it is very beautiful now, all the flowers are out, and all the Orchids which we got from Kalimpong are in bloom, they have a very wonderful scent, and my husband loves to have them in his Studio. Many people from the USSR, come all the time to see the paintings and to pay their respects to my husband, it is so nice to have them, to talk to them, and many of them now work here in India. But also there are many new Delegations coming all the time, and this is very interesting, as we hear so much about Russia, and all of them are so very happy to come to our home here. We received the Poster of Prof. Roerich's Exhibition which you sent to us, one we shall have in Naggar, so many people go to see his paintings in the Memorial Gallery there, and they always write such wonderful things in the book for visitors which is kept there, all types of people go to see these paintings which look so beautiful there, not only from all over India, but from different parts of the world, so when there is time, I will select the most interesting things, and print them in a book. There are so many interesting things to tell you, but now I will not write much, but will post this letter so that it catches the Post. We have written you many letters which do not seem to have reached you which is so strange, as all our friends in the USSR, receive all our letters and answer them, you should enquite from your Post Office about your mail. I have asked Mrs. fosdick to send you the book on Prof. Roerich as she has many copies, and will be glad to do so, there is also much news of the work in the USA, the Roerich Museum is doing wonderful work there, and so many Russians go to see the paintings of Prof. Roerich and my husband's, lately a fine article appeared in the USA in Russian writer on the Art of my husband. Let me know if this reaches you, and also if my letter of last week reaches you.

2. Have the people who sent MESSAGES ON THE OCCASION OF THE EXHIBITION been thanked for their messages? Please find out.

Journal of Secretary of the National Academy President, and the Secretary of the National Academy President, and the Secretary of the National Academy which is the Academy of Art in Delhi, and other messages from Academies, and people prominent such as writers etc, sent their messages, and as far as I know, they have none of them been thanked. Please let me know definitely.

4.
