I have sent to Basumati the photographs yesterday, though they must have two more, as my people say that they had sent them two with the copy of the Broadcast of Dr. as they did to some well-known papers, and the short life-sketch of Prof. Nicholas Roerich, so you should not let them just not use those photographs, you can write and they can also publish them once again in a leter issue. SENT TO THEM MESTERDAY: 1. Photograph of Nicholas Roerich, with the late P.M., and 2.— One very fine photograph of my husband. So these will be used with your article, and later the others sent must be used, they should return one, that is the least, after use. MAKE THEM DO SO.

My dear Vivek,

Your letter of the 7th. reached us on the day and time that our friend Bowry was with us, and I read your letter out to him, and to my husband. We all feel sorry that your article has had rether rough weather, but it seems that papers pay Indrjit, so much a month to giv e, they the news, and not for an article alone. I am not sure of the arrangements, but Mr. Bowry told me quite clearly that you must see h him, and tell him to which papers your articles have been sent, and in anycase not to take any payment from Inderjit before you see him. Mr. Bowry promised to see Inderjit, and have a talk with him, and see that he pays you not for each article, but for your article for his firm, for which they give a lumpsum. So I geel that somehow you shoul -d see Mr. Bowry, as he too will be going away at the end of this month to Paris, for 3. or 4. weeks. So is it possible for you to go or even to phone him? Write to him, and ask for an appointment to see him, as they will be very busy, and we must contact him as soon as yo -u can, do this as soon as it is possible please. In anycase, they will not need them, so we must really try to get them back. But later, get paid first.
