WE HAVE JUST RECEIVED THE BOOK " THE WORLD OF ROERICH" BY NINA SELIVANOVA WHICH SVETOSLAV IS VERY HAPPY TO HAVE, HIS DID NOT HAVE THE MANY QUOTATIONS OF APPRECIATIONS IN HIS OLD COPY, WHICH HE WISHED TO HAVE. It came in good condition. CUR OFFICE WORK IS DONE UPSTAIRS, AND WE HAVE PLEANTY OF ROOM TO WORK, IT IS VERY NICE, AND DOWNSTAIRS WE HAVE A SITTING ROOM, AND SO ON LIKE A FLAT. VERY SIMPLY FURNISHED, BUT NICE AND NEAT. Much better than the old place, where we got all the dust, and it really was very hot. In yours of the 13 13th. you wish us so warmly, thank you dearest friend, we always wish you all the very best and hope that things will be so that we shall all meet soon. May God, be with you. In India willions attended the visit of the Pope, he was so warmly received, it was a great occasion.! I still look at the gifts you sent, and will have them on our Xmas table, now Mother is gone, we shall have no one but your gifts will be like hers, warm and full of love, part of our small family. There is much to do, time does not permit me to write more, I am sending Mrs. Nanjappas address in this. Some artists at the Academy meeting were interested to Exhibit at the Roerich Museum, and Hebber also, please send to me the terms learly so that I may tell them if needed. I am trying to answer all your 2. letters, and give our news, this is therefore a short letter with all the questions answered. Meny thanks for your dear letter of the 25th. August which came just yesterday, and which I hasten to answer to tell you that we did receive the 1st. list, sent by you, a copy of which I enclose, and that I sent to you a list of items received by us which Svetoslav has translated when needed as some were in Russian, and so please compare and let me know if that is the entire lot sent by you? I am sure that that now all you sent has reached, you will have last weeks list, of things sent by you by SEA MAIL, and the list of things of Prof. Roerich, which you have marked "IN GLASS CASE", "IN ATCHIVES" & "IN ARCHIVES" of all infact which as you say are in the Roerich Museum New York. So will you now please see these lists, and let me know if all have reached us?

We also did not know the date of the unveiling till Raya sent us a wire asking us to come, and immediately, we sent her that it would be impossible as the time was so short, and to arrange it in the best way in the proper manner there, but to have the unveiling on his birthday, the 16th. August, to which she replied a bit later that it can only be on the 17th, as there the Oriental Institute is closed on the 16th. so the only thing we could do was to send the wire, a copy of which we sent to you, and release it to the Press here this news, which was very well received here. One other thing is this, the Sponsers themselves did not write us an invitation, if they really wished us to come, we should have had plenty of time, everyone knows that one cannot just go off to a foreign country from India these days without proper errangements, and that may take about two months, or even 6.months. Foreign Exchange is so tight here, that one just is unable to do these things without the proper arrangements not only here, but also there. Svetoslav just cannot go there like a tourist, things have to be officially arranged. If our beloved Geerge were there, so many things could have been done. Now Belicov writes that they are working for the 100th. Anniversary of Prof. Roerich, let us see what they have in mind. Anyway, Svetoslav has told him that the few articles given out by George to some publishers from Prof. Roerich's "MY LIFE", should not be published as such, and it if at all published, should be done as Prof. Roerich intended in one or two, or three books in one lot, and not separated as articles. To this, Belicov has agreed, he also feels that such articles should not be devided, and should be together. Raya has these, as George took them out of the manuscript, so we have asked Belicov to send us copies of these articles, let us see if is able to. Well, the main point is that at last after 5. years, the Monument is done, and our George has an honoured place in his country, the land which he loved so much! Baya did well, she also made a speech thanking all who put up the Monument, and so on, our wine was read out by Zelinsky, and lots of people attended the function which we hear was most impressive. My dearest Sina.

Your dear letter of the 18th. reached us and Svetoslav has already written to your letter to him about your questions regarding the writer, I wonder if you should at all answer him? You will see from my letter to him a copy of which Svetoslav sent to you in letter yesterday or rather on Friday, that from the very begining of his writing to us, we were very careful, and Svetoslav did not ever write to him. Many people write to us about many things, asking for this and that, so we think very carefully about such things. As we had no idea about this man, Svetoslav wrote to Pavel Fedorovich asking him if he knew him, and what he thought of him, and who he was. It seems that during the exhibit of Prof. Roerich's there, he wrote well, about the paintings etc. Anyway, such things will always crop up, but one has to be careful, especially as in that land one has no copyright laws, etc, and it is all different. They know best how to deal with matters there, we have no idea at all what the rules etc. are, nor can we from this distance. I AM VERY SAD AND SO IS SVETOSLAV TO HEAR THAT YOU ARE NOT WELL, AND REQUEST YOU TO PLEASE TAKE EVERY CARE. IT IS TRUE THAT LUNCH TIME MAY BE BUSY, BUT I INSIST THAT ONE HOUR MUST BE FOR YOUR REST. ONE TO TWO, IS EVERYONE'S LUNCH TIME, WHATEVER IS THE TIME, YOU MUST PROMISE ME THAT YOU WILL REST. WRITE TO US GIVING US THE TIME, AND PROMISE THAT YOU WILL DO THIS PLEASE: - DO NOT FORGET, AS SURELY YOU DO NOT WISH US TO WORRY, AND TO KNOW DEFINITELY, WILL GIVE US PEACE, SO PLEASE DO AS THE DOCTOR HAS ASKED, MEDICINES ARE OF NO AVAIL UNLESS YOU GET WELL. THE HUMAN BODY NEEDS NATURAL CURES, AND SLEEP, REST, AND LIGHT FOOD, PLENTY OF FRESH FOOD, GOOD AIR, ARE SOME SOMPLE CURES. TAKEN IN TIME THE RESULTS ARE WONDERFUL! WHEN I AM COMPLETELY TIRED MENTALLY AND SO ON, I NOW SLEEP, AND IN THE AFTERNOON, ON THE DAYS WE STAY AT HOME, THAT IS ON TEUSDAY, THURSDAY, SATURDAY AND SUNDAY THE LAST DAY WHEN VISITORS DO NOT COME. STILL, since this was done, my heart gives little trouble, and I am well. I have no heart trouble, but feel very tired, ofcourse, when we go to kulu and the north, all this goes away. This tires me very much, not because it is not done, but the fact that they just will not do a thing unless one literally sees to it.GOD HELPS THOSE WHO HELP THEMSELVES, SO THOUGH WE ARE PROTECTED, WE HAVE TO LOOK AFTER OURSELVES, THEN THE FORCES OF LIGHT WILL BE WITH US! If we cannot do such small things, then it is not right. For us and people like us, there is food, but it is the millions who live on rice and wheat, who need it. Veg. and meat, are expensive things, the poor are not able to buy such things always. Nor can the majority buy bread, it does not last, so they needs food grains. Life is difficult, but let us hope we shall all of tide over such difficulties. Mrs. Gandhi will do well but it is here that she has to do things which she will. After the clear and brave directions of Shastri, and his deep understanding and feerless ways, it is not so easy for enyone to step into his place, he just was wonderful and he knew our problems, and would have slowly turned things in the right way. I know that Indira will be very much liked in the USA, and all Foreign lands, they know her, more, they hope she will work in as they wish, but let us see. Drastic she cannot be, as next elections come in 1967, and she will be gentle, but let us see what happens. Take good care of yourself. With much

It is also for a alternative to Kashmir, as a resort for tourists, so should be really well built up. Now though we do have a tourist place there, nothing much has been done for them. Food is very difficult to get even at the best of times for them. I hope this will be seen to when there is time, Pakistan seems to be now helpful, they have had a very bad shake-up, and wish perhaps for peace. I do not know what China will do, all the time they say that they are fully preparing to attack, building bunkers and so on just along our frontiers. Let us see, let us do that which we have to do in Faith, and do it well! Send us your love, all wishes, and your love again! He is always so happy to receive your letters, and loves to read them, always so constructive, so helpful, so full of all that we all are interested in, and it is real good to feel you so near. It is most sad that your maid left, and is so ill- what a terrible thing when you have so much work to do! We too now have a new driver, who is being trained in by a very good driver who cannot stay with us as his own business will suffer. Our old one got heart attack, and can no longer drive, but somehow the powers of Light who help us all, get someone to do the work- so /I pray that someone, perhaps a relative will come - ask her. My whole sympathy is with you, and I hope that soon you will get a good person. It is auful to have one's inner world broken up like this, we all need the peace of the house, then other matters are possible. I am very happy you gave to the friend of the Hon'ble Mrs. J. Betjeman our address, we shall dertainly see her when she comes here. At the end of April we will be going to Delhi, at least we have to wait till the Prime Minister returns, as then she will inform us about the portrait of Nehry, when to have it sent, and by what transport plane etc. The Government arrange for all this, so we will be there when it is there. Mr. Shibayev went to see my younger brother in a place near his in Wales, he is a Doctor, is settled there, and he was so happy to see Mr. S. has his own house on top of a hill, and has a huge and fine practice, and has an old couple looking after the house, has a lovely view from his house, a lovely garden, and we felt so very happy that he is doing so well, it is a great thing as we so often wondered what he was doing, if he was happy, if well, and so on. He told Mr. S. that he would not come to India, that he has been so long away ever since he was small, that now he intends to stay in Wales where he has his home, and his work. What a Karma.? But the main thing is that he is happy, he wrote so seldom, he said that he could not write, as we all seemed so far away. Nother used to hear from him, but seldom, he never wrote to me, Mr. S. says that he seems a very shy and good person, rather a sad expression in his face, but is very well off, and is happy. But he never told Mother he was doing well, it would have made her so very happy! Yes, the story of Berdnik is not nice, and he does not seem to be taken seriousely either, critics have not liked his writings there. Let us leave these things to them all there, Sveto slav has written to Belicov and given him good advice. I will write again, this was only a short note. LOTS OF LOVE TO OUR MILA. By the way, Mrs. Nanjapa came here the other day, she says that you told her that such people as she must come to the USA people wish to come is it no t?! She left the Emporium here, and does nothing now:

My dearest Sina,

Many thanks for your dear letter of the 10th. June, and the good news that you will not need the operation- I hope this is good news, but what about the foot trouble you have due to the bone ? Though we are happy that there will be no operation, we are sad to know that there has been no improvement in your heart, that you still suffer from this trouble, and this makes me very sad, you who do so much good and splendid work, who are so devoted to all that is Light should have this trouble, please take rest and give more work to others, is this at all possible? Katherine and Inge now seem to be so far away, they have to do so much now in other places, and I wonder if they will stay in the USA for long? But it is necessary for you to find someone whom you can train- I know that this easy to say, but oh! so very difficult! We try all the time to find dedicated souls. none to talk of, even the woman who works with us as secretary, is just doing her job in some sort of way, and though we are so kind and considerate to her, it does not make her any better. We engaged quite a young chap, he may turn out well, but one does not know. I suppose that when the time comes, we shall be sent, the right people. Work here is progressing if one may call the work done this, labour is so lazy, so uninterested in work, here everyone is just living, they are not interested in money, and it is because they all have lands of their own, and their needs are almost nil. For the Flush to be laid, and all fittings to be done, we have a contractor from down plains, and it is their men who are working, also for the water tank, and other work, such as finishing stones for the tank, we have men also from Kangra, which is another part of the Himalayas, but they are also brought by people for work, as the local people do not work. For the Museum, things have to be done in stages, we now have to have more than 40. thousand stones, which the man can only cut in October from the back mountain, and when this is done, each stone has to be dressed, that is made to size, as cement cannot be used with any stone unless it is dressed. Our Manager and his family just live, they rest I think when we are not here, and do not try to get people, they just do the very minimum, and that is all, about selling fruit, which this year we see for ourselves is a wonderful crop. God only knows what happens! We send them their salary all the time, so they are well provided, but how much profit etc. there is- only they know. We never have any profit, and the whole up-keep we have been doing for now years, ever since Mme. Roerich left, and so everything is like that. Well, I have a feeling that all this will find a proper way, such conditions cannot last long, and I think sooner or later somehow, we shall find a way. Ofcourse, what there is in the house, and so on is kept fairly well, thanks to the Kulu climate, and they do not steal, the other Managers just -t, helped themselves to as much as they could take- huge safes, furniture, and so many many things which one does not know even kow much. Mme. Roerich & left here a Manager before she left, and while she and George were in Kalimpong, he just did as he wished, and was a dreadful man, treated his very lovely wife also very badly, and left her too, married again, and so on. But there must be a meaning about all this that we now do. can you imagine what a real blessing it will be to have the flush here? All 5. bathrooms will have it, and we are also installing a water heater, but let us see how all this works , the Spring has been brought to the house, special Tanks were to

be constructed to catch this water, and this will be now completed I hope soon and we shall see the system working before we leave. We unfortunately have to leave by the 6th. July, so from today, it gives not much time, when it even directly just rains softly, everyone stops work, and in this season it rains—still, let us hope that things will be brighter, at the moment it is a bit depressing, but one has just to plod on and keep calm. Work in Bangalore and down plains is so quick, that one gets so worried to see how everything slows down, worse, how the workers just take it easy! The Kulu people are somehow fast going, they seem to be a sick lot, and from Lahul, many many have come and bought lands from the local people, and the local people are happy to work as labour for them! It is a strange society, and let us hope with the advent of more people to the valley things will be different.

Thank you for your words about the painting of Nehru, I shall send to you the Press clippings when I go home, as they should be with you in the Museum. It was such a wonderful day the Unveiling of the Portrait in Parliament, I felt so happy for Svetoslav who worked so hard on this portrait, and with so much affection too, it was a work of dedication, and a is a great work of Art! Nehru really lives in this portrait, it is a very beautiful portrait and technically very very fine— how I wish you could see it someday

This is just to send you our loving thoughts and every best wish for your health, please give our love to Mila, I do hope she will also feel better after her rest for a few weeks, it must be dreadfully hot now in New York-? Can you imagine it that the man who brought the paints from USA.still is unable to unpack his goods from there as the Insurance so. is still looking into his claims for some damage to it? I cant think what will happen to them in this heat, Delhi is just boiling now.

This is in haste to answer your letter which of course we were delighted to receive. Yes, we all counted the books and there were only 6, however, they have been most useful. I have only one left.

I just want to give you an idea of what is happening in India for the Centenary. All the Museums in India which have Prof.Roerich's paintings such as Banaras, Allahabad, Chandigarh, Trivandrum-Kerala, Calcutta, New Delhi, either at a Society or at the Academy, Bombay, are celebrating this day. All India Radio is celebrating it widely with talks by Svetoslav, the former Ambassador to the U.S.S.R. - Shri K.P.S. Menon and an Art Critic who is well known. At Naggar-Kulu this day will be celebrated by the Government of Himachal Pradesh with the Chief Minister inaugurating this function. They will have dances, prayers at the Samadhi of Prof. Nicholas Roerich, religious songs and folk songs and speeches by the Ministers and feeding of the poor who will come in thousands. There may also be a Newsreel taken of this function. In Bangalore the Chitrakala Parishath, a well-known art school of which my husband is a Patron from its inception will have a whole Centenary Week starting with an on the spot painting competition of about a 1000 or more children. My husband will give a special plaque designed by us in the name of Prof.Roerich to the first prize winner and other gifts to the others. The Accredited Press of whom there are about 69 all over India will receive data on Prof. Roerich including photographs.

There is so much to say but hardly any time to do so as we have to pack the paintings of which there are about 300. There are many formalities to overcome but the best news is that the Russian Government have been good enough to send a transport plane to Bangalore to fetch all the paintings which will be taken direct to the U.S.S.R. Of course we shall let you know when we go.
