Dearest Agbari, I was happy to get your letter with all the news about your family and yourself. It will give me a real pleasure to have new photos from all of you. Who knows where and when we shall meet again! For the present we have no intention to return to Naggar with its beautiful but also tragic reminiscences.

We are still staying at Rhandala, a hill-station near Kullu. It seems incredible but the summer season here has been much cooler than at Naggar. The nature is lovely and the light green hills are nice for a change.

Probably you know that I have been very ill and for a period. Gretelav found the small house at Rhandala in which we stay now and brought a doctor and a skilled nurse from Dombay. M<sup>r</sup> Hyatt, the nurse helped me to recover — I feel much stronger now and we are planning to move soon from here towards the Himalayas, but have not yet decided whether it will be Daejeeling or Calimpong — As I have to avoid the heat of the plains we shall not stop on our way down in Delhi or Calcutta.

Two Revolutions are a real curse especially where the consciousness of the masses is still in its primitive stage. Let us hope that the situation is well at hand and the worst has been already lived through. —

Here at Rhandala among its rural population, we have most  
kind and kindous and they seem to be friendly and sympathetic  
to each other. Here, where are no instigators people  
live peacefully. But the great problem is how to avoid  
these "bipedes", who may be met in the most unsuspected posi-  
tions and places.
