Since a ^{long} time, I am writing you this letter. I am keeping good health here in Darjeeling with my family. I already retired from the British service from last April 1930.

Please convey our sincere compliments to Prof. Roerich & sons. Moreover I shall be very glad to hear from you that when they shall be here in India. I did not receive any letter from Prof. Roerich & George, but I have got a letter from Prof. James Baeat from Paris. He wrote me that George met with him & talked with him about my good health & news. Perhaps, George might have said him - about my retirement from British Service. He wrote me that after my retirement; "will you keep in Darjeeling or in Tibet, or elsewhere in India? Or, if circumstances allow it, would you be able to go to France?" So, I think he also wanted me there.
