my son as yet. although he is
so near to Bombay it seems he
cannot leave his unit. I hope
to see him next week and my
birthday is, on the 14th I am sure
he will come home to wish me.
I have one of my sister's son's
staying with me. Poor boy
had no home, so I took him
in. He cannot find work for
a fellow. He left school & he came
a soldier & when the war was
over he had no proper qualification
now he cannot get anything to do.
The rains have not been too bad

up to now I wonder if we will
get it strong later. I have
not seen your son or his wife.
I had a case in the ^{new} nursing
home next door to this hotel
but did not get a glimpse
of them. I still have the bag I
made her. My husband sends
his best wishes to you. The
old doctor did not go to
Kulu. He is still with my
friends. He got his tummy out
of order & went on diet a
funny one, Tomato sauce &
Rice. and large meat chops.
He got quite well however.
I hear Dr Cooper takes him
to all the hospitals in
Bombay when he operates.
So the doctor is very pleased.
I have not seen him
being on night duty I see no one

unless I make an effort. My
patient just now is a young
man ever so ill. I do hope
I can pull him through. Well
dear I will end with
love to all. Thanks again for
