Dear Madame Roerich,

My father-in-law must have already shown you the letter which I have written to him on the 22nd July, enclosing a statement explaining how I was involved in a robbery at Paris Railway Station on the 17th July 1953.

I was coming from Geneva and had with me a suit-case belonging to Dr S.S. Bhatnagar, which he had asked me to take to London direct since he was returning to London via Norway. The suit-case contained some articles which were meant for you and which he had brought from America.

I am so sorry that all this happened, and if I can make good your loss in any way, I shall be very glad to do so.
