On this occasion there is so little one can put into befitting words. It seems they are always found wanting when they are needed most. His death is a great loss to the world. As great as is the world's loss -- how much greater must be yours!

Perhaps, it will alleviate partially the acuity of your sorrow to know that we are steadfastly working for Frof. Roerich's ideals in his name. We are determined to continue sowing the seeds, he advised. We shall be guided by the wisdom of his past advises. There is much work for us in the present and future. We shall need your wise counsel and deep understanding for many occasions. So, please take care of your health - that we may have your needed assistance at those intervals.

At last, the office is open for the practise of medicine. It seems a long time was required for that. The actual number of patients is small, as expected. But, I have high hopes that the near future will change this. At present the spare time is occupied by hospital work, locally and in New York.

I understand that Katherine has written to you about Mother Schafran. She is improved since a month ago. Her blood pressure has gradually fallen 70 points while on a strict rice diet. Now, she is taking a complete vegetable diet without salt nor milk. Although she has improved, her condition is not satisfactory to me. For she still continues to have heart pain on mild exertion. She is, at present, on a medicine which enriches the blood supply to the heart. Am considering the use of digitalis. If you have any suggestions for treatment, please know that they are welcome.

If there is any manner in which I can be of some help, please do not hesitate to call on me. Perhaps, you may have need of some medicines not available locally. If so, let me know and I shall be happy to procure them for you.

I do hope this finds you in good health, so necessary to sustain through this trying period.

In addition, she has a bladder infection which has caused her considerable discomfort.

The bad feature of her present condition is the knowledge that she cannot help Sina and Dudley with the necessary changes, due to her illness. Consequently, she feels she is hopelessly dependent and a great burden. She has taken to brooding over the situation.

This is written with the hope you may find the time to pen a few words to her. Your note would give her more than the necessary comfort and joy she requires.

Dear Mme. Roerich:

Katherine and I went into New York yesterday. We passed a most enjoyable afternoon with Sina, Mother Schafran and Dudley. All of us discussed at length the inevitable catastrophe for which we have made some preparations. It was a joy to behold the complete absence of tension among all. Personally, it was the first time that I have ever seen Dudley, Sina and Mother Schafran calm, all at the same time.

I thought perhaps you would welcome the tidings contained in this letter since it is really a health report about your loved ones and it is a favorable one, too.

Dudley has never looked better. He appears years younger and his face and mannerisms are truly serene. There is no longer any pain over the gall bladder and his heart is normal, except for a slight elevation of blood pressure. He has been urged to use the present time to adhere strictly to his diet, rest, walk and attempt to correct his posture. He is immensely stimulated by and interested in his new courses.

Sina looked well, except for the remaining signs of a recent cold. She was cautioned to return gradually to her daily routine. The next days will be difficult for her because of the few who will ask - "We did as you advised. Why didn't something happen?"

Mother Schafran appears much the same and continues to have angina on effort. However, her mental outlook is much better since she now prepares the food for Sina and Dudley and feels she is of some help in this trying period. No doubt her cooking has greatly contributed to Dudley's gain in health since she prepares the foods allowed only by the diet.

Ingeborg is much improved. The pain in her back is now confined to a small area and occurs at infrequent intervals. Fortunately, the pain no longer occurs at night so she can sleep now. Inge has been following your advices strictly. Without the stimulating effects of coffee, tea and her inner energies one can see how really tired she is even now. I do feel it will be weeks before the tender spot in her back disappears.

Katherine continues to feel well. She is doing much work about the house since Inge's illness. It seems to agree with her for her mood continues to be loving and buoyant.

Little Katherine now goes to school. She is completely over the effects of her pneumonia. She is a very lovely and lovable child who gives untold joy to all. It will be a sad day for all of us when she returns to her parents.

Panasenko is now enjoying the farm to the fullest extent. His heart does not seem to bother him at all. He has much to attend and we must restrict his activities repeatedly since he wants to work all the time.

Marta Sturans was examined. She is not a very robust person and there are several conditions which we are now trying to correct. She must definitely be seen by a dentist. In addition, she has a slightly enlarged heart with high blood pressure and marked hardening of the arteries for her age. However, she has shown considerable improvement since her anemia has been under treatment.

This is a personal comment which may interest you. About one year ago I read in the Teachings that there would be a new malady characterized by a throat irritation. This past winter I have seen and heard of many such cases. I can not recall a similar type of illness. If neglected, this throat irritation - usually accompanied by fever - develops into a diarrhea, pneumonia or neuralgia. It seems to be caused by a virus. Therefore, I have given to several patients the new drug, Aureomycin. The latter apparently clears the condition.

Again, my work at Bellevue Hospital, New York City, resumes. During the month of May I must attend Bellevue Hospital every day, including Saturday and Sunday. Am trying to rest this month for the daily trip to New York next month.

This is written to let you know that Katherine read to me your last letter. Please know that I am deeply grateful for all the advices and instructions. They shall be followed to the finest detail. Rather, I shall make every effort to do so.

During the month of May I must go into New York daily to work at the Bellevue Hospital. Therefore, your advices will be acted upon beginning June 1st. In the meantime the required food and medical items will be obtained.

Inge has had 2 episodes of marked pain in the solar plexus region; the last one occurring 2 weeks ago while taking 7 drops of Strophantus twice daily. She now follows your latest advice and has no ill effects. She continues to improve slowly. We are all so happy with her good progress. Inge feels so well she occasionally forgets she is a "sanitorium patient". She still has some aches in her back so the light treatments have not been resumed yet.

Katherine has been quite miserable with a severe case of poison ivy; contracted while clearing weeds from her flower garden with bare hands. She used your prescription of cocaine, talc and rose water with great relief of itching. She is still looking for a "herd of goats", one of which is due to arrive next week.

Katha is very excited and happy about her horseback riding lessons. She has had three already and is a very apt student. Her great love for horses is responsible for the extraordinary progress made.

Recently, the American Heart Journal had an article written by two doctors from Gairo, Egypt. They described a new drug, khellin, which is a great help to people with coronary heart disease. An air mail letter was sent to Egypt with the hope some may be secured in order to help perhaps Mother Schafran. Do you feel this new drug is harmful?

Martha has had all the diseased teeth extracted. Panasenko is working his large vegetable garden. Unfortunately, he has pain in his right shoulder and back which has been present for many years. This seems to be due to a large growth over the upper spine, which he has had for some twenty years. I am weighing the possibility of eventually having the growth removed.

Yesterday, Katherine, Marta and I attended an Agni Yoga meeting which as usual was thoroughly enjoyed by all. Prior to the meeting we had a short visit with Mother Schafran, Sina and Dudley. We are so very sorry to learn that you had been ill. We hope you are completely recovered and as always wish deeply and constantly for your good health.

Sina and Dudley appeared to be very well. Mother Schafran is as usual. Since she is cooking for Sina and Dudley her mood is gay and cheerful, feeling that she is not a complete burden to her children.

Marta has finished the course of penicillin and apeears to be improving all the time. Inga is now taking light radiation three times weekly. For the first time color has appeared in her face. For the last two days she has been nauseated. It was suggested that she omit one dose of strophantis. Her improvement is apparent to all, although there is still an underlying nervous tension.

Unfortunately, Katherine cotinues to have her herpes which are quite painful. Enclosed is a snapshot of Katha which I feel is really the child.

About myself—the advised routine was started; even the strict discipline is attempted. At present, one week of the milk diet has been completed in which seven pounds of excess weight were lost. I feel so much better! My only unpleasantness was the first dose of lithium which had a marked effect. I am continuing the strict milk diet for another week before any change is entertained. Please be assured of the sincere and deep gratitude for not only your interest but also the genuine improvement in health you have made possible.

Following your cable advise, it was learned that arsenic trioxide is available. As you know this is a powder which is taken by mouth. The daily adult dose is 1/60 grain or 1/30 grain in capsule form. Can we use this preparation and dose instead of cacodylate in the previously advised schedule of treatment? Of course, Katya would receive one half the dose. We will await your answer before starting the arsenic. Are there any books that I could read to become better acquainted with some of the advised prescriptions?

The weather has been hot and humid for several weeks. Because of this it is hard to evaluate the state of health. However, I do feel that Inga is much better. No doubt, she will tell about her condition. She tolerates light exercise and short auto rides very well. Panasenko is taking strophanthus and yesterday he began to complain of some stomach pain. He was advised to take his medicine while at rest. Katherine continues to have her herpes. The weather has prevented her from obtaining her much needed rest. Marta looks well and is now on the diet prescribed for all. Katya has been tired and upset this past week; I think due to the heat.

Enclosed you will find a newspaper clipping which explains in part the current interest of American doctors and also myself. It seems the higher the cholesterol content of the blood the more prone one is to have coronary thrombosis, high blood pressure arteriosclerosis. Before all went on the advised diet, blood cholesterol determinations were made with the following results:

After some 3 months of diet my cholesterol was 150. (I am feeling well for the first time in years. But I must continue to work at self-discipline) The above determinations will be repeated every 1-2 months. What the answer to the problem is I just don't know. But it seems that animal fats, eggs, emotions and the pituitary gland all play a part, in the development of arteriosclerosis and its complications. Your advises regarding diet and calmness are really at the basis for the probable causes mentioned. Is there any information you can give or have me study in better understanding the problem? It would be so genuinely welcomed.

Modern scientific thought looks upon Arteriosclerosis as the "inevitable aging process" -- to which belief I do not conform. The specific urine odor and crystals mentioned have not been encountered, although the search for them has begun.

At last the weather has turned cool. Our past summer heat and humidity established some sort of unwelcome record. For the past month I have had another doctor's practise. He is a nationally known diagnostician and heart specialist who will vacation for another 2 weeks. It is gratifying to be entrusted with his voluminous practise. It is keeping me confined, welcomely busy and medically stimulated. Unfortunately, the reading of the Teachings has lagged which is partly due to reading the autobiography of Gandhi. Dear Mme Roerich:

This letter promises to be rather long, since it will be typed by someone else, in addition to the fact that some fairly recent events in the field of medicine will be described. I hope you may find them interesting and that Katherine may help you with the reading of this.

The phase of medicine focusing on the glands of internal secretion has arrived. This has been brought about by the introduction of a drug known as "Cortisone". The latter is an extract of the adrenal gland.

The history of Cortisone briefly is this: Dr. Hench and Dr. Kendall, Mayo Clinic, began looking for adrenal hormones during World War II. They hoped to find more potent adrenal gland preparations for use in Adison's disease, where the adrenal gland secretion is greatly diminished. They finally obtained an adrenal gland extract which they called "Compound E". The latter was found to be absolutely without effect in Adison's disease. Quite by chance they gave this drug to a patient with severe rheumatoid arthritis (the crippling variety seen for the most part in younger people). The effect and relief were extraordinary. The fever came down and joints which had not been used for years could now be moved without pain. The drug was further given to patients with rheumatic fever and a host of other diseases which primarily effect the Collagen tissues, connective tissues of the body, with great improvement.

The problem which presents itself in this respect is the synthesis of Compound "E", whose price is exhorbitant. Dr. Kendall was able to synthesize the drug from Ox bile. This is the preparation that is now being used, but again it is much too expensive. At present the scientists are in Liberia, Africa, trying to manufacture the drug from all types of Strophanthus. They have had no success at all and an inexpensive preparation seems remote. The trade name of Compound "E" is "Cortisone". The implications of this drugs are profound, since it is making obsolete modern knowledge of physiology of the adrenal gland and opening up an entirely new approach to the study of thocurable diseases whose causes are unknown.

An extremely interesting parallel to Cortisone is the injection of Adrenocorticotropic hormone in the same conditions listed above. The remarkable effects are just as striking with this drug. This one is an extract of the pituitary gland which stimulates in turn the secretion of the adrenal gland. Again the drug is very expensive. This and Cortisone are still in the experimental stage and it is not known what adverse effects may be experienced from continued use of them.

Enclosed is an article which is focusing on the most recent treatment on Coronary Thrombosis. It is interesting that the new drug was discovered in Switzerland. The drug which gave impetus to the treatment in question is Dicumerol, whose history is interesting. In 1921 a hemorrhagic disease of cattle was found to be caused by eating spoiled hay. It was named "Sweet Clover Disease". It was found that there was a reduction of the pro-thrombin content of the blood. This constituent is needed for normal coagulation of the blood. After 7 years of work, Prof. Link, University of Wisconsin, isolated the effect in the spoiled hay and was able to chemically synthesize it, calling it Dicumerol.

Dicumerol is given in all conditions where Thrombosis of blood vessels takes place; the rationale being the further prevention of the Thrombosis. At times it is given where no Thrombosis has occurred, but as a preventive measure. The grap acts after a latent period of 48 to 96 hours by decreasing the coagulation time of the blood. Unfortunately, one must take a daily of veinous blood from the patient (about 2 teasponnsful) in order to

measure the pro-thrombin time each day. This is necessary since the following day's dose of Dicumerol depends upon the exact reading of the pro-thrombin time.

Dr. Irving S. Wright, in a large series of cases of Coronary Thrombosis has reported that only 11% treated with Dicumerol die, whereas formerly 20% died who did not receive Dicumerol.

I do not think Dr. Irving S. Wright's series was rigidly controlled, since the patients untreated with Dicumerol did not receive the daily withdrawal of veinous blood (about 2 teasononsful). Since this treatment extends over a 4 week period, the total amount of blood withdrawn is more than 1 pint. Perhaps the favorable response in the Dicumerol treated patients is the result of small daily withdrawals of blood. This, of course, is in keeping with the old medical practice of "Barber Surgeons" who tried so many of their illnesses with repeated Venesections. This view is not entertained by any one that I know and it has been in my mind for several weeks. It would be an interesting experiment to actually have a large number of cases Coronary Thrombons treated only by daily Venesection (withdrawal of veinous blood) over a period of 3 to 4 weeks.

Sometime ago, I wrote about a new drug, Khellin. This was discovered by Dr. Anrep in Cairo, Egypt, who reported excellent results in the use of Angina Pectoris. If you recall, I had tried to obtain some of it, without success. For the last year, it has been extensively studied by scientists in the United States. Nothing has been published in the American literature concerning this drug. It has been learned from a prominent heart specialist in Stamford, also interested in Khellin, that the drug in its present form cannot be used. Almost every patient who receives the drug has a very bad reaction. What the future status of Khellin will be, only time will tell.

This is certainly a long letter, which I sincerely hope is not too tiring. Please let me know if this sort of information is of interest. In the event that some of the above is not clear, please do not he sitate to ask for clarification. If at all possible, I shall try to ascertain more or clearer information for you.

Dear Mme. Roerich,

Your most welcome letter was received and it gave much joy. Even with Katherine's help, it is understood that the letter must have been an arduous undertaking.

I was very happy to learn from you that Katherine has improved greatly. Frankly, I do not believe that she tells me all the details about her health. Yet, I have had the impression that her continual gain in health was not entirely uneventful. It is really grand that Katherine has been able to remain much longer than originally planned. For your mutual joy must be so much the greater! We, at home, have our measure of joy in knowing this.

All were distressed to learn of Inga's fall. It is surmised her right wrist was injured since no mail has been received. It is hoped there will be no aggravation of her back injury.

Much thanks for all the Indications and Advises. There is no major question that can be raised at the moment. There is somuch to study before relevant questions can be asked. And I have studied very little. However, an important consideration is the Vagus nerve terminals to the abdominal organs. Hardly anything is known of this in American medical books. This also pertains to the Solar Plexus. So, the recommended books are greatly anticipated.

Mention is made of Salve with almond milk as the best remedy for irritation of the intestine. We speak of the term salve as any ointment. It is understood then that "Salve" is a specific kind of ointment which is not known to me. Could you give more information on it?

To date I have had no success in detecting cholesterol crystals in the urine of Arteriosclerotic patients. It is probbably due to faulty technique which centrifuges urine and the sediment is then examined. Will try to crystallize with 95% alcohol.

My trip to Switzerland presents one difficult factor at the moment; namely the new departure date, March 21st. But, something will develop to take care of this.

Yesterday, a meeting was held to decide on the incorporation papers. As a preliminary background, one must bear in mind that federal and state govt. are more strict with the issuance of these papers. Now, they are used more often to hide individuals' profits. And, worse yet, educational institutions like New York University actually operate private industry (spaghetti factory, etc.) to make substantial profits which cannot be taxed by the govt. since the industry is owned by a tax-exempt, educational institution.

It is for these reasons, not explained by the Bolling lawyers, that additions were made to the draft model of "World League of Culture". At least Mr. Weed and I felt that way.

The opportunity was presented to read all the correspondence concerning the incoporation papers in question. I have the firm conviction that Bolling's lawyers are doing a very commendable job and that they are very thorough in their efforts. Sina's overly-cautious attitude, which is understandable, occasionally prevents her from grasping the beneficial ideas and motives of others.

The points in question were quite simply solved in the following manner:-

l. Instead of using the word and in the phrase, "charitable, religious, scientific, literary and educational" - - it would read and/or.

2. The clause "dissolution of ass'tes to a similar organization, etc" - - is corrected to read the dissolution will be

accomplished by the Trustees.

3. It will be Roerich Foundation, Inc. rather than Roerich Institute, Inc. The latter name might call for further regulation by a governmental, educational agency.

These points will be sent to the Bolling lawyers for final inclusion in the incorporation papers. It seems most unlikely that Michigan State law will refuse them.

Dudley looked very well. Sina had a badly-cut finger which is well cared for. Mother Schafran was seen for a fleeting moment as I had to rush off.

A letter was sent to Mr. Bolling in an attempt to encourage a meeting between us. Enclosed is his acknowledgement, for what it may be worth. In the event he can be seen, please be assured I shall try to cultivate a friendship. The difficulty in this effort is Sina who discourages his association with others in the group, as you may know.

There is much hard and constructive work that must be done. May I prove equal to the given opportunity and faith!

Dearest EI,

There has been so much to do that time has been very scarce. Yet, this is no reason for being so late in acknowledging your kind and most welcome remembrances. The ivory letter opener is beautiful and so very useful. And thank you ever so much for the picture of the Teacher. It is in a locket which also contains the picture of Katherine you like so much. The locket rests in the shirt pocket over my heart. And it is always with me.

We have been very worried becuse of your recent illness. It is indeed good news to know that you are better. We all hope you are completely recovered and send you so many loving and health-giving thoughts for your continued well-being.

Katherine speaks of you so often and with such great love. It is a joy to see her heart fill and her face illumine when she merely mentions your name. She is complete happiness when she can speak of you at great length. Her thoughts are with you so much, always surmising or questioning what you are doing at the moment.

The portraits of you and Katherine are truly beautiful: For the moment my room has the portrait of Katherine in the orange colored blouse and white shawl. It is the best of Sewtic's four portraits. In Katherine's room is your lovely portrait. I find myself just going into Katherine's room to look at your likeness. Someday, I hope also to have a likeness of you in my room. At present, it is most fortunate to have you both so close and so constantly.

We have been doing much reading, almost all of it about the Teachings or related to it. Dr. Overstreet's excellent book, "The Mature Mind", was completed. Manley Hall's "Twelve World Teachers" was also read. This is very basic reading but most necessary and desired. The wonderful book by Sister Nivedita about Vivekananda was also finished. Most of this book was read aloud with Katherine — and it was a mutual joy, education and inspiration. Also read were excerpts from the "Mahatma Letters" and "Isis Unveiled". At beetime and upon awaking "Heart" is read. If only some of these wonderful philosophies and advises can be absorbed and become the yardstick of daily actions. At the end of the day, self-inventory finds our actions so short of the attempted ideal !!

My experience with Swiss medicine and doctors has been mixed. Much/time was required to establish medical acquaintances. Also, the Easter Holiday week put a halt to all activities. It has been only since April lith that the medical doors have been open to me. Swiss medicine is greatly influenced by America and the doctors look to the U.S. for the latest developments. At first Swiss doctors were suspicious when told I wanted to learn from them. Now that they have opened the doors, a flood of desired material has come to me.

The Ultra-sonic machine has been seen and discussed at great length. I have many German articles on it. Also. a scientific paper, describing its use in 9,065 cases of various illnesses. It was fortunate that I was able to speak with the technician who has given about 5,000 Ultrasonic treatments. The inventor of the machine, Dr. Paulman, is in Berne. If there were time, I would like to see him as well as study some other aspects of Swiss medicine.

There is a smaller Ultra-sonic machine which sells for \$1,000. This machine has now replaced the former larger one which is priced for \$2,500. It will be sold in the U.S. by a firm in New Jersey.

The presently-known, physiological action of the Ultra-sonic is its penetrating, massaging effect and its capacity to dissolve oils in water. Could the latter possibly dissolve the sediments of imperil in the body fluids and then be excreted???

The acquaintance of Dr. Marc Lob was made. He is one of the head doctors in Internal Medicine in the Hôpital Nestlé of the University of Lausanne. He has made several things possible, including daily visits to interesting Hospital cases. These have been most instructive. One is surprised to find so many cases of tuberculosis in Swiss.

The new drug discovered here in Swiss called Tromexan is an anti-coagulant. It is the same sort of agent as the American drug, dicoumarol - only it is superior. This is being studied. It was a surprise to learn that the University of Lausanne Hospitals do not recommed Strophantus to be taken by mouth. They claim it is not absorbed by the intestines, so it is only given by injection.

Inga's doctor was seen and he talked about her case. The diagnosis is Osteochondritis of the spine (Scheuermann's Disease). It is the first time I have ever heard of this illness. The doctor was pleased with Inga's improvement but did not know what would develop in the future.

It will be saddening for the moment to leave Katherine and Inga. But the time will pass quickly and they shall return healthy and happy in spirit and body. How much rest they both need now!! And how much Katherine gives of herself to others! There are timess when there is deep guilt because I take so much of her that she can not afford to give.

Please, again be reminded that no answer to this is wanted. And please tell Katherine whether my letters are too tiring for you. Your energies must be conserved and I shall not feel a personal slight if informed that my letters are a burden.

This time in Swiss has given much joy and knowledge and, I hope, some very necessary spiritual growth. It has been a heart-gladdening experience to come to know you through Katherine. May the time arrive shortly when you will be known in person!

During this time, it was surprising to see that Katya adjusted quickly to the change. One wondered whether she were ever away. Katya seems to appreciate the farm more than ever. All remark about her great improvement in health and spirit. She has an inner joy which is most contagious.

After Switzerland one can observe that thepeople here resemble charged dynamite. And in truth they are! For they explode so easily and violently. This is especially noticed in New York City. Is it not strange that in this atmosphere is locted the headquarters of the United Nations??

On May 1st the patients began coming to the office. In my absence they all behaved well, except one who had a stroke at the age of 83. At this rate, perhaps I should remain away longer??? A note was sent to Sina announcing my return. As soon as time allows they will be seen.

The data on the Ultrasonic machine was presented to Dr. Richards, Bellevue Hospital. He is the Director of our service. Dr. Richards will try to interest the Orthopedic specialist of Columbia Univ. Dr. Resnik, Stamford, was also informed and he advised contacting Dr. Howard Rusk, Bellevue Hospital. Dr. Resnik practises here in Stamford. He is an Internist of national reputation, although not connected with any University. He has been most helpful.

It has been learned that the Ultrasonic machine can be obtained in the U.S. - but only for research purposes. The anti-coagulant, Tromexan, which is commonly used in Switzerland, can only be obtained in the U.S. for research purposes.

Here, the greatest emphasis still is focused on Cortisone and ACTH (Adreno-cortico-tropic Hormone). Enclosed is a short article by Dr. Thorn on this study. Another important trend in American medicine was given impetus by Dr. Selye's theory, The Adaptation Syndrome. The latest anti-biotic drug is Terramycin. If a more comprehensive review appears, it will be forwarded. Please let me know, THROUGH A FEW WORDS TO KATHERINE, whether the enclosed material is of interest.

Some time ago, it was mentioned that a new apparatus for the detection of heart disease would soon appear. Enclosed is an apparatus advertising such. Could this be the machine in question? A question which recurs is the use of the Ultrasone in Arteriosclerosis. It was mentioned that mechanical stimulation to the Arteriosclerotic patient could be harmful. One wonders whether the Ultrasone would be harmful.

Katherine has written that she has again been cautioned to rest and diligently take care of herself. It is good to know this - since she always takes her health very lightly. Just as soon as she stores a little energy it is expended completely. One finds that Katherine must be continually reminded of her health which

The operative procedure went well with one exception. A thin piece of tissue overlay the thyroid gland tumor. Unfortunately, this was cut. Although it did not appear so to the eye, the microscope subsequently revealed it to contain a small amount of thyroid tissue.

Had I been more vigilant the surgeon's knife would have been arrested. My heart is very heavy; not so much because of my personal failure - but for Miss Spatz's sake and the future effect on her.

Neither Miss Spatz nor Mrs. Fosdick know about this. They were both told that all went exactly as Advised. I feel that they should not know. Am I wrong in hiding this from them? Please advise me.

Miss Spatz can leave the Hospital in a few days. However, she can use some rest. It was decided she remain in the Hospital for two weeks. I shall benefit from this. For it is a joy to have some one speak of the Teachings. And, of course she is a noble person.

Today, a package was sent via regular mail, registered. It contains two pounds of powdered Pepsin. Will more be needed? Previously, one-half pound was sent via air mail.

Dearest EI,

I aws very sorry to learn that you had been ill. May this letter find you well and again in your fruitful and benificent work!

Miss Spatz left the hospital May 26th and was advised to remain at home for one week before returning to work. It was learned that she has an anal ulcer which was unknown to her. This had contributed to her intractable constipation of many years. It is heart-rending to learn that she was almost a social outcast because she had to take an enema every day in the evening after an arduous working day. For the first time in years her bowels are regulated so that she has a movement daily without the aid of a laxative or enema. This alone is blissful wonderment to her. I think that event-ually this ulcer will require surgery.

It was remarkable to see how Miss Spatz's mind cleared during the second week of hospitalization when she became somewhat rested and calm. Your advises of the past were recalled and assumed a deeper significance and reverence for her. How grateful she is! I am also grateful for the opportunity to have been sema agent in her care. Her sincerity, selflessness and courage are very heart-warming and at the same time stimulating to me.

There was one very difficult moment. The surgeon, unknowingly and abruptly, told her that the thyroid gland was withered away because of pressure from the tumor and only a small portion of the gland was left. Miss Spatz confronted me with this, understandably upset and indignant. She was told the true happenings; namely mistaken judgement had caused a small piece of the gland to be removed. It was a devastating blow to her. She soon came to accept the situation with her usual courage and now eagerly looks to her future service. She can not help but question whether now she will realize her full potential in Service. It was suggested that Sina should not be burdened about the unsatisfactory operation.

Miss Spatz was invited to work medically with me, in the event she planned any changes from her present, attractive position. I should welcome her assets and attributes. She will give this more thought. She lives in New Jersey and Connecticut may be a good change. I sincerely hope that this change will not interfere with her future work, nor cause any friction with Sina. She may accept the offer out of mistaken gratitude to me, which should not be allowed.

We hope that your return cable will clarify this point so that specific reservations for the Sweden trip can be made.

Baltzar was fully receptive to the messages conveyed to him. All medications were stopped. His only medicine is the Strophanthus pills. The latter have not been located in any drug store. But I had some and he was given part of these. If more are needed, the remainder will be given.

He is very sad that you may have been caused any sorrow about his illness and its treatment. He is such a trusting soul that he thought his physician in Chicago was treating him correctly. It is known that this was an error. Dear EI, please understand that when one enters an American hospital, it is similar to an incarceration in the "Tower of London". The pathent has no word in what treatment will be given. He is surrounded by an impregnable armour of nurses, doctors, technicians, etc, who forbid any medication or opinion - other than their customary protocol. Our friend could not overcome this without the help of a physician guided by the Gr.T. In the future he knows that he can reach me to break this impregnable armour, if such a need ever arises.

Prior to my appearance on the scene he was so restricted and suppressed that he could not even write to you. This greatly saddened him. His circumstances are so difficult that he must be driven to the privacy of his business office in order to write to you. This is now allowed so shortly you will hear from him.

While in Michigan the Bolloing sons, Roger, Vernon and Donal requested information about the Teachings from me. This was an awkward situation for my knowledge seems so meager! Nevertheless, they they were singly told what/could in reference to the problem raised. Baltzar was also given some medical(according to the Teachings) insight into his condition. And, I do believe he is the richer for it.

P.S. All the medical data/on Baltzar was studied. The correct diagnosis based solely on this data is a profound exhaustion state. The latter resulted in spasm of the left diaphragm muscle, spasm of the descending colon and a transient narrowing of a coronary blood vessel which caused in turn a transient minor change on the electrocardiogram. I hope that you are not offended by being addressed in this manner. Katherine and Inga refer to you always in this way. You are the Mother of our group. And only a Mother, in the fullest sense, can give so fully and lovingly. Future

actions will earn the premature privilege I have now taken.

Inga has written that you have not been well. May this find you better! I hope that this last postponement did not cause any difficulties for you. We were momentarily stunned since so much effort and plan were being pyramided into preparations. However, it was short-lived. The stunned feeling gave way to one of relief and then one of gladness when the broad concept is considered. If is to be only a postponement I, for one, can use the period in which to more fully prepare for the eventuality.

Dear Mother,

Sina was examined. Nothing remarkable was found. She has sore, stiff muscles of the right shoulder and did not have time to take care of it. So, it continued to annoy her for several weeks. Besides this, she is very tired as a result of all the activity at the Studio. Mother Schafran has been very ill and continues to have attacks of pain; consequently Sina and Dudley lose sleep and are on edge. Sina was told she must take care of herself, applying heat to hereshoulder and resting after lunch. I attempted to impress the fact that she is getting older and her work gets heavier. She was also asked to take more water and raw vegetables.

Bolløing just finished talking to me by phone. He is very worried over your long silence. He has written many letters to you from Sweden and from Michigan and hopes you have received some of them. In the meantime he is concerned about your health and prays it is very good. The reason he phoned me; he ate infected salmon and is now getting ptomaine poisoning; also wants to have some Catillon Granules sent.

Sina phoned today to let me know that Dudley had a head cold and desired a prescription for Aureomycin. He was informed that he was not to take this medicine since it was Told that it had an adverse effect on the Subtle Body. About three years ago, this was given to Katya when ahe had a virus pneumonia and it was Said that it was not to be used. Dudley was told to remain in bed and rest. Thus the cold would not linger for several weeks. Actually, it is not the Common Cold; rather an infection of the throat, virus in nature, which is usually neglected and allowed to progress to a bronchitis or pneumonia. Sometimes it is manifested as "intestinal Flu".

To return to the subject of Aureomycin, there are other similar drugs which have appeared, namely Terramycinand Chloromycetin. These are all of the Streptomycin Fungus family. Are they all harmful? These drugs and Penicillin are taken upon the slightest notion and are most promiscuously ingested.

Katherine phoned today and she, too, has come down with this throat condition. She was told to rest, take soda and water in conjunction with a local astringent.

Katherine has written that you are improving slowly. I hope that this letter will find you continuing your recovery, if not already in your normal routine. Many loving thoughts to speed your complete recovery!

Sina read to me your letter which contained the information about her painful shoulder. It was most stimulating and impressive. The practise among physicians is to inject these painful areas with novocaine, to afford relief. In certain batches of novocaine is contained Sodium Sulfite. I would inject novocaine into these areas and the novocaine I have contains the Sulfite. Without your information I would have continued the current harmful practise. Thank you, Mother, and again let me express my gratitude for all your thoughtfulness and aid.

Enclosed is a letter from Miss Spatz. I had written asking that she come to the office for a check examination after the year of prescribed regimen you had outlined for her. After the examination you would be availed of the findings. And perhaps prescribe for Miss Spatz further. The enclosed letter is explanatory. The long paragraph gave me great joy and it is for this that the letter is sent, hoping you also will be pleased with Miss Spatz's thoughts.

Regarding the information about painful shoulders; - I have seen 3 patients with the same condition in the last two weeks. They were placed on the "Sina routine". Two have showed great improvement; the third one just started it and he will be the difficult one since he is a barber who just opened his own shop.

A wonderful experience occurred in which I had a part. A very special patient, at leafs I should like to think so, came into the office. She is 56 years old, Polish-Catholic who speaks broken English and had no formal education. She is very religious in the real semse; very poor, widowed and dependent on her children for support. Two years ago she was seen by a doctor for the same trouble. Apparently the underlying condition was not detected.

Upon first seeing her I was struck by her eyes and the quality of her voice, speaking broken English. They appeared long-suffering and yet loving. Examination revealed diabetes, large liver, high blood pressure, ulcers of the feet, degeneration of the nerves of the feet and itching skin. She was placed on the regime for diabetes listed in Par. 536, FW III. Her improvement has been dramatic!

She has taken me into her to her confidence and has divulged that for years she has communed with the Virgin Mother and a Male Voice. They have Told her when to pray during the day and not to go to her church (Catholic) since the priests do not believe her. Before seen by me she was Told she would die suddenly at the age of 60 years. Now she will live to a very long life. She will not be a financial burden to her children but she will be in their way. Only one son has a partial understanding and belief in her. All about her think she is crazy. As a result she forces herself to go against the Advises that are given, like going to her church which she has been repeatedly Advised not to do.

She has spoken of many instances of her clairvoyant and clairaudient powers which she does not fully understand, but which are attested to by hey son who has had a limited education.

One of her sons was crippled in the arms, legs and face with Poliomyelitis. The doctors were powerless to help. She called upon her "Voices" and prayed. Her son became normal and has just returned from combat service in Korea. While serving there the mother saw him and 7 other soldiers subjected to a merciless enemy artillery barrage. Again she called upon the Powers and her son was the only artillery barrage.

her son was the only one to remain alive and without injury.

The women does not understand fully her gift. She suffers greatly because of it. She is lonely. Her people and her church for years say she is crazy, although her predictions like the war in Korea made 5 years previously, does not impress them. Her great ordeal is the vision of so many terrible things she sees through these powers of hers. In agony, she discries she just can not see. On the other hand she speaks of "fighting with the devil". She is happy about this for she has the confidence that holding to her neck charm her Forces always help in the victory over the devil. (This I have read in the book, "Dayspring of Youth). She has always overcome the devil.

There are other instances, I can relate to you but I shall conclude on this last one. Her daughter-in-law, wife of the son who understands some of her gift is now 7½ months pregnant. Earlier, I had continually urged the daughter-in-law to be frequently checked by her heart specialist, Dr. Resnik She has a severely damaged heart due to RheumaticFever. It was Told to the mother-in-law that the foetus would be crippled because the daughter had an instrumentation for a urinary stricture. The mother, future grandmother, prayed and was Told that at 6 months the foetus would be normal. Now the difficulty is; altough the future grandmother has seen the foetus normal, it was Told that the delivery would be dangerous. And she senses that either the baby or the mother will be lost in childbirth. She does not know which one, yet.

In retrospect, if she had been seen by another doctor she would have received insulin injections. Would these have not had an adverse reaction on her subtle body? Many years ago she was a vegetarian for 6 years. It was then that she became very close to her "Voices". Now that she is once again a vegetarian one wonders about any further development.

Mother, I may be wrong about all this. Yet, I have the strong conviction that this is very real.

This is a massive letter which I hope you will read in successive stages and perhaps find some measure of interest.

I sincerely hope that this letter finds you well and completely recovered from your recent illness. Thank you again for the note about Bolling. He has just written that he is much better and is now fully convinced that he can eat milk products without having any adverse effect. He will be spending the month of January in Lugano. Switzerland was decided upon since he knows too many people in Sweden from whom he cannot remain away.

This letter has been in thought for some time. There are a number of situations which have lately developed and I sincerely hope that you may be able or wish to give me guidance in them. It has occurred to me that addressing you in a more informal or endearing manner might be a source of embarrassment to you. Hence, the present
salutation - but it is still replete with devotion and profound gratitude
from the heart.

Bolling has returned from Switzerland and had a fair rest. While abroad, his wife wrote that she was having one of the happiest holidays in her life because Bolling did not know the native language and thus confined all his attention to her. I am so happy to learn about this since she was always skeptical that we were trying to pull him away from her.

Bolling has complained of a headache over his right eye. The retina on examination shows an exudate of remote origin. At the time of examination, March 5th, his blood pressure was 200/120, the highest I have ever recorded. Is the headache and exudate from undue pressure? He is taking the prescibed Strophantis pills. He now eats all types of dairy products which he formerly did not, believing he had an allergy to them.

As you must know Sina again had a severe neuritis which responded to complete rest. She still has residual difficulty. It was interesting that when I put slight pressure on her solar plexus she complained of severe pain in the neuritis arm.

Katherine and Inge also were ill; both had sinusitis. Katherine had a fever for 2 weeks and finally was given penicillin by mouth. Both need a rest. I sincerely hope that they will soon go to Switzerland.

I have been taking a corned beef or ham sandwich and wine with acid when doing X-Ray work. Is there anything I can take insead? If you have the time to answer these questions, please enclose them in your letter to Katherine or Sina.

I know that you have been ill for several weeks and not yet fully recovered.

If you are not well enough to answer this letter, nor have the time - please do not bother.

This concerns Mr. Barscz who is on the farm at present with Inge. As you may know he has Osteomyelitis of the right thigh. This started as a young child and healed. Then began again in 1948 after working very hard. He has been seen by 2 surgeons who recommend an operation. Dr. Craig, New York City, says it will be a year of treatment and operations to stop the drainage of pus. Dr. R. Lippmann, also of New York City and a friend of mine says it is only a simple operation and will not require so much time. Frankly, I am in hopes he will not require an operation. I have started him on Strophantis, 2 pills daily, and Senna powder. He was also told to stop working in New York and get clean, country air. So, he is now on the farm at Brookfield. Do you have any suggestions? Also, is there anything which can be done for Katherine's nephew, Grant Smith, who is on the farm with Inge for the next 2 months.? He has severe hay fever and asthma. An electrocardiogram showed an abnormal rhythm of the heart. He has been put on Strophantis, 1 pill daily. Because of his allergy to milk and milk products he has been eating soy products as a substitute.

Again many thanks for your advises of the past. I am settling down to the study of the centers. Katherines notes are a great help. Unfortunately, Inge left her notes in Switzerland.

May this find you well and rested.

Earlier today a c¢able was sent about Mr. Barsz. I am sorry to trouble you when you are not well, but his case puzzles me and I am concerned.

Mr. Barsz was doing very well. He had gained in all ways, physically and spiritually, since remaining on the farm. Quite suddenly, he was awakened on March 2 at 2:00 AM with fever, chill and followed by severe pain in the right leg, knee and thigh. He thought that perhaps the usual drainage from the right thigh had lessened. The pain responded to Cibalgine partially but the knee continued to pain.

Aspiration of the knee was attempted for pus but none was obtained. The painful area was injected with novocaine and relief was obtained. His fever has been daily to 101° - 102°. Penicillin injections were started March 3rd and so far no results are noticed.

He is continued on Strophantis pills, 4 daily and 135 drops of Valerian daily in addition to soda and licorice powder. He is withstanding this fever satisfactorily at present.

If you have the health and the time, please advise. Also do tell me what is responsible for this unexpected relapse.

Dear Mme. Roerich,

Have just learned from Katherine via Sina that Mr. Barsz is to receive Penicillin injections and the operation is postponed to October. Last night he was started on pure crystalline Penicillin, 100, 000 units twice daily. It is planned that he will receive this dose for at least one week. He was also told about the postponement of the operation. He is continuing to take the same dose of the other medications previously advised.

On March 4th a letter was sent to you which will be summarised here. (Apparently it has not been received).
.... Mr. B had gained physically and spiritually on prescribed routine. On Mar. 2nd he was awakened at 2:00 AM with severe pain, swelling of the right knee and fever with chill. I attempted to aspirate pus from the knee without succees and injected novocaine to relieve the pain. Cibalgine was also given. During the next 3 days he received 2, 400,000 units of penicillin. (Unfortunately, the newer kind with addition to it)....

Since Mar. 6th he has gained slowly. His fever was normal and the knee stopped paining. The swelling continues to go down slowly and he wiks about the house on crutches to rest the knee.

I am at a loss to understand why this unexpected relapse.

I was very sorry to learnthat you are so weak at the present writing. May it soon pass and many wishes are sent that you will soon be well and strong.
