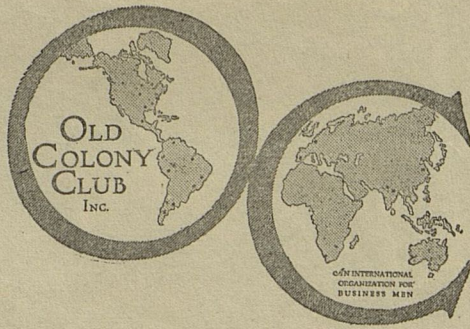

Old Colony Club, Hotel Biltmore
New York City.

Sunday.

My beautiful sister —
Nanus and I had a very interesting visit
in Washington - and interested Captain Calhoun
in the school to a very great degree - Mrs.
Calhoun is in Massachusetts at this moment
but returns to New York on the 14th and she is
the President and founder of the "Norman's Foundation"
the greatest woman's organization in the world - She
is a wonderful woman for getting money for her
projects and can get scholarships for us that
will start the school - Captain Calhoun said -
she will be immensely interested and of great assis-
tance - He also said they could arrange a very
successful exhibition of Prof. Roerich's paintings
in Washington - She is very wealthy and very

influential - both in Washington and here -
Tomorrow I am going to take Haines to Mrs. Adolph
Lewiston and let him interest her - she is a
woman of great wealth + culture - and will be
immensely interested I am sure - I asked Moriah
about her she said "yes" - I asked about a
number of people - Some he said "yes" others "No"
others he did not know - It was very
interesting -

I pray that Professor Ruerick
will find the Russian War Posters at the Spunkles
as Capt Calhoun says we could sell them now
in Washington for many thousand dollars -

Wednesday -

Beautiful Yarules - A few hours
after I had posted your letter
I received one from you -
I loved the letter - I deeply regret
that my Queen sister should have
been compelled to weep for the ugliness
of sordid labor - but that
magnificent Master Monarch of course
sent me good servant -
How I would have loved accompanying
you to the Cliff Dwellers. Last night

a most wonderful thing happened —
Haines and I were reading "The Voice
of the Silence" — I was making it and
explaining it to him — when I suddenly
felt the greatest impulse to sit at the
little table for a seance — so Haines
and I sat covered with the glass of
this reading sat at the table — Almost
instantly Moriah came — He had a long
seance with him — He was divinely kind
in advice and wisdom — He said that
Haines must use more effort to find a
place for the school — and commanded
me to assist him — He told us both to
go to Washington on Friday to see the Commandant
and a very dear friend of mine Commandant
