All the boxes and Hira, I presume, have reached safely on Tuesday and that he had no difficulties on the way. I made inquiries in regard to passage to Russia and I have been able to gather the following information: Passage by Russian boat: Russian boats have started calling at Bombay almost regularly, but they are all cargo boats and do not take passengers. The luggage can be sent by Russian boat subject to the usual customs check up. Personal luggage is always permitted. These boats take a long time to reach Russia. Regarding the small dog, I am told that he cannot be sent by boat. I understand that he can be sent by plane. (2) Plane route: As you know there are two routes - (a) Bombay to Prague and Prague to Moscow, and (b) Delhi to Kabul and Kabul to Moscow. The first is the more popular route and the fares are as follows: First class Rs. 3103/-; Tourist class: Rs. 2396/-. Travel Agents in Bombay are not in a position to give the fare by the Kabul route. They say that there are no regular service from Kabul to Moscow and arrangements will have to be made for the Russian plane to come to Kabul to pick up the passengers. The fare from Delhi to Kabul is Rs. 265/-. The necessary Visa to enter Kabul should be obtained from the Afghan Embassy in New Delhi Oute 17 th land Kabul should be obtained from the Afghan Embassy in New Delhi which I am told is not difficult to obtain. (3) Income-tax release certificate: A certificate in form A should be obtained from the local Inspector of Income Tax and that certificate along with the passport should be produce before Tracome Tax Officer, Foreign Section in Bombay or at Delhi and on the strength of the A Form the necessary release certificate will be issued. In the case of income tax payments having been made at a centre other than where the passenger usually resides, the A Form should be obtained from the authority in charge of the Centre where the taxes are usually paid. In the case of dependents who have no income release certificates are necessary and the local Inspector should certificates are necessary and the local Inspector should certify to that effect and the Foreign Branch will then issue the necessary release certificate. Medical certificates in regard to small-pox and cholera inoculation should be obtained from the Municipal authorities or any other Government agencies. I am making further enquiries in the matter. As very few passengers go to Russia, the travel agents are not quite conversant with the formalities and one has to gather the information from all sources and then check up. I shall let you know about lorry transport to Bangalore within a couple of days. I hope Madam and you are in the best of health and with all be st wishes to you both, c.c. Dr. G.
