Dear Mr. Wagner,

Your letter of March 1st was reforwarded to me from New York and has just reached our remote Himalayas - at my present residence. You ask what is the meaning of death. First of all death does not exist and St.Paul in his epistles quite clearly affirms that we do not die but only change. He also speaks of the subtle radiant bodies. Similar definitions can be found just as well in most religions and in Eastern wisdom.

Humanity however was so terrified by superstitions that the normal change into another condition was defined as horrible death with all its sinister attributes. Even such statements of foremost scientists like Sir William Crooks, Camille Flammarion, Sir Oliver Lodge etc. were accepted with much reserve. Up to quite recently humanity did not even ponder about the energy and might of thought. Only lately when Prof. Bekhtereff. Prof .McDouggal, Prof .Rhine and their colleagues under the names of parapsychology, extra-sensory perception, metapsychique etc. put the investigations on a scholarly basis, did the transmission of thought become a matter of university research. will help him to be useful. The art of thinking will
serve him as the best medium in that subtle world, where
the energy of thought is the only motive power. Everything
good achieved by man will constitute his armour of light
and all the evil he has committed he will regret because
it will be a hindrance on his path. All these are not
dreams but facts confirmed by innumerable evidences of
all ages and people.

Towards the end of your letter you foresee that there will be many mockers but let us remember that the majority of deniers act under the influence of fear and ignorance - there are many people yet, who when fear to start out on a voyage. Everyone of us knows of people, who when they set out to cross the ocean, wrote their last wills and concluded all formalities as if passing over to another world.
