years ago at Beyreuth attending the Wagner operas
have been the two most intense and vital contacts
with spiritual beauty which I have had in my life.
All honor and gratitude to the Great Revealers of
Beauty such as yourself.

I am in perfect sympathy and
agreement with your appeal that "the scholars,
artists and spiritual leaders should form an
indivisible union in order that the real cooper-
ation for the Good may be achieved."

Therefore I am venturing to
enclose a report and program about the spiritual
center in Rome which I have lately sent to some
friends in America. We sincerely hope that we may
succeed in having a center which, although in
much smaller proportions, might have some of the
spiritual usefulness of the Roerich Museum. Any
suggestion and cooperation to this end will be
greatly appreciated. Do you think some of your
European or American friends might be interested
in the plan?
