Dear Professor Roerich

Thank you for your cheque for Rs. 1,826/-.  
I sent this to be cashed in Darjeeling and am arranging  
for the banker to give me the money in Gyantse, when I  
reach there at the end of this month. I will then hand  
it over to the Tibetan Government. The Banker takes -/8/-  
per cent for giving the cash in Gyantse, so will you please  
send me Rs. 9/2/- more.

I am returning you your letter as I would  
rather not be mixed up in the details - I suggest that  
you write yourself direct to the Tibetan Government giving  
the details. I will simply tell the Tibetan Officer to  
whom I give the money that it is from you, and I will  
obtain his receipt, which I will hold until I get the  
receipt from the Tibetan Government which I will then  
send to you.

*Dear Professor Roerich*

I have ascertained the following about your 3 Mongolian servants:-

On arrival at Gyantse they were given assistance by the local Tibetan officer and sent on to Lhasa; the local officer also sent a report to Lhasa about them saying that they were genuine Mongolians and asking that they should be given assistance in returning to Mongolia.

The men arrived in Lhasa before this report was received and were arrested and kept prisoners for two days, after which the favourable report from Gyantse was received and they were at once released.

I hope they will have no further trouble on their return. With kindest regards.
