Carmel, Calif. USA 10/23/21 The editors of The Herald of the Star are very young. Perhaps it is in the Plan that the management be somewhat inadequate for a time. At any rate, the mountains of difficulties which obstruct the Way, indicate that a part of the discipline is courage and cheerfulness.

Hoping to offset the lack of an Announcement, I planned to telegraph certain places where your exhibit had been, asking how many copies of a magazine containing an article by you, they would wish. Then I intended to cable the London office, hoping to enable them thus, in spite of their own lack of foresight, to print an enlarged edition.

I sent a fifty word night letter by wire, to Broadmoor Art
Academy, Colorado Springs, where your pictures then were, and a similar
telegram to Mr. Harshe, of the Art Institute. Both answered by wire
collect, as instructed; both replied in the negative. Mr. Harshe
supplemented his telegram by enclosed letter.

Mr. Eggen's letter herewith is self-explanatory. About a week ago I replied to it, suggesting that he order from London direct at least a few copies of the December issue containing your first article -that they would probably sell rapidly if placed in the hands of one who collects admission fee.

I wrote letters yesterday to all the other addresses given in your letter received yesterday, except the two above. If they will act promptly on suggestions made, they may have by Christmas, even on the West Coast, the first article for distribution.

It is regrettable that the Order of the Star in America has both national representative and business manager on the west coast. A portion of my errand to Hollywood, Los Angeles, was to impress those people with the necessity of getting a distributing center for the Herald containing your contributines, on the East Coast. They were deeply interested and hopeful; but I have not heard from them since I sent them the word received from London, viz. that first article would appear in December. In the little national, monthly Star publication, The Server, will appear an announcement, I believe — but its circulation is small; and such an announcement, while helpful, is wholly inadequate to secure the big distribution desired.

I am happy to give all my strength and time to the Master's work. Nothing else seems worth while. But I do sometimes "covet" enough money to adequately carry it on. Even travelling expenses, if I had them, would be sufficient to enable me to spread the good Art tidings, and also to increase circulation of the Herald. Probably it is not the Plan -or I would have the means provided somehow.

The Art phase of the Master's work seems to Very important. Artists are impressable -they are constantly reaching out, if not always Up. With a little strong aid, they could come in touch with heavenly things, instead of the purgatory stuff they so often contact.

As soon as I hear from London re suggestion of making your essays into pamphlets, I will write you. If they will not do so, it can be done in America. I sent order for 50 copies to Master School of United Arts immediately on receipt of your letter.

I rec'd cheque, U of C Reprint and yr letters, for all of which - many thanks. I saw nothing in March number about your work, but in April, Mrs. Besant's Watchtower note and my article. Since the Theosophist may be difficult to obtain, am sending you mine. Perhaps Ohicago has extras, but the magazine is obtained mostly thru subscriptions. The Herald of the Star acting-editor returned my article on your work, -it was, in many ways, a better thing than this accepted by the Theoeophist. The youngsters in the London publishing office are a trifle incomprehensible at times -I do not understand why your wonderful long poem did not appear in April Herald, thus completing your series. I shall write them. I have written Mr. Rogers re possible publication of your works. If America is not yet ready to undertake it, perhap, Fritz Kunz, American manager Mrs. Besant's Adyar publishing house would do so. Then, of course, our Section could obtain a supply from India. I will write London of reprint by Jewish magazine very interesting!

I regretted having mentioned Cor Ardens in my article, but one can readily explain that they have temporarily stepped aside. It was, after all, a fine thing that they could accept for even a short time such a high ideal.
