My Dear Frances,

In reply to your letter I hasten to
give the necessary information for
Gardner. I have been trying to grow the
cactus under cold roofings but I
find it is not necessary. Since
I have found that the Northern slope
is the best without any protection
even in the hot Summer Sun. As I
mentioned before, the Edges may become
scorched but it apparently does not
affect the root. I have often tried
to raise seedlings in boxes and
transplants in the rainy season. The
roots are very long, and they hang down.
Since the commercial roots are all cut
up the irregularity in shape resulting from
transplantation, often, does not matter.
I find that the transplantation
resists flowering and in this way
may help the roots in some cases.
Obed to temperature, they can stand
unprotected?

As far as I know they are very resistant plants but I can say that about 15°-10° F. - below zero, is quite common on the hill tops.

It would be the best place to plant them on a northern slope, a little shading from a near by forest is always good. Remember, the photograph I sent you for G.? I believe the last sending of seeds has already reached B.

At the time I have written to Kattuina that all paper bags of seeds (flowers!) were for a file the Cloth bags were given to you. I hope there was no mistake since Kattuina wrote to me that she got only two paper bags with seeds. I sent her a large arrangement also in a small paper box contained in the large wooden box. Did by any chance the seeds (flowers for K.) got lost? or were they also transmitted to B.? If so I can always send Kattuina some more early, but as I have omitted the names on some B. would have difficulty

in identifying them, and perhaps he would not even be interested in the alpine flora. of a special type! On February 13th I have written L. I was most happy to have your letter, it followed me on my journey north. I went to Kulu and stayed a few weeks in the beautiful Himalayas. I have often thought of you even though I have not written to you before and you can well imagine how happy I was to have your letter. Only recently I have given your book on religions to a friend of mine to read and often I have spoken about you and about your work and though we have not contacted each other over such a long time, yet you have always been very close to me in my thoughts. I would be happy to hear from you about your work, about your life, what you write about your work in South America is most interesting to me, any work for the good of humanity and for a better understanding among nations should be specially near to our hearts, and I know that father and mother have always thought so much of your work.

In Kalimpong where mother died, we have built a Stupa at the place where she was cremated. The Stupa overlooks the entire range of the eastern Himalayas Kanchunjunga and the Tibetan Summits. And thus it is that mother died in the eastern Himalayas while father died in the western Himalayas and both their monuments now stand spanning the east and the west of the Mighty Range. My own work has been progressing quite well. I have been giving quite a lot of time to my painting and have painted quite a number of paintings. The rest of my time is given to various organizations in which I am interested including my plantations which constantly need looking after.

India has changed a great deal since you have known it. A tremendous amount of development has taken

place and a great deal more is to come. Though at the present moment it is difficult to estimate the full extent of the work accomplished, yet there is no doubt that in another few years from now, the impact of all these developments will become felt in the country, but even now as it is a great deal has been done. Many new factories have been started, many roads have been built, so many dams and hydro-electric projects and mills built and rural development taken place. Those who have gone out some few years ago and have come back recently have been quite astonished at the progress shown, but with our civilization marching onward, it will be difficult to safeguard those universal values which we all place above everything else. How much of these values will remain after a decade or so is difficult to tell, but the impact of our material civilization is already felt every where and gradually it will lead to a general change of values and the mode of life. Some people felt it may be a calamity, yet I suppose it is inevitable and it will come as it has come every where else in the world.

It is our duty to safeguard whatever we can of those values which alone can make life worthwhile. Do write to me soon at my Bangalore address which is C/o Indian Bank, Infantry Road, Bangalore Cantt., Mysore.

I was very touched by your article on my Art. I am very grateful to you for all the fine and beautiful things you had to say and coming as it does from you I value it all the more. There is nothing more satisfying than a friendship sanctified by the passage of long years, years that remove all the dross and unimportant trivialities and leave only the essential fundamental qualities which remain across everything and are the only things worthwhile. In my own Art I am still searching for new modes of expression and I have never considered that I have really found that I wanted to express and the words and means in which it could be expressed. Like everything else it must be a constant search and one could never say that one has really come to any definite end though there are certain apexes in our life which come up from time to time. After all Beauty is only a more perfect combination of all given components and parts in time and space. Time is a very important factor, what we wanted to say yesterday we may not want to repeat tomorrow even if our yesterday had certain positive qualities. Of all my works I can say that perhaps I could do them much better and I always agreed with Father that the best painting is the one that has not been as yet painted. For your kind and good words I wish to express to you again my gratitude and appreciation.

Our life here follows its usual course. There are many complications which cannot be but expected at this complicated juncture. Stability is a very relative term and a vast country like India passing through so many reconstructive and readjustments has to face comparatively greater problems than other aggregates of humanity. With all our progress of civilization the recipients of these blessings are seldom prepared or ready to use them constructively for a mutual benefit. Things will become even more complicated in the future when new pressures will develop and new cracks will appear in the world structure.

I have been painting fairly regularly and hope to do more in the near future.

We all hope we shall again meet before long and in the meantime I take this opportunity to send to you our love and every best thought for the fulfilment of your wishes in our New Year.
