My dear Louis.

I have received your letter of Dec. 26th 1934 in which you gave me the particulars about the mutilation of my painting. I note the original mutilations were carried out by Amorc, and were reproduced by the Har. Times as a photostat of the Rosicrucian Digest page of July 1933. You know well the original portrait I have painted which is in the Museum and I have painted no other of this kind, incorporating items reproduced by the paper.

As regards the procedure with Spencer Lewis as after all he is the cause of it, I believe it best that no definite legal actions be now undertaken for reasons you are aware of. Though personally I have no connections whatever with the Amore organization, I believe it would be unwise at the present time to start proceedings, however in order to safeguard ourselves for the future, this provides us with a weapon which if used judiciously can be of great help to us. I believe a private conversation with Sp. Lewis or his son, would go a long ways to protect our interests. We must remember that any claim becomes invalid after a period of years and we can only use this opportunity if we do not wait in making friendly representations to Spencer Lewis backed up, if need be, with my protest.

Hereby I wish to enumerate the alterations made: The three triangles which are placed directlyover my painting and since they are the symbols of Amorc they are calculated to give a definite interpretation to my painting. The same applies to the candle sticks on both sides of the pictures, which could have been interpreted as an addition or frame around the picture if part of the edges of my painting were not cut off in such a way as to have the design of the figure overlap the frame containing the candle sticks and so incorporating

it into the design.
